#### POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANK REGULATIONS, 1894.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the Post Office Savings Bank Act, 1861, and of all powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, the Postmaster-General, with the consent of the Treasury, made the Post Office Savings Bank Regulations, 1893 (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Regulations").

And whereas owing to the passing of the Finance Act, 1894, certain of the provisions of "the Principal Regulations" in relation to the payment of duties upon deposits standing in the Post Office Savings Bank in the names of deceased depositors, are no longer in accordance with the present law in relation to the payment of duties on the property of deceased persons, and it is therefore expedient to amend "the Principal Regulations" in relation to the matters aforesaid.

Now I, Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, under and by virtue of all powers and authorities vested in me in that behalf do, with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

##### *Title.*

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Post Office Savings Bank Regulations, 1894, and these and "the Principal Regulations" may be cited as the Post Office Savings Bank Regulations, 1893 and 1894.

##### *Construction.*

2. These Regulations shall be read and construed as one with "the Principal Regulations," and shall take effect accordingly.

##### *Repeal.*

3. Regulation 74 of "the Principal Regulations" is hereby repealed.

##### *Estate Succession and Legacy Duties.*

4.—(1.) If the total property of any deceased depositor exceeds £100, after deduction of debts and funeral expenses, any sum which may under these Regulations be paid to a survivor in the account (not being a Trustee) whose name has been added to the account at the request of such deceased depositor, or otherwise than to the legal personal representative of the depositor shall, notwithstanding such payment, be for the purposes of Estate Duty treated as passing under the will or intestacy of the deceased depositor.

(2.) The Postmaster-General shall, before making any payment in respect of deposits standing to the credit of a deceased depositor (either alone or jointly with any other depositor (not being a Trustee) whose name has been added to such account at the request of such deceased depositor), to any one but the legal personal representative of such deceased depositor, require a Declaration by the claimant, or one of the claimants, or by the survivor, or survivors in the account (or other evidence to the Postmaster-General's satisfaction), that the total estate of the deceased depositor, including the amount of such deposits,

does not after deduction of debts and funeral expenses exceed the value of £100.

(3.) In every such case as aforesaid, where the total estate of the deceased depositor, including such deposits, but after deduction of debts and funeral expenses exceeds £100, the Postmaster-General shall, before making any payment to any survivor in the account, or to any person other than the legal personal representative of the deceased depositor, require production of a certificate from the Commissioners of Inland Revenue of the payment of the Estate Duty, and of a duly stamped receipt for the Succession or Legacy Duty, payable in respect of such deposits, or of a certificate stating that no Succession or Legacy Duty is payable.

##### *Operation of Regulations.*

5. These Regulations shall come into operation on the day of the advertisement thereof in the London Gazette, and shall apply to all depositors dying on or after the 2nd day of August, 1894.

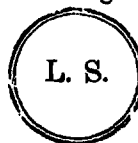
THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the provisions of the Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1894 dated the tenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four shall not extend or apply to either of the Districts named in the Schedule to this Order, and the Order of the Board of the same date applying the provisions of the said Markets and Fairs Order to certain Districts and parts of Districts named in the Schedule to that Order shall be read and have effect as if neither of the Districts named in the Schedule to this Order were included in the Schedule to that Order.

2. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1894, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, such Order before the commencement of this Order.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the twelfth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

**(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)**

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

*Movement with Licence within District in Schedule.*

1.—(1.) Notwithstanding anything in Article 2 of the Order of the Board dated the twenty-ninth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four prohibiting the movement of cattle, sheep, goats, and swine along a highway or thoroughfare within a District comprising the petty sessional divisions of Beacontree, Brentwood, and Orsett, and the liberty of Havering-atte-Bower, in the county of Essex, cattle, sheep, goats, or swine may be moved from premises in the District described in the Schedule to this Order to any other premises in such District in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

(2.) Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to authorize the movement of any cattle, sheep, goats, or swine out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order.

*Licence and Declaration.*

2.—(1.) For the movement of cattle, sheep, goats, or swine under this Order, there shall be a Licence of the Local Authority, which Licence shall be in force for not more than five days inclusive of the day of issue, and shall contain the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals to be moved, and the name or description of the premises from which, and the place and premises to which, the animals are to be moved, and shall only be granted on a Declaration of the owner of the animals or of his agent authorized in writing for this purpose to the effect hereinafter provided, as to the correctness of which Declaration the Local Authority shall satisfy themselves before granting the Licence.

(2.) The Declaration shall be to the effect—

(a.) that the cattle, sheep, goats, or swine to be moved have been on the premises from which they are to be moved for a period of at least twenty-eight days immediately before the granting of the Licence, and that no other cattle, sheep, goats, or swine have been brought on to those premises within such period ; and

(b.) that the said cattle, sheep, goats, or swine are not affected with foot-and-mouth disease, and have not during the period of twenty-eight days as aforesaid been in any way exposed to the infection of foot-and-mouth disease.

(3.) The cattle, sheep, goats, or swine moved under this Order shall be accompanied by the Licence required by this Order.

*Granting of Licences.*

3.—(1.) A Licence shall only be granted for the movement of cattle, sheep, goats, or swine under this Order where in the opinion of the Local Authority or the person granting the Licence, as the case may be, the movement of the cattle, sheep, goats, or swine is necessary or expedient.

(2.) A Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the cattle, sheep, goats, or swine to be moved or by his agent, or by the owner or consignee or other person selling the animals, or exposing the same for sale, or by the purchaser thereof or by his agent, or by the auctioneer or other person conducting the sale at which the animals are exposed,

or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter-house from or to which the animals are to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

*Delivery of Declarations.*

4.—(1.) A Licence granted under this Order is not available except when accompanied by the Declaration on which it is granted.

(2.) The person granting such Licence under this Order shall, for the identification of the Declaration produced to him, mark the same by signing his name thereon, with the date of the production thereof to him.

(3.) The person granting such Licence shall deliver the Declaration produced to him, when so marked, with the Licence, to the person receiving the Licence from him.

*Production of Licences ; Names and Addresses.*

5.—(1.) Every person in charge of a head of cattle or of a sheep or goat or pig being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board of Agriculture or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorizing the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Every person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

*Offences.*

6.—(1.) If a head of cattle or a sheep or goat or pig is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Licence thereunder, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of a head of cattle or a sheep or goat or pig being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a head of cattle or a sheep or goat or pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Commencement.*

7. This Order shall come into operation on the eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

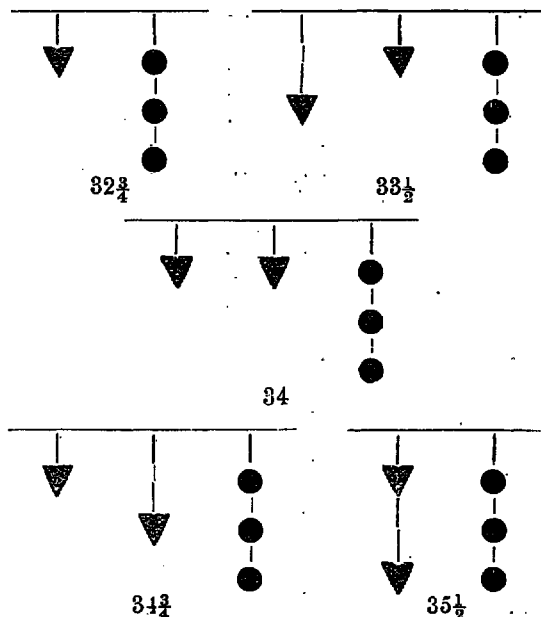
