Warsaw, April 13.

The King of Poland continues his resolution of going early into the Field; for which the necessary Preparations are making, and we are told, that the General Rendezvous of the Army is appointed to be near *Jastowicz*. The Enemy have put a new Convoy of Provisions into *Caminec*, but the Tartars who conducted it are, upon the Orders they received from Sultan *Galga*, returned in great haste towards *Budziack*, occasioned probably by the apprehensions they have of the Moscovites; for the last Letters from *Moscow* tell us, that the Czars had ordered their Troops to march forthwith towards the River *Samara*, where they are to have their Rendezvous.

Vienna, April 19. The Imperial Troops designed for the Campaigne in *Hungary* are on their march; and of those that have had their Winter Quarters in *Bohemia*, several have passed through here this week with Orders to march to *Essecke*, near which place a Camp is going to be formed on the *Drave*, while the main Army is to Rendezvous near *Buda*. The last Letters from *Essecke* gave an account, that with a great deal of Expence and Labour they have at last drawn the *Drave* quite round the Town, which will make it very strong; and that they had advice of a Party of Turks designing to attack *Virovitzki*, whereupon Succors were sent to reinforce that Garison. They write from *Croatia* of the 8th instant, that those Turks, who have alarmed them so long in *Sclavonia*, are marched towards *Coplenitzki* on the River *Umag*; and that they had sent out several Parties to observe their motions. That all the *Valachians*, who inhabit the Plains about *Nevi* and *Zrin*, have submitted to the Emperor's Protection. That the late Action of the *Rusian* Hussars has so alarmed the Turks and Tartars of the Country of *Syrmium*, that they have abandoned it, and are gone over the *Sava*. We hear, that the *Rusian*-Captain *Antonio* has taken a strong Cattle on the Confines of *Valachia*. Sir *William Hussy*, His Majesty of *Great-Britain's* Ambassador to the *Ottoman* Port, had on Tuesday last his Audience of Leave of the Emperor, and will in a day or two set out from hence on his Journey towards *Turkey*. Prince *Eugenius*, who came lately hither from the Duke of *Savoy*, will return this week towards *Piedmont*, with assurances of considerable and speedy Succors.

Hedelberg, April 24. Yesterday arrived here several Commissaries, to provide Bread for the Confederate Troops that are shortly expected in this Neighbourhood. The Duke of *Wirtemberg* passed through this place yesterday on his return home. The Circles of *Suabia* and *Franconia* are drawing their Forces together, and have already formed a Body of 10 or 12000 men.

Frankfort, April 25. The Forces of the Elector of *Saxony*, with those of *Saxe-Coburg*, being together

about 16000 men, are on their march towards *Heylbron*, and the *Saxon* Commissaries are going thither to make the necessary Provision for them. The Troops of *Suabia* and *Franconia* are likewise in motion. The French have made a Bridge of Boats over the *Rhine* at *Philipsbourg*, and are marking out a Carop near *Landau*.

Cologne, April 27. The Troops of *Hesse*, quartered in this *Archbishoprick*, are come nearer to this City, and are ordered to be in a readiness to march, and to provide themselves with Bread and Oats for 10 days; The Landgrave, who will command his Forces in Person this Campaigne, is expected here about the middle of the next month. The Troops of *Munster* continue their march homeward. By two Deserters, who came lately from *Mont-royal*, we are told, that the French work very hard on the Fortifications of that place, and that the Garison there consists but of 1200 men. They write from *Trier*, that 7 Regiments of French Horse, who were returned from *Flanders*, were quartered at *Metz*, and in the Neighbouring Villages, to refresh themselves; and that a strong Detachment of Horse and Foot was marched towards *Aisace*.

Brussels, April 26. Our Preparations for the Campaigne are carried on with extraordinary Application. Orders are given for the fortifying *Hall* with 4 Bastions, for which, and the adding some new Fortifications to this City, an Extraordinary Subsidy has been demanded of the States of this Province, who have the same under Deliberation. The Prince of *Vaudemont* has, since his return from *Italy*, had several Conferences with our Governor-General, and prepares to make the Campaigne as General of the Horse. The French are going to quit *Courtray*; They provide Magazines at *Dinant* and other places between that and *Charleville*, and some of their Troops are moving towards the *Sambre*. The Dutch and *Brandenburg* Forces lie ready to take the Field, the former are at present commanded by the Prince of *Nassau-Sarbrucke*. Prince *Waldecke* is at *Aix la Chapelle*.

Hague, May 2. The Duke of *Schonberg* parted from hence yesterday for *Savoy*; The Officers, who are to command the Regiments of French Protestants raised for that Duke's Service, being gone before. The Sieur de *Hackbartsen*, Plenipotentiary here from the Elector of *Savoy*, is recalled, and begins his Journey this day, having a considerable Post in his Electoral Highness's Army, which is marching towards the *Rhine*. Monsieur *Hop* returns for *England* in the Quality of Envoy Extraordinary from this State. The States of *Holland* are Adjourned to the 9th of this month.

Dublin, April 22. Lieutenant-General *Ginkel* came hither on the 18th instant from *Kilkenny*, and most of the other General Officers are now likewise here to consult with the Lords Justices about the

Affairs of the Campagne, the Preparations for which are in that forwardness, that we hope to open it about the middle of the next month. The *Monmouth* Yacht with Money for their Majesties Service, and several Ships with Recruits both of Horse and Foot, arrived here the last week; And from *Coke*, *Waterford*, and *Kinsale*, we have likewise accounts, of the arrival in those Ports of divers Ships with Recruits, of which there are 2000 already come; and the Train of Artillery, with the Wagons and Carriages, are all fitted. We hear from *Cassel*, that on the 9th instant some of *Captain Green's* Militia-Dragoons marched into the Enemies Quarters, killed several Rapperies, and burnt a Village that harboured them; That on the 13th Quarter-master *Callaghan* went out with a Party, and took 11 Prisoners, 12 Horses, and 70 Head of Black Cattel; And that some Protestants were come in there from the County of *Clare*, who gave an account, that the Rebels Horse are in a very ill condition, their men unclouted, that Provisions are very scarce with them, and that their Cattel dye apace. From *Mullingar* they write, that one *Fitzgerald* a Captain, and 12 private Soldiers, who had deserted from the Enemies Quarters, came in there on the 16th instant. On the 19th, 700 of the Enemies standing Troops attacked a Stone House called *Cryghan*, near *Philips-town*, and took a Corporal, and 6 of our men, who defended themselves till their Powder was spent, and killed 12 of the Enemy.

This last week was published here a Proclamation by the Lords Justices and Council, setting forth, That whereas by the Examinations of divers Persons it does appear, that a Romish Priest, calling himself *Father Christopher Brown*, who has lived many months in several places in their Majesties Power without being molested on account of his Orders or Religion, has been, if not the first Contriver, and principal Director and Conductor, yet a main Abetter and Encourager of the late barbarous Murder of many of their Majesties Soldiers in *Mallahuddert Church* near this City; and whereas several others are found to have been Guilty of the said Murder, who are fled from Justice, their Lordships do Promise a Reward of Fifty Pounds to such Persons, not Guilty of the same, as shall Apprehend and secure the said *Christopher Browne*, and Ten Pounds for every of the other Persons; and Pardon to such, though Privy to the said Murder, as shall Apprehend any of the said Offenders.

Chester, April 25. Yesterday and this morning a great number of Recruits, with about 300 Carriage Horses, went from hence for *Higblake* in order to their Transportation for *Ireland*, and more are following, which will be likewise shipped in few days.

Falmouth, April 23. On Monday last came in here the Resolution of *Malaga*, the Society of *London*, and the *Blough of Topham*, all three laden from *Malaga*, but they came last from *Cadix* in a Fleet of about 36 Sail, which are gone up the Channel.

Plimouth, April 26. The Fleet from *Cadix*, under the Convoy of the *Kings-fisher* and the *Scepter*, sailed out of this Port on the 23d instant for the *Downes*, but was forced back again the next day by contrary Winds. Some Ships that came in here yesterday in the afternoon give an account, that in the morning they saw in the *Offn* 23 Sail of great Ships, which they supposed to be French Men of War, but it is rather conjectured, they may be some Dutch Men from *St. Ubes*.

Deale, April 28. The last week 4 Dutch Men of War, of 70 Guns apiece, came into the *Downes* from *Holland*, who presently after sailed again to join their Majesties Fleet at the Buoy of the *Nore*. There is now in the *Downes* a Squadron of 26 English Men of War, all Capital Ships, besides Fireships under the command of *Sir Ralph Delaval*, who came in last Sunday night.

Westminster, April 28. The Parliament met this day, and His Majesties Pleasure being signified to Both Houses, That they should Adjourn their Meeting to the 26th of May next, they accordingly Adjourned to the 26th of May now next ensuing.
