ORDER RE-ARRANGING THE WARDS OF THE PARISH OF FULHAM.

WHEREAS the London County Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by Section 15 of the London County Council (General Powers) Act, 1893, have prepared an Order, dated the 19th day of June, 1894, re-arranging the wards of the parish of Fulham being a parish mentioned in Schedule A to the Metropolis Management Act, 1855, and determining the number, limits, and boundary lines of the new wards, and apportioning among the several wards the number of vestrymen to be elected for such parish in accordance with the limitations prescribed by the said section.

And whereas such Order was transmitted to

me for approval on the 25th day of June, 189 and was published in the London Gazette on the 26th day of June, 1894.

And whereas power is given to me by the said section, if I disapprove of the proposed re-arrangement of wards or apportionment of vestrymen, to make, subject to the limitations prescribed in the said section, such other Order as to the re-arrangement or apportionment as in my judgment shall be more conducive to a fair representation in the vestry of the interests of the ratepayers of the parish.

And whereas I disapprove of the re-arrangement into wards of the parish of Fulham proposed in the said Order of the London County Council.

I hereby, in pursuance of the said power, order that the wards of the said parish of Fulham be re-arranged in manner following, namely, that the said parish be divided into eight wards, that the eight wards be distinguished by the number and names mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto, that the extent, limits, and boundary lines of such wards shall be those described in the second column of the said Schedule; and that the number of vestrymen to be elected for each of the said wards shall be the number mentioned in the third column of the said Schedule.

ORDER OF LONDON COUNTY COUNCIL RE-ARRANGING THE WARDS OF THE PARISH OF GREENWICH, APPROVED BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE.

To the Vestry of the Parish of Greenwich, and all whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 15 of the London Council (General Powers) Act. County 1893, it is enacted that the London County Council may from time to time for the purpose of elections of vestrymen, upon the application in writing of the Vestry, or of not less than five hundred rated householders of a parish mentioned in Schedules A and B to the Metropolis Management Act, 1855, by order under their seal, re-arrange the wards in such parish, and determine the number, extent, limits, and boundary lines of the new wards, but so, nevertheless, that no ward shall contain less than five hundred rated householders, and that the whole number of wards shall not exceed eight, and the Council shall, in making any such re-arrangement apportion among the several wards the number of vestrymen to be elected for such parish, and shall in assigning the number of vestrymen to each ward have regard, so far as practicable, as well to the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in each ward as to the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated, and the number of vestrymen assigned to each ward shall be a number divisible by three; and it is also by the said Act enacted that any such Order may contain such provisions with reference to the election, rotation, and retirement of vestrymen (whether elected prior or subsequently to the date of the Order) as the Council may think necessary for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the Order.

And whereas the parish of Greenwich is a parish mentioned in Part I of Schedule B to the Metropolis Management Act, 1855, and pur-

suant to the provisions of the said Act, the said parish was divided into four wards.

And whereas application has been made to the London County Council by more than five hundred rated householders of the said parish to re-arrange the wards of the said parish pursuant to the provisions of the said 15th Section of the London County Council (General Powers). Act, 1893.

And whereas it appears from the rate books of the said parish prepared in the month of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninetythree, that the said parish contains nine thousand six hundred and ninety rated householders, and that the ratable annual value of property in the said parish is two hundred and seventyeight thousand nine hundred and forty-nine pounds.

Now the London County Council having considered the said application, and having taken into consideration the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in each ward of the said parish, and the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated, and all the circumstances connected with such application, doth hereby order that the wards of the said parish of Greenwich be re-arranged in manner following, that is to say, that the said parish be divided into six instead of four wards, and that the six wards be distinguished by the names mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereunder written, that the extent, limits, and boundary lines of such wards shall be those described in the second column of the said Schedule, and that the number of vestrymen to be elected for each of the said wards shall be the number mentioned in the third column of the said Schedule.

And the London County Council doth further order that this Order shall come into force for the purpose of the first election of vestrymen under the Local Government Act, 1894, and such election shall be subject to the provisions of the said Act.

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.) By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

Movement with Licence within Area in Schedule.

1.-(1.) Notwithstanding anything in any Order of the Board of Agriculture, cattle, sheep, goats, or swine may be moved from premises in the Footand-Mouth Disease Infected Area described in the Schedule to this Order to any other premises in that Area in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

(2.) Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to authorize the movement of any cattle, sheep, goats, or swine out of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area described in the Schedule to this Order, or into or out of a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place.

Licence and Declaration.

2.-(1.) For the movement of cattle, sheep, goats, or swine under this Order, there shall be a Licence of the Local Authority, which Licence shall be in force for not more than five days inclusive of the day of issue, and shall contain the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals to be moved, and the name or description of the premises from which, and the place and premises to which, the animals are to be moved, and shall only be granted on a Declaration of the owner of the animals or of his agent authorized in writing for this purpose to the effect hereinafter provided, as to the correctness

- of which Declaration the Local Authority shall satisfy themselves before granting the Licence.
- (2.) The Declaration shall be to the effect-
- (a.) that the cattle, sheep, goats, or swine to be moved have been on the premises from which they are to be moved for a period of at least twenty-eight days immediately before the granting of the Licence, and that no other cattle, sheep, goats, or swine have been brought on to those premises within such period; and
- (5.) that the said cattle, sheep, goats, or swine are not affected with foot-and-mouth disease, and have not during the period of twentyeight days as aforesaid been in any way exposed to the infection of foot-and-mouth disease.

(3.) The cattle, sheep, goats, or swine moved under this Order shall be accompanied by the Licence required by this Order.

Granting of Licences.

3.—(1.) A Licence shall only be granted for the movement of cattle, sheep, goats, or swine under this Order where in the opinion of the Local Authority or the person granting the Licence, as the case may be, the movement of the cattle, sheep, goats, or swine is necessary or expedient.

(2.) A Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the cattle, sheep, goats, or swine to be moved or by his agent, or by the owner or consignee or other person selling the animals, or exposing the same for sale, or by the purchaser thereof or by his agent, or by the auctioneer or other person conducting the sale at which the animals are exposed, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter house from or to which the animals are

to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

Delivery of Declarations.

4.—(1.) A Licence granted under this Order is not available except when accompanied by the Declaration on which it is granted.

(2.) The person granting such Licence under this Order shall, for the identification of the Declaration produced to him, mark the same by signing his name thereon, with the date of the production thereof to him.

(3.) The person granting such Licence shall deliver the Declaration produced to him, when so marked, with the Licence, to the person receiving the Licence from him.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

5.—(1.) Every person in charge of a head of cattle or of a sheep or goat or pig being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board of Agriculture or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorizing the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Every person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer

Offences.

6.—(1.) If a head of cattle or a sheep or gont or pig is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Licence thereunder, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of a head of cattle or a sheep or goat or pig being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a head of cattle or a sheep or goat or pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

7. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.
