## By the QUEEN. A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, B.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday, the twentieth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four; We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and declare that the said Parliament be further prorogued to Tuesday, the fifth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five; and We do hereby further, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal will and pleasure that the said Parliament shall, on the said Tuesday, the fifth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, assemble and be holden for the despatch of divers urgent and important affairs; and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Tuesday, the fifth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, this twelfth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and in the fiftyeighth year of Our reign.

HEREAS by an Order in Council dated the nineteenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine provision has been made for the surrender by the Governor of the Straits Settlements to Foreign States, in the case of which the Extradition Act 1870 does not apply, of persons accused or convicted of the commission of certain crimes and offences within the jurisdiction of such States.

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Order.

Now therefore it is hereby ordered by Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her Privy Council as follows :-

1. The said Order and this Order shall be read and construed as one Order in Council.

2. In Clause 18 of the said Order the expression "Minister of State" shall in the case of any of the protected States include any officer appointed by Her Majesty or by the Governor as British Resident or Superintendent or Secretary to the Government in such State.

Now therefore, Her Majesty by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered; that the present District Probate Registrar and the present District Registrar aforesaid shall be deemed to be Joint District Registrars, and shall perform all the duties of District Registrar in the District Registry in Manchester in such manner as they may with the approval of the Lord Chancellor and the President of the Probate Divorce and Admiralty Division of the High Court of Justice from time to time arrange.

WHEREAS by the six hundred and fifteenth Section of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," it is enacted that Her Majesty may by Order in Council make rules as to the signals to be used or displayed where the services of a pilot are required on any vessel, such signals being referred to in that Act as pilot signals :

And whereas by the thirty-seventh Section of "The Interpretation Act, 1889," it is (amongst other things) enacted, that where an Act passed after the commencement of that Act is not to come into operation immediately on the passing thereof and confers powers to make any Order in Council, that power may be exercised at any time after the passing of the Act so far as may be necessary or expedient for the purpose of bringing the Act into operation at the date of the commencement thereof:

And whereas "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," does not come into operation until the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five:

And whereas it is necessary or expedient to make rules as to pilot signals to come into operation on the same day as the said "Merchant Shipping Act, 1894":

And whereas the operation of the said rules immediately upon the commencement of "The Merchant Shipping Act. 1894," is urgent:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers so vested in Her as aforesaid, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council is pleased to approve as pilot signals the signals specified in the Schedule annexed hereto, and doth order that such signals shall be used as pilot signals, on and after the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five. C. L. Peel. SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Order refers.

Signals to be made by Ships wanting a Pilot.

In the doy-time.—The following signals, numbered 1 and 2, when used or displayed together or separately, shall be deemed to be signals for a pilot in the day-time, viz. :—

- 1. To be hoisted at the fore, the Union Jack having round it a white border, one-fifth of the breadth of the flag; or
- 2. The International Code pilotage signal indicated by P.T.

At night.—The following signals, numbered 1 and 2; when used or displayed together or separately, shall be deemed to be signals for a pilot at night, viz.:—

- 1. The pyrotechnic light commonly known as a blue light every fifteen minutes ; or
- 2. A bright white light, flashed or shown at short or frequent intervals just above the bulwarks, for about a minute at a time.

W HEREAS by the three hundred and thirtythird section of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for every Pilotage Authority by Bye-law made with the consent of Her Majesty in Council, from time to time to do within its district all or any of the things specified in that behalf in the said section :

And whereas the Thurso River Harbour Trustees, being the Pilotage Authority for the Thurso River Harbour within the meaning of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," have in exercise of the powers vested in them by that Act, made and submitted for the consent of Her Majesty certain Bye-laws and Rates of Pilotage as set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed :

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the proposed Bye-laws and Rates of Pilotage are proper and reasonable:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said Merchant Shipping Act, 1854, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to approve of and signify Her consent to the said Bye-laws and Rates of Pilotage as set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed. ## SCHEDULE.

## BYE-LAWS AND RATES OF PILOTAGE. The Captain Pilot.

1. He shall have the superintendence of all the other Pilots, and do his utmost endeavour that the following regulations for their government be strictly complied with. He shall immediately inform the Harbour Trustees of any breach of duty they may be guilty of. And where his orders to the Pilots requiring their attendance upon any vessel in want of their assistance are not immediately complied with, in every such case, where it shall appear that he allows any of them to pass unpunished, he shall himself be liable in a penalty not exceeding the sum of forty shillings sterling.

2. He shall cause the shipping to be supplied with Pilots, according to their order, and the best of his judgment, without partiality or favour.

3. He shall make out the notes and cause to be collected the rates of Pilotage, &c., according to the following tables, certifying the number of men

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employed, and in case it shall be proved that he grants such certificate for a greater number than were actually employed he shall be liable in a penalty not exceeding the sum of twenty shillings sterling for each transgression.

4. He is empowered where there may be great difficulty and danger in the Pilots getting out to the assistance of vessels in the hay, to offer them such moderate premium for their attendance in these instances as he shall judge necessary.

5. In case he shall be called upon to furnish boats or men to the assistance of any vessel in want thereof, or in distress, and shall either refuse, absent himself, or neglect to comply with such request, he shall, on proof of such neglect, for the first offence be liable in a penalty not exceeding the sum of two pounds, and for the second offence he shall be discharged from his office.

6. He shall keep a book in which he shall regularly enter a list of the arrival of all vessels at, and their departure from, the Harbour of Thurso, with such other particulars as he shall be directed, excerpts from which he shall deliver weekly at the office of the Clerk to the Trustees.

## Pilots.

7. No person shall act as a Pilot without being licensed by the Harbour Trustees and the licence must be renewed on or before the first Thursday of February in every year.

8. The Pilots must give ready obedience to all the orders of the Captain Pilot, and comply with his directions in every particular.

9. The boats to be used by the Pilots shall be 17 feet keel at the least, and otherwise to the satisfaction of the Captain Pilot, and the crew of each boat must consist of not less than five men, two of whom must be licensed Pilots. The master or chief pilot of each boat must cause his own name and the number of his boat to be painted thereon in large distinct characters.

10. A Master Pilot taking charge of a vessel without his boat being manned to the satisfaction of the Captain Pilot shall be liable in a penalty not exceeding ten shillings for each man deficient.

11. A Master Pilot taking a vessel in tow with a boat not answering the above description shall be liable in a penalty not exceeding two pounds for each offence.

12. The Master or chief Pilot of each boat must, unless with the consent of the Captain Pilot, have his crew in constant readiness during the tide hours to be employed in Piloting; and for their good behaviour he shall be answerable.

13. The Pilots shall attend within the Harbour, when desired, with their boats, two hours before high water, to take charge of vessels going to sea, or having occasion to move from one part of the harbour to another.

14. The Pilots whether at sea or not, shall be obliged to pay proper attention to all vessels in want of their assistance; and after taking charge of them, shall not leave them until brought into proper moorings to the satisfaction of their commanders, or until they are directed by the Captain Pilot.

15. The pilots belonging to one boat shall not have power to take charge of more than one | with four men each besides the Master Pilot, and A 2

vessel during each tide unless with the consent of the Captain Pilot.

16. Pilots shall afford assistance to Her Majesty's ships before all others, and shall employ themselves in piloting vessels into and out of the Harbour of Thurso in preference to any other service.

17. In case any vessel after making signal for a Pilot be neglected by the Pilots, the commander of every Pilot boat within the Harbour, who cannot satisfy the Trustees that they were actually engaged as Pilots at the time, shall be liable in a penalty not exceeding twenty shillings unless it was impossible to proceed to sea through stress of weather, and it shall be no excuse for a Pilot that he was engaged in fishing, provided he had intimation given him previous to his leaving the Harbour that his services would be necessary.

18. The Pilots are all furnished with licences, and a copy of these regulations, with the number of their boats marked thereon which they shall carry about them upon all occasions when employed as Pilots, and they shall be obliged to produce them when called upon, otherwise the masters of vessels shall not be obliged to receive them or pay the dues of pilotage.

19. The Pilot who first offers himself to a vessel in want of a Pilot shall be entitled to the dues of pilotage.

20. Any Anchors found in the bay by the Pilots must be delivered to the Receiver of Wreck who will reward them for their trouble.

21. Any Pilot who shall refuse to take charge of a vessel upon a proper signal being made, or on application of the Captain Pilot, or any person concerned, or any one of the said Trustees, or shall refuse on such signal or application to lead the way of any vessel which cannot be boarded without imminent danger, or shall refuse to assist any vessel in distress, or shall misbehave himself in the conduct of any vessel, or the execution of any part of his duty as a Pilot, or shall refuse or neglect to obey any summons either written or verbal, of the Trustees requiring his appearance before them or any one of them, or shall refuse or neglect to obey the orders of the Trustees or the Captain Pilot shall be suspended or forfeit such penalty as the Trustees shall think proper.

22. Any person acting as a Pilot without being licensed, or after his licence has expired or been recalled will be liable in a penalty not exceeding two pounds sterling, besides being otherwise liable to punishment.

23. The boundary of Pilot water seaward is a line from Clairdon Head on the East side to Holborn Head Lighthouse on the West side of Thurso Bay, each Pilot to remain in charge of his vessel until she is berthed according to the orders of the Harbour Master when inward bound, and from her moorings to the abovementioned seaward boundary when outward bound.

Charge for Pilotage threepence per Reg. Ton in and out inclusive.

For each tides work within the Harbour five shillings to Pilot and two shillings to each other man employed.

For extra boats when required ten shillings and sixpence for each boat and six men.

Pilots going out a greater distance than usual to foreign vessels, which have made signals for them shall be entitled to an additional allowance, at the discretion of the Captain Pilot.

The above rates are, however, only payable to the Pilots when their boats are fully manned

when a smaller number attends they are only to be paid in proportion.

If a Pilot after taking charge of a vessel in the hay, shall by stress of weather or otherwise, be detained on board, and prevented going into port he shall be entitled to his provisions while on board and be allowed two shillings and sixpence for every tide he is so detained.

All charges for extra trouble to be settled by the Trustees, or in their option, by the Captain Pilot.

Pilots demanding or receiving under any pretence, higher rates than those above-mentioned shall be liable in a penalty not exceeding ten shillings, besides returning the over charge.

Masters or owners of versels refusing to pay according to the foregoing rates of fare shall be liable in a penalty not exceeding ten shillings.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fiftyfive; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter eightytwo; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the first day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, in the words and figures following; that is to say :--

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Your Majesty, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Your Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter fifty-five, and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Your Majesty chapter eighty-two, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Clement situate in the parish of Saint Peter Bradford in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Saint Peter Bradford and of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Mary Laister Dyke in the said county and diocese which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parish and of such new parish respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said parish of Saint Peter Bradford, and of the said new parish of Saint Mary Laister Dyke should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Clement situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William Boyd, Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon, as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has signed this representa-

tion and caused his episcopal seal to be affixed thereto) and with the consents of the Reverend George Edward Tate, Clerk in Holy Orders vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the new parish of Saint Mary Kippington in the county of Kent, and Prebendary of Wells, of the Very Reverend Robert Payne Smith, Dean of the Metropolitical Church of Christ at Canterbury, of the Venerable John Richardson Archdeacon of Southwark, of Number 163 Tulse-hill in the county of Surrey, of the Reverend Handley Carr Glyn Moule, Clerk in Holy Orders, Principal of Ridley Hall in the county of Cambridge, and of the Reverend Robert Baker Girdlestone Clerk in Holy Orders minister or perpetual curate of Saint John's Chapel Hampstead in the county of Middlesex and Honorary Canon of Christ Church Oxford, (commonly known as the Simeon Trustees) as the patrons both of the vicarage of the said parish of Saint Peter Bradford, and of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Mary Laister Dyke (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Saint Peter Bradford, and of the said new parish of Saint Mary Laister Dyke, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Clement situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Clement, Bradford.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

## "The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Clement Bradford, comprising :---

"I. All that portion of the parish of Saint Peter Bradford, in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon, which is bounded upon the north-west and upon the north by the new parish of Saint Augustine Undercliffe, Bradford in the said county and diocese, upon the north-east and upon the south-east by the new parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Mary Laister Dyke, in the same county and diocese (including the hereinafter described portion thereof) and upon the remaining sides, that is to say upon the southwest and upon the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mary Laister Dyke from the parish of Saint Peter Bradford aforesaid, at the point where the old footpath which leads (or used to lead) from the Leeds-road to the Leeds and Bradford Old-road, crosses Harewood-street, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of forty-two chains or thereabouts (thereby for the latter and greater part of the way following the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Peter Bradford from the new parish of the Holy Trinity Bradford, in the county and diocese aforesaid) to the junction of such street with the Leeds and Bradford Old-road aforesaid and with Undercliffe-street, and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance

of one chain and a half or thereabouts to its | junction with Butler-street and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with the street called or known as Cowper-place, and extending thence first north-eastward and then northward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with the passage that runs along the back of the houses situate on the southern side of the road called or known as Tennyson-place and extending thence north-eastward for a distance of one hundred and twenty feet or thereabouts along the middle of that passage to a point at its junction with Tennyson-place aforesaid upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Peter Bradford from the new parish of Saint Augustine Undercliffe Bradford aforesaid.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said new parish of Saint Mary Laister Dyke which is bounded upon part of the east upon the north and upon the west by the above-described portion of the parish of Saint Peter Bradford and upon all other sides that is to say upon the south and upon the remaining part of the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Peter Bradford from the new parish of Saint Mary Laister Dyke aforesaid, at the firstly abovementioned point where the old footpath leading to the Leeds and Bradford Old-road crosses Harewood-street as aforesaid, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Harewood-street for a distance of four and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lapagestreet, and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of three and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Rochester-street, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the lastnamed street for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Dudley Hill and Killinghall High-road, and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the south-western corner of the Cavalry and Infantry Barracks on Bradford Moor, and extending thence eastward and in a straight line for a distance of fifty feet or thereabouts to a point at the said corner of the said Barracks upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mary Laister Dyke from the parish of Saint Peter Bradford aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Ripon. W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four; of the Act of the

thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four; and of the Act of the thirtysecond and thirty-third years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme or representation bearing date the twenty-second day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, in the words following, that is to say :--

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Cotes Heath in the county of Stafford and in the diocese of Lichtield.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-third day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four and published in the London Gazette on the seventeenth day of December in the same year a part of the parish of Eccleshall in the said county of Stafford and in the diocese of Lichfield aforesaid was assigned as a chapelry district to the consecrated church of Saint James situate within the limits of such parish and the same district was called 'The Chapelry District of Cotes Heath.'

"And whereas the said chapelry district of Cotes Heath has under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and four become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act and by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Cotes Heath should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Honourable and Right Reverend Augustus Bishop of the said diocese of Lichfield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Cotes Heath shall be altered so that all that portion of the said new parish which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be restored to and shall in future again form part of the said parish of Eccleshall.

"All those portions of the township of Aspley and of the township of Slindon which are at present included within the limits of the new parish of Cotes Heath aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

**THE** following Statutes made by the University of Cambridge have been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 :--

STATUTES to alter the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under "The Univer-"sities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877 40 " and 41 Victoria Chapter 48" in relation to the University of Cambridge and now submitted for the approval of Her Majesty the Queen in Council.

We the Chancellor Masters and Scholars of the University of Cambridge, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers given to us by the 53rd section of the said Act, do hereby alter the Statutes framed by the said Commissioners in relation to our said University in manner following :--

By substituting in Statute A Chapter II, "Degrees," for the section intituled "Bachelors of Arts" being Section 2 of the said Chapter, the following section to form an amended Section 2 of the same Chapter :-

## SECT. 2. Bachelors of Arts.

Bachelors of Arts, who have done all that is required by the Statutes and Ordinances of the University, may be admitted Inceptors in Arts at the end of six years from the end of their first term of residence, provided that not less than two years have elapsed from their inauguration : and after such admission they shall be created Masters of Arts at the time prescribed by the University.

By substituting in the same Chapter II of Statute A for the section intituled "Bachelors of Law" being Section 6 of the said Chapter, the following section to form an amended Section 6 of the same Chapter :-

## SECT. 6. Bachelors of Law.

Bachelors of Law, or Bachelors of Arts, who have done all that is required by the Statutes and Ordinances, of the University may be admitted Inceptors in Law at the end of six years from the end of their first term of residence, provided that not less than two years have elapsed since their inauguration.

After such admission they shall have the same rank and privileges as Inceptors in Arts. They shall be created Masters of Law at the time prescribed by the University and shall have then the same rank and privileges as Masters of Arts.

Masters of Arts, also, who have done all that is required by the Statutes and Ordinances of the University, may be admitted Inceptors in Law, and shall afterwards be created Masters of Law, and shall not thereby lose their rank and privileges.

By substituting in the same Chapter II of Statute A for the section intituled "Students in Science" being Section 12 of the said Chapter, the following section to form an amended Section 12 of the same Chapter :-

## SECT. 12. Students in Science.

Students in Science, who, having already taken a degree in Arts, Law, Medicine, Surgery or Music, have given proof of distinction in Science by some original contribution to the advancement I the academical year next following the day on

of science, and have done all that is required by the Statutes and Ordinances of the University, may be admitted to the title of Doctor Designate in Science, and shall afterwards be created Doctors at the time prescribed by the University. Provided that only those graduates in Music shal be qualified for such admission and creation who had before graduation kept at least nine terms by. residence.

By substituting in the same Chapter II of Statute A for the section intituled "Students in Letters" being Section 13 of the said Chapter, the following section to form an amended Section 13 of the same Chapter :-

## SECT. 13. Students in Letters.

Students in Letters, who, having already taken a Degree in Arts, Law, Medicine, Surgery or Music, have given proofs of distinction by some original contribution to the advancement of Learning, and have done all that is required by the Statutes and Ordinances of the University, may be admitted to the title of Doctor Designate in Letters, and shall afterwards be created Doctors at the time prescribed by the University. Provided that only those graduates in Music shall be qualified for such admission and creation who had before graduation kept at least nine terms by residence.

By substituting in the same Chapter II of Statute A for the section intituled "Students in Music" being Section 14 of the said Chapter, the following section to form an amended Section 14 of the same Chapter :-

## SECT. 14. Students in Music.

Students in Music shall keep by residence at least nine terms. They shall pursue such studies and pass such examinations as the University may from time to time prescribe by Grace. Having done all that is required by the Statutes and Ordinances of the University they may be admitted to the title of Bachelor Designate in Music and shall afterwards be inaugurated Bachelors of Music at the time prescribed by the University.

For seven years from and after the beginning of the academical year next following the day on which the assent of the Queen in Council is given to these Statutes, Students in Music may be admitted to the Degree of Bachelor of Music although they have not kept terms by residence, provided that in other respects they have done all that is required by the Statutes and Ordinances of the University.

Bachelors of Music who have, previously to graduation, kept by residence at least nine terms, and who have done all that is required by the Statutes and Ordinances of the University, may be admitted Inceptors in Music at the end of three years from their inauguration ; and after such admission they shall be created Masters of Music at the time prescribed by the University.

By substituting in the same Chapter II of Statute A for the section intituled "Bachelors in Music" being Section 15 of the said Chapter, the following section to form an amended Section 15 of the same Chapter :-

## SECT. 15. Bachelors of Music.

Persons not being less than thirty years of age who have already graduated in some Faculty of the University, have given proofs of distinction in musical composition, and have done all that is required by the Ordinances of the University, may be admitted to the title of Doctor Designate in Music, and shall afterwards be created Doctors at the time prescribed by the University.

For five years from and after the beginning of

which the assent of the Queen in Council is given to these Statutes, Bachelors in Music may be admitted to the Degree of Doctor in Music, provided that, in other respects, they have done all that is required by the Statutes and Ordinances of the University hitherto subsisting.

By substituting in Statute A Chapter III, "Graces of the Senate," for the first paragraph of Section 3 "Right of Voting" the following paragraph to form an amended paragraph 1 of Section 3 of such Chapter :---

1. The following persons shall have the right of voting in the Senate, namely the Chancellor, Vice-Chancellor, Doctors of Divinity, Law, Medicine, Science and Letters, Doctors of Music who before being admitted to their first degree have kept by residence at least nine terms, Bachelors of Divinity and Masters of Arts Law Surgery and Music.

THE following Statute, made by the Governing Body of King's College, Cambridge, on the twenty-seventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and sealed with the Common Seal of the College, on the thirtieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 :--

A STATUTE to alter a Statute made by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877 (40 and 41 Victoria Chapter 48) in relation to The King's College of Our Lady and Saint Nicholas in Cambridge and amended by a Statute dated the 27th day of February 1890, duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose held on the 27th day of October 1894 and passed at such Meeting by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting and submitted for the approval of Her Majesty the Queen in Council.

WHEREAS by Statute F made by the Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877 (40 and 41 Victoria Chapter 48) in relation to the King's College of Our Lady and Saint Nicholas in Cambridge as amended by Statute dated the 27th day of February 1890 and approved by Her Majesty the Queen in Council on the 12th day of January 1891 it is enacted as follows:

1. There shall be forty-eight Scholarships in the College, of which twenty-four shall be called Eton Scholarships, and twenty-four shall be called Open Scholarships: but the Honorary Scholarships mentioned in Section 18 (a) of this Chapter shall not be reckoned in this number.

2. Both the Eton and the Open Scholarships shall be divided into Entrance and Undergraduate Scholarships.

3. An Eton Entrance Scholarship shall be tenable for four years, and an Open Entrance Scholarship shall be tenable in the first instance

for two years, but may be prolonged by the Council for a further period or further periods, provided that the total prolongation shall in no case exceed two years, the tenure being in each case reckoned from the first day of the term in which the holder of the Scholarship commenced residence in the University. Any Entrance Scholarship shall be vacated by the election of the holder to an Undergraduate Scholarship or a Fellowship.

4. An Undergraduate Scholarship shall be tenable until the holder completes four years from the 25th day of March in the academical year in which he commenced residence in the University. But such a Scholarship may be prolonged by the Council for a further period or further periods, provided that the total period of prolongation shall in no case exceed two years. Any Undergraduate Scholarship shall be vacated by the election of the holder to a Fellowship.

5. No Scholarship shall be tenable with any office or emolument on the foundation of any other College in the University, or of any College in the University of Oxford, or of Trinity College, Dublin.

6. Every candidate for a Scholarship, not being already a member of the College, shall bring a satisfactory certificate of moral character.

7. The time and manner of examinations for Scholarships, and the day or days of election and admission thereto, shall from time to time be fixed by the Governing Body.

8. At any election a Scholarship which is not actually vacant, but which will necessarily be vacated on or before the first day of the Michaelmas Term then next following, may be treated as a vacant Scholarship.

9. The electors to Scholarships shall be the Provost, or in his absence the Vice-Provost, and two or more Fellows to be appointed annually by the Council, who may also appoint any examiners to assist the electors.

10. The manner of electing to Scholarships and all proceedings relating to the election shall be in the discretion of the electors; provided that no candidate shall be elected a Scholar without the concurrence of at least one-half of the electors present, the Provost, or in his absence the Vice-Provost, or in the absence of both the senior elector present, having a second or casting vote in case of an equality of votes; provided also that no person shall vote at an election to Entrance Scholarships who has not taken part in the examination for the same.

11. The electors shall not be bound to elect to a Scholarship any candidate whom they shall not consider of sufficient merit for election; and they shall have power to require from any candidate a declaration that he intends to devote himself exclusively to the studies of the University during the whole of the time preceding his admission to his first degree.

12. Every candidate elected to 'a Scholarship shall be admitted a Scholar, and (if not already a member of the College) commence residence at such time as shall be prescribed by the Governing Body, and shall thereupon be entitled to the emoluments of his Scholarship, which emoluments shall commence, in the case of an Entrance Scholarship, from the first day of the term in which the Scholar is admitted, and, in the case of an Undergraduate Scholarship, from the day of election; provided that no holder of an Entrance Scholarship shall, upon election to an Under-, graduate Scholarship, be required to be again admitted a Scholar; provided also, that any person elected to a Scholarship under the eighth section of this chapter shall not be entitled to any emolument thereof until the same has become actually vacant.

13. The Governing Body shall, from time to time, make such regulations as they shall think proper with respect to the University and College examinations that the Scholars shall be required to undergo, and with respect to their residence and studies; and any Scholar who shall fail to conform to such regulations, or shall not make reasonable progress in his studies, may be deprived by the Council of his Scholarship, or of the whole or part of the pecuniary emoluments of the same.

14. Every Scholar shall proceed to his degree of Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Laws, or to some equal degree, at his regular time, except with the approval of the Council, given for illness or other grave cause, and any Scholar failing so to proceed may be deprived of his Scholarship by the Council.

15. The following provisions shall apply to Eton Scholarships only:

(a.) At least six Scholarships shall be offered every year, of which at least four shall be offered as Entrance Scholarships, but it shall not be necessary to offer more than six Scholarships in any year, and, subject thereto, the Council shall determine in each year how many Scholarships shall be offered in that year, and what number shall be offered as Entrance and Undergraduate Scholarships respectively:

(b) The Entrance Scholarships shall be open to all Candidates receiving education at Eton School, whether on the foundation or not, who at the commencement of the examination are under nineteen years of age, or such less age as shall from time to time be fixed by the annual Congregation with the consent of the Governing Body of Eton School:

(c) The Undergraduate Scholarships shall be open to all Undergraduates of the College in their first, second, and third years of residence, who have been educated at Eton School whether on the foundation or not:

(d) The emoluments of an Eton Scholarship shall be eighty pounds per annum, with tuition, and with commons during residence, and with rooms rent free until the Scholar takes his first degree; and the Council may, if they think fit, assign rooms rent free to any Eton Scholar after taking his first degree, if he shall, with their permission, reside in College. Provided that when any Eton Undergraduate Scholarship is prolonged the Council may reduce the pecuniary emoluments of the same.

16. The following provisions shall apply to Open Scholarships only:

(a) At least six Scholarships shall be offered every year, but it shall not be necessary to offer more than six in any year, and subject thereto, the Council shall determine in each year how many Scholarships shall be offered in that year, and what numbers shall be offered as Entrance and Undergraduate Scholarships respectively:

(b) The Entrance Scholarships shall be open to all Candidates who at the commencement of the examination are under nineteen years of age, or such less age as shall from time to time be fixed by the Annual Congregation :

(c) The Undergraduate Scholarships shall be open to all Undergraduates of the College in their first, second, and third years of residence, including the holders of Eton Entrance Scholarships; provided that the Governing Body may in any year declare that any or all of the Undergraduate Scholarships to be offered in that year shall be open to all Undergraduates of the University:

No. 26579.

(d) The emoluments of an open Entrance Scholarship for the first two years shall not exceed eighty pounds per annum, inclusive of rent of rooms and all allowances. The emoluments and allowances of an Open Entrance Scholarship after the first two years, if the Scholarship be prolonged, and of an Open Undergraduate Scholarship, shall be such as the Annual Congregation shall from time to time determine. Provided that when any Open Undergraduate Scholarship is prolonged the Council may reduce the pecuniary emoluments of the same.

17. The Governing Body may, from time to time, make regulations as to the principles on which the Council shall prolong Undergraduate Scholarships and fix the pecuniary emoluments of the same.

18. (a) Any candidate for an Entrance or Undergraduate Scholarship may signify in writing to the Provost his wish not to receive the emoluments of the same if elected thereto, and he may thereupon be elected to an Honorary Scholarship.

(b) Any Scholar may at any time signify in writing to the Provost his wish not to receive the pecuniary emoluments of his Scholarship during his tenure of the same, and thereupon such emoluments shall cease to be paid to him and he shall thenceforth be entitled an Honorary Scholar.

(c) Any Scholar may signify in writing to the Provost his wish not to receive the pecuniary emoluments of his Scholarship during any period of his tenure of the same, and thereupon such emoluments shall not be paid to him during such period.

19. If under the foregoing provisions of this Statute the number of Eton Scholarships or Open Scholarships be in any year increased beyond twenty-four, then not more than six such Scholarships shall be offered in any subsequent year until their number is again reduced to twenty-four.

And whereas it appears to us the Provost and Scholars of the said College (being the Governing Body thereof) that it is expedient to alter the said Statute F in manner hereinafter appearing. Now therefore we the Provost and Scholars of the said College do hereby in exercise of the powers given us by the 54th section of the said Act alter and amend the said Statute F hereinbefore set out by substituting therefor the following (that is to say):

1. There shall be forty-eight Scholarships in the College, of which twenty-four shall be called Eton Scholarships, and twenty-four shall be called Open Scholarships; but the Honorary Scholarships mentioned in Section 21 (a) of this Statute shall not be reckoned in this number.

2. Both the Eton and the Open Scholarships shall be divided into Entrance and Undergraduate Scholarships.

3. An Entrance Scholarship shall be tenable in the first instance for two years, but may be prolonged by the Council for a further period or further periods, provided that the total period of prolongation shall in no case exceed two years, the tenure being in each case reckoned from the first day of the term in which the holder of the Scholarship was admitted a Scholar. Any Entrance Scholarship shall be vacated by the election of the holder to an Undergraduate Scholarship or to a Fellowship.

4. An Undergraduate Scholarship shall be tenable until the holder completes five years from the 25th day of March next preceding the date of his commencing residence in the University. But such a Scholarship may be prolonged by the Council for a further period or further periods, provided that the total period of prolongation shall in no case exceed two years. Any Undergraduate Scholarship shall be vacated by the election of the holder to a Fellowship.

5. No Scholarship shall be tenable with any office or emolument on the foundation of any other College in the University, or of any College in the University of Oxford, or of Trinity College, Dublin.

6. Every candidate for a Scholarship, not being already a member of the College, shall bring a satisfactory certificate of moral character.

bring a satisfactory certificate of moral character. 7. The time and manner of examinations for Scholarships, and the day or days of election and admission thereto, shall from time to time be fixed by the Governing Body.

8. At any election a Scholarship which is not actually vacant, but which will necessarily be vacated on or before the first day of the Michaelmas Term then next following, may be treated as a vacant Scholarship.

9. The electors to Scholarships shall be the Provost, or in his absence the Vice-Provost, and two or more Fellows to be appointed annually by the Council, who may also appoint any examiners to assist the electors. And notwithstanding anything contained in Statute D III 3, the electors to Scholarships shall award all Exhibitions which are offered at any examination for Entrance Scholarships.

10. The manner of electing to Scholarships and all proceedings relating to the election shall be in the discretion of the electors; provided that no Candidate shall be elected a scholar without the concurrence of at least one-half of the electors present, the Provost, or in his absence the Vice-Provost, or in the absence of both the senior elector present, having a second or casting vote in case of an equality of votes; provided also that no person shall vote at an election to Entrance Scholarships who has not taken part in the examination for the same.

11. The electors shall not be bound to elect to a Scholarship any candidate whom they shall not consider of sufficient merit for election; and they shall have power to require from any candidate a declaration that he intends to devote himself exclusively to the studies of the University during the whole of the time preceding his admission to his first degree.

12. Every Candidate elected to a Scholarship shall be admitted a Scholar at such time as shall be prescribed by the Governing Body, and shall thereupon be entitled to the emoluments of his Scholarship, which emoluments shall commence in the case of an Entrance Scholarship from the first. day of the term in which the Scholar is admitted, and in the case of an Undergraduate Scholarship from the day of election : provided that no holder of an Entrance Scholarship shall, upon election to an Undergraduate Scholarship, be required to be again admitted a Scholar; provided also, that any person elected to a Scholarship under the eighth section of this Statute shall not be entitled to any emolument thereof, until the same has become actually vacant.

13. The Governing Body shall from time to time make such regulations as they shall think proper with respect to the University and College examinations that the Scholars shall be required to undergo, and with respect to their residence and studies; and any Scholar who shall fail to conform to such regulations, or shall not make reasonable progress in his studies, may be deprived by the Council of his Scholarship, or of the whole or part of the pecuniary emoluments of the same.

14. Every Scholar shall proceed to his degree of Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Laws, or to some equal degree, at his regular time, except with the approval of the Council, given for illness or other grave cause, and any Scholar failing so to proceed may be deprived of his Scholarship by the Council.

15. The following regulations shall apply to Eton Scholarships subject to the provisions of section 18 of this Statute.

(a) At least six Scholarships shall be offered every year, of which at least four shall be offered as Entrance Scholarships, but it shall not be necessary to offer more than six Scholarships in any year, and, subject thereto, the Council shall determine in each year how many Scholarships shall be offered in that year, and what number shall be offered as Entrance and Undergraduate Scholarships respectively.

(b) The Entrance Scholarships shall be open to all Candidates receiving education at Eton School, whether on the foundation or not, who at the commencement of the academical year in which the examination is held are under nineteen years of age, or such less age as shall from time to time be fixed by the Annual Congregation with the consent of the Governing Body of Eton School.

(c) The Undergraduate Scholarships shall be open to all Undergraduates of the College who have been educated at Eton School, whether on the foundation or not, until the expiration of four years from the twenty-fifth day of March next preceding the date of their commencing residence in the University.

(d) The pecuniary emoluments of an Eton Scholarship shall be such sum, not less than eighty pounds per annum, as the Annual Congregation shall from time to time determine; and the Council may decide in the case of any Eton Scholar that his tuition fee, or the rent of his rooms, or both, shall be paid out of the Exhibition Fund, if, in their opinion, the Scholar stands in need of such assistance.

16. The following regulations shall apply to Open Scholarships subject to the provisions of section 17 of this Statute:

(a) At least six Scholarships shall be offered every year, but it shall not be necessary to offer more than six in any year, and subject thereto, the Council shall determine in each year how many Scholarships shall be offered in that year, and what numbers shall be offered as Entrance and Undergraduate Scholarships respectively.

(b) The Entrance Scholarships shall be open to all candidates who at the commencement of the academical year in which the examination is held are under nineteen years of age, or such less age as shall from time to time be fixed by the Annual Congregation.

(c) The Undergraduate Scholarships shall be open to all Undergraduates of the College until the expiration of four years from the twenty-fifth day of March next preceding the date of their commencing residence in the University, provided that the Governing Body may in any year declare that any or all of the Undergraduate Scholarships to be offered in that year shall be open to all Undergraduates of the University.

(d) The emcluments of an Open Entrance Scholarship for the first two years shall be such sum, not exceeding eighty pounds per annum, inclusive of rent of rooms and all allowances, as the Annual Congregation shall from time to time determine. The pecuniary emoluments of an Open Entrance Scholarship, after the first two years, if the Scholarship be prolonged, and of an Open Undergraduate Scholarship, shall be such

sum as the Annual Congregation shall from time to time determine, and the Council may decide that the tuition fee of any Open Entrance Scholar after the first two years, or of any Open Under-graduate Scholar, shall be paid out of the Exhibition Fund, if, in their opinion, the Scholar stands in need of such assistance. Provided that when any Open Undergraduate Scholarship is prolonged the Council may reduce the emoluments of the same.

17. If at any election to Scholarships a candi-date who is eligible to an Eton Scholarship shall be elected to an Open Scholarship, he shall be entitled to tuition free during his tenure of the Scholarship, together with rooms rent-free until he takes his first degree, in addition to the pecuniary emoluments mentioned in section 16 of this Statute; and the Council may assign rooms rentfree to any such Scholar after taking his first degree, if he shall, with their permission, reside in College.

18. If at any election to Scholarships a candidate who is eligible for an Eton Scholarship be elected to an Open Scholarship, then and in every such case one of the Eton Scholarships then offered shall for that turn be treated as an Open Scholarship, and the emoluments of such Scholar-ship shall be the same as those of an Open Scholarship; provided that for the purpose of sections 1 and 22 of this Statute, such Scholarship shall be counted as an Eton Scholarship.

19. If at any election the whole number of Eton Entrance Scholarships then offered be not awarded one or more Exhibitions, to be called Eton Exhibitions, shall under regulations to be determined from time to time by the Governing Body be awarded to candidates receiving education at Eton School, if candidates of sufficient merit offer themselves. The emoluments of such Exhibitions shall be not less than £40 each for two years, provided that the whole sum so awarded at any election shall not exceed the pecuniary emoluments for one year of the Eton Scholarships then offered and not awarded.

20. The Governing Body may, from time to time, make regulations as to the principles on which the Council shall prolong Undergraduate Scholarships and fix the pecuniary emoluments of the same.

21. (a) Any Candidate for an Entrance or Undergraduate Scholarship may signify in writing to the Provost his wish not to receive the emoluments of the same if elected thereto, and he may thereupon be elected to an Honorary Scholarship.

(b) Any Scholar may at any time signify in writing to the Provost his wish not to receive the pecuniary emoluments of his Scholarship during his tenure of the same, and thereupon such emoluments shall be paid into the Exhibition Fund, and he shall thenceforth be entitled an Honorary Scholar.

(c) Any Scholar may signify in writing to the Provost his wish not to receive the pecuniary emoluments of his Scholarship during any period of his tenure of the same, and thereupon such emoluments shall not be paid to him during such period, but shall be paid into the Exhibition Fund.

22. If under the foregoing provisions of this Statute the number of Eton Scholarships or Open Scholarships be in any year increased beyond twenty-four, then not more than six such Scholarships shall be offered in any subsequent year until

their number is again reduced to twenty-four. : 28. If at any time it shall be made to appear to

the satisfaction of the Visitor that, owing to any

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the exercise of the power hereby conferred would be likely to become insufficient to meet the charges created by these Statutes, without injury to the general interests of the College, it shall be lawful for the Visitor, on a petition in writing presented to him by order of the Governing Body at a Congregation specially summoned for that purpose, to direct that any Eton or Open Scholarship shall be kept vacant and that the number of Scholarships to be offered under Sections 15 and 16 of this Statute shall be reduced, or that the charges created by these Statutes in respect of Scholarships shall be diminished for such limited period as shall seem desirable in the interests of the College.

24. Every person elected to a Scholarship before the day on which this Statute shall come into operation shall hold such Scholarship, and any other Scholarship to which he may be subsequently elected, for the same period and on the same conditions, and the emoluments of such Scholarship or Scholarships shall be the same as if the Statute under which he was first elected had continued in operation.

NHE following Statutes, made by the Govern-ing Body of King's College, Cambridge, on the twenty-seventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and sealed with the Common Seal of the College, on the thirtieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, have been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 :-

STATUTES to alter Statutes made by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge. Act 1877 (40 and 41 Victoria Chapter 48) in relation to the King's College of Our Lady and Saint Nicholas in Cambridge duly made at a general meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose, held on the 27th day of October 1894 and passed at such meeting by the votes of not less than twothirds of the number of persons present and voting and submitted for the approval of Her Majesty the Queen in Council.

WHEREAS by Statute E Chapters II and V made by the Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877 (40 and 41 Victoria Chapter 48) in relation to the King's College of Our Lady and Saint Nicholas in Cambridge it is enacted as follows :

## CHAPTER II.

1. The Fellows shall be elected from among the Graduate members of the College, who shall not have completed six years from the twentyfifth day of March in the academical year in which they commenced residence in the University

2. Provided that a Congregation may at any time, by the vote of an actual majority of the cause, the revenues of the College are, or without I whole Governing Body, direct that all or any the vacant Fellowships shall, either for the then ensuing year or thenceforth until otherwise determined, be open to all Graduate members of the University not exceeding the standing mentioned in the first section of this chapter, and also, if thought advisable, to all Graduate members of the University of Oxford of the like standing.

3. Provided further, that the electors may in any year elect to one vacant Fellowship any person not satisfying the conditions for the time being required, whom they shall consider to be specially qualified to promote the interests of the College as a place of education, religion, learning, and research; and may, if previously authorized thereto by the Governing Body, make it at the time of election a condition that the Fellow so elected shall accept any College office to which he shall be elected or appointed within one year after becoming a Fellow, and shall hold such office until he shall be released from the obligation so to do, either by an express vote of the Governing Body or by his not being re-elected or reappointed to such office, or until he has become entitled to retain his Fellowship for life: provided also that on any breach of such conditions the Fellowship shall become vecant.

4. At every election of Fellows, every person qualified under the first section of this chapter shall be deemed to be a candidate, and the Governing Body may from time to time determine what shall be held to constitute a person a candidate under the second and third sections of this chapter.

## CHAPTER V.

1. Subject to the exceptions hereinafter mentioned, every Fellow shall vacate his Fellowship at the expiration of a fixed term of six years, to be reckoned from the day of his election, except in the case of a Fellow elected under the second section of the third chapter of this Statute, in whose case the term of years shall be reckoned from the time of his entering upon the emoluments of his Fellowship; but there shall not be reckoned as part of such term of years any time during which a Fellow has held any one or more of the College and University offices hereinafter mentioned.

2. Any Fellow who shall have held one or more of the said offices for not less than twenty-five years altogether, shall be excepted from the operation of the last preceding section.

3. The College offices referred to in the two sections last preceding shall be such annual and educational offices as the Annual Congregation shall from time to time determine; and the University offices referred to in the same sections shall be the offices of Public Orator, Registrary, and Librarian, together with such other offices as a Congregation shall, by the vote of an actual majority of the whole Governing Body, from time to time determine.

4. A Congregation may, by the vote of an actual majority of the whole Governing Body, allow any Fellow eminent for learning or science, or whose studies are likely to be of material service in the promotion of any art or science, and whose Fellowship would but for such vote expire within the then ensuing year, to retain his Fellowship for a further period of five years; and if they shall have exercised this power four times in the case of any Fellow, they may, by a like vote, finally except such Fellow from the operation of the first section of this chapter.

5. Any Fellow accepting a pension assigned to him under the provisions of Statute C III 6, shall thereby vacate his Fellowship.

6. Any Fellow who shall come into any

ecclesiastical preferment on the presentation of the College of the clear annual value of Four hundred pounds (after deducting rates, taxes, and other legal charges, but not the pension, if any, paid to a former incumbent), shall thereby vacate his Fellowship; provided that any Fellow coming into any such ecclesiastical preferment may retain his Fellowship, if not otherwise sooner terminable, for one year after the avoidance of such preferment by the previous holder.

7. No Fellowship shall be tenable with any office or emolument on the foundation of any other College in the University, or of any College in the University of Oxford, or of Trinity College, Dublin.

And whereas by Statute K Chapter III made by the said Commissioners it is enacted as follows :

1. Whenever the aggregate sum paid in any year to the Scholars in respect of their Scholarships shall be less than the sum of Three thousand eight hundred and forty pounds, the difference between such sums shall be paid into a separate fund, to be called the Exhibition Fund, which shall be employed in providing Exhibitions and Prizes in such manner as the Governing Body shall from time to time determine.

2. The Annual Congregation may from time to time direct any further payments to be made to the Exhibition Fund out of the general income of the College.

3. If it shall at any time appear to the Annual Congregation that the general income of the College produces a surplus beyond the amount required to provide the largest Dividend allowed by these Statutes, they may determine, subject to the approval of the Visitor, that such surplus shall be applied to increasing (permanently or temporarily) the number of Fellowships or Scholarships, or to any other purposes for the advantage of the College.

4. All payments made by Students of the College and other persons for tuition and attendance at lectures shall be appropriated to a separate fund, to be called the Tuition Fund.

5. All Caution money shall be placed to the credit of a separate Fund to be called the Caution Fund.

6. The Tuition and Caution Funds shall be managed, and the income therefrom applied in such manner, as the Governing Body shall from time to time direct. The accounts of these funds shall be kept by such Officer or Officers as the Governing Body may appoint for the purpose, and shall be annually audited with the other College accounts.

7. All moneys due to the College from any of its members shall be received and collected by some Officer or Officers appointed by the Governing Body to receive the same.

And whereas it 'appears to us the Provost and Scholars of the said College (being the Governing Body thereof) that it is expedient to alter the said Statutes E Chapters II and V and K Chapter III in manner hereinafter appearing. Now therefore we the Provost and Scholars of the said College do hereby in exercise of the powers given us by the 54th section of the said Act alter and amend Chapters II and V of the said Act alter and hereinbefore set out by substituting therefor the following (that is to say) :--

## CHAPTER II.

1. The Fellows shall be elected from among the Graduate Members of the College, who shall not have completed seven years from the twentyfifth day of March next preceding the date of their commencing residence in the University.

2. Provided that a Congregation may at any time by the vote of an actual majority of the whole Governing Body, direct that all or any of the vacant Fellowships shall, either for the then ensuing year or thenceforth until otherwise determined, be open to all Graduate Members of the University not exceeding the standing mentioned in the first section of this chapter, and also, if thought advisable, to all Graduate Members of the University of Oxford of the like standing.

3. Provided further, that the electors may in any year elect to one vacant Fellowship any person not satisfying the conditions for the time being required, whom they shall consider to be specially qualified to promote the interests of the College as a place of education, religion, learning, and research ; and may, if previously authorized thereto by the Governing Body, make it at the time of election a condition that the Fellow so elected shall accept any College office to which he shall be elected or appointed within one year after becoming a Fellow, and shall hold such office until he shall be released from the obligation so to do, either by an express vote of the Governing Body or by his not being re-elected or re-appointed to such office, or until he has become entitled to retain his Fellowship for life : provided also that on any breach of such condition the Fellowship shall become vacant.

A sum to be determined from time to time by the Annual Congregation shall be paid annually to a separate fund, to be called the Exhibition Fund, which shall be employed in providing Exhibitions, Prizes, and other allowances to Students, and in making grants to Scholars, in such manner as the Governing Body shall from time to time determine. The term Exhibitions wherever used in these Statutes shall be deemed to include Minor Scholarships.

2. If it shall at any time appear to the Annual Congregation that the general income of the College produces a surplus beyond the amount required to provide the largest Dividend allowed by these Statutes, they may determine, subject to the approval of the Visitor, that such surplus shall be applied to increasing (permanently or temporarily) the number of Fellowships or Scholarships, or to any other purposes for the advantage of the College.

3. All payments made by Students of the College and other persons for tuition and attendance at lectures shall be appropriated to a separate fund, to be called the Tuition Fund.

4. All Caution money shall be placed to the credit of a separate fund, to be called the Caution Fund.

5. The Tuition and Caution Funds shall be managed, and the income therefrom applied in such manner, as the Governing Body shall from time to time direct. The accounts of these funds shall be kept by such Officer or Officers as the Governing Body may appoint for the purpose, and shall be annually audited with the other College accounts.
