THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the following copy of an Ordinance respecting quarantine enacted by the Governor and Legislative Council of Fiji :—

No. VII, 1894.

An Ordinance (enacted by the Governor of the Colony of Fiji with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof).

To Amend the Law Relating to Quarantine.

JOHN B. THURSTON,
29th August, 1894.

Be it enacted by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows :—

Provisions During Quarantine.

1. During the detention in quarantine of the crew or passengers landed from any vessel the master or owner of such vessel shall provide and supply provisions for the said crew and passengers on the same scale as during the voyage, and shall be liable for any neglect to supply the same to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds, to be recovered summarily before any European Stipendiary Magistrate.

In case such provisions shall not be forthwith supplied, they may be procured and supplied by the Superintendent of Quarantine, and the cost may be recovered by him as a debt due from the master or owner of the vessel, and the said debt shall be a charge on the ship.

Short Title.

2. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Quarantine Amendment Ordinance, 1894."

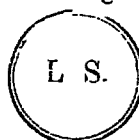

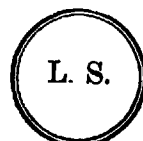
