TRADE MARKS AND PATENTS IN EGYPT.

THE Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received the following Despatch from Her Majesty's Agent and Consul-General in Egypt regarding the provisions of Egyptian law respecting the protection of Trade Marks and Patents:—

MY LORD, *Cairo, December 16, 1894.*

PREVIOUS to the receipt of your Lordship's despatch of the 3rd instant my attention had been drawn to the fact that much misapprehension prevailed as to the state of the law relating to patents in Egypt. Notably Monsieur Carton de Wiart, a Belgian lawyer who practises at Cairo, had spoken to me on the subject. At my request Monsieur Carton de Wiart wrote me a letter, of which I have the honour to enclose a copy. In this letter the deficiencies of the present law are clearly indicated.

On the 3rd instant I addressed a letter to the Minister for Foreign Affairs begging him to furnish me with an authoritative statement setting forth the nature of the existing law. I have now the honour to enclose a copy of this letter and of Boutros Pasha Ghali's reply.

Briefly, it may be stated that the Mixed Courts "have admitted a right of property in literary, "artistic or industrial works, and have civilly "condemned fraudulent imitators or appropriators "to pay damages to the owner." I should, however, add that the damages awarded are usually small in amount.

I would invite special attention to Monsieur Carton de Wiart's statement that "it must be "clearly understood that if this registration (*i.e.* "registration at the Mixed Courts) facilitates the "obtaining of damages against counterfeiters, it "does not make English or any other European "patents valid or enforceable in Egypt."

I have so far only dealt with the existing law. As regards the future, I find on enquiry that little or no progress has been made in the direction of further legislation since I addressed your Lordship's predecessor on this subject, on December 21st, 1893. I propose now to take the matter up and to see whether the negotiations cannot be pushed forward. I hope and believe that it may be possible for the Egyptian Government to arrive at an understanding with the Powers which will enable the existing law to be improved, but in view of the objections urged by the French Government it is not probable that any penal

jurisdiction in connection with this subject will be conferred on the Mixed Courts.

I have received many enquiries as to the existing state of the law. I would, therefore, suggest to your Lordship that in order that all who are concerned should be made acquainted with the facts of the case, as they now stand, it might be desirable to give publicity to this correspondence.

MY LORD, *Cairo, December 6, 1894.*

I HAD the honour of mentioning to your Lordship some days ago that my opinion had been taken in a case where the system followed at present in Egypt to secure in a certain measure the rights of inventors, &c., had led to disastrous results.

A document, described as an Egyptian patent and being a certificate of registration of an English patent in the Mixed Tribunals, had been sold for a considerable sum of money, whereas it was practically valueless.

As your Lordship expressed a wish to have particulars on the practice followed in the Mixed Tribunals about patents, trade marks, or other equivalents, I venture a few remarks on the subject.

We have neither patents nor officially protected trade marks in Egypt. The Civil Code for the Mixed Tribunals has a provision to the effect that when there is no law or when the law is not sufficient or sufficiently clear the Judge shall follow the principles of natural right and the rules of equity. (Art. 11.)

A ting in virtue of the power thus given to them to supplement in a certain way the deficiencies of the law, the Mixed Tribunals have awarded damages to the owners of patents or trade marks duly entered in any of the European countries when their goods were counterfeited in Egypt. The Tribunals had no power to prevent any one from manufacturing, selling, or using in Egypt any patented article, but they obtained a somewhat similar result by granting damages for the injury done and stating that further damages would be granted for any further trading in the particular articles about which action was taken.

Among many other objections raised by the defendants in various cases, they pleaded that nothing in Egypt had made known to the public

the prior rights of the patentees or owners of trade marks. The custom then arose of registering the the patents or trade marks in the Mixed Tribunals. This, especially if supplemented by an announcement in the *Journal Officiel* or the legal newspapers, was certainly useful, if not necessary, in establishing the priority of rights. The Cairo Tribunal said so in an important decision re Lagoadaki, and it was upheld by the Court of Appeal confirming the decision on the 30th of December, 1893.

But it must be clearly understood that if this registration facilitates the obtaining of damages against counterfeiters, it does not make English or other European patents valid or enforceable in Egypt. In my personal practice I always make a point of drawing the attention of patent agents or solicitors, who apply to me, to this distinction.

Recent cases to which I referred in the conversation I had the honour of having with your Lordship make it desirable in my opinion, that to avoid further misunderstandings the attention of the Commercial Authorities in Europe should be drawn to the real state of affairs. I hope that we may soon have the benefit of a law on patents and trade marks in Egypt. But as the consent of the Powers, requisite to make it binding on all, might not be obtained immediately, more misunderstandings will certainly arise.

M. LE MINISTRE, *Cairo, December 3, 1894.*

I RECEIVE frequent inquiries from English firms and persons interested in commerce as to the state of the law in Egypt concerning patent rights and the protection of trade marks. There appears to exist a very general impression that the registration of a trade mark in the Mixed Courts confers rights analogous to those enjoyed under the English patent laws. I believe that I am correct in saying that this idea is erroneous. Registration gives, as I understand, the power to sue for damages any person making use of the registered trade mark, but the damages assessed are usually small, and the Courts have no power to grant an injunction restraining persons from infringing the trade mark.

I should esteem it a favour if your Excellency would inform me whether my view is the right one.

It would, I think, be very useful if your Excellency in conjunction with the legal advisers of the Egyptian Government were to cause to be drawn up a clear exposition of the present state of the law in Egypt respecting the protection of industrial property. I could then forward your statement to the English Foreign Office, and request that it should be published for the information of those interested.

TRADE MARKS.

THERE are articles in both the native and mixed Penal Codes treating the fraudulent imitation of trade marks as a criminal offence punishable by fine and confiscation. But these articles presuppose the existence of special laws establishing the right of property in such marks, and no such laws as yet have been made. As regards the Mixed Courts they have no general penal power, and they are unable to apply the Penal Code save in a very limited set of cases.

But the Mixed Courts, under the special power given them to apply the rules of equity and natural law when the written law is silent or insufficient, have admitted a right of property in literary, artistic, or industrial works, and have civilly condemned fraudulent imitators or appropriators to pay damages to the owner.

The property is established by proof of prior exclusive use; no legal formality is required to establish the right.

The native Tribunals do not possess, or at any rate have not exercised, such a power to give damages.

The Mixed Tribunals permit trade marks to be registered in their offices, allow parties interested in a trade mark to make a declaration of their mark in the office of the Tribunal. But no publicity is given to the declaration, no examination is made to test the authenticity of the mark; and proof of exclusive use may be given by other means. But the public exaggerate the value of this registration, and cases have occurred where it has been used for fraudulent purposes.

The necessity of placing the whole matter on a legal footing is clear, and one law for all, foreigners and natives alike, is urgently needed. The damages when awarded are always small, and the offender is often too poor to pay them, however small. Registration with publicity, and confiscation with damages and fine, are required. An injunction in the sense of prohibition under pain of imprisonment for disobedience is not admitted in the French system.

In 1884 Nubar Pacha raised this question before the International Commission and the application of the Penal Code was under discussion. He then undertook on behalf of the Egyptian Government to prepare a law—for trade marks only—on this subject for submission to the Powers. Consequently a law was submitted to the Council of Ministers and the Legislative Council, and after acceptance was circulated to the Powers and accepted by England, Portugal, United States, Sweden and Norway, and Spain.

Holland and Austria-Hungary accepted the Bill in principle with certain reservations. Italy, Belgium, Greece, Russia, and Denmark have not yet replied.

France has presented certain modifications refusing the penal jurisdiction to the Mixed Tribunals and reserving it to the Consular jurisdiction.

The essential points of the Egyptian Government plan are as follows:—

I. Property in a trade mark can only be acquired by registration in the office of a Mixed Tribunal.

II. Mixed Tribunals have sole jurisdiction over

any infraction of the law, whatever may be the nationality of the parties.

III. The jurisdiction is penal as well as civil.

IV. Offenders against the law are punished by fine, the maximum being L. Eg. 50, by one year's imprisonment, and by confiscation of the counterfeit goods, and of any machinery which has served for the fraudulent imitation.

The above penalties are doubled in case of a second offence.

N.B.—It will be observed that the Mixed Courts are given (a) jurisdiction even over natives, and (b) penal jurisdiction; but these exceptional powers seem justified by special circumstances. The owners of trade marks are almost invariably Europeans, and the offence is of a new character to which Eastern nations are not accustomed.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Copenhagen, enclosing copy of a law under which all trawl fishing is prohibited within the territorial waters of Iceland. This law will come into effect in February next, and an abstract thereof, so far as it affects British fishermen, is subjoined:—

All trawl fishing is prohibited within the territorial waters of Iceland.

Any person who shall commit a breach of the law will be liable to a penalty of from 1,000 to 10,000 kroner (about £55 to £550) and to forfeiture of the trawl and of any fish illegally taken. The vessel and fish will be liable to seizure in satisfaction of the fine and costs.

Any fishing vessel found within territorial waters having a trawl on board, although not actually engaged in fishing at the time, will, for the first offence be liable to a fine of from 200 to 2,000 kroner (about £11 to £110), unless it can be

proved that the vessel was seeking a harbour in distress. For a subsequent offence, the vessel will be liable to be treated as a vessel engaged in trawling.

The previous law on the subject, dated 9th August, 1889, is repealed.

Any captain desiring that the inquiry may be effected on board his vessel must on his arrival at the Dardanelles hoist a flag at the foremast as follows: Five red stripes alternating with five yellow stripes, each ten centimetres in width and two metres in length, placed horizontally. He should also bring his vessel as near as possible to the Tchanak Kaleh Health Office."

COMME suite à mes circulaires du 25 Septembre et du 19 Novembre derniers, j'ai l'honneur de vous faire connaître que, d'après les instructions données par mon département et portées à la connaissance des agents de l'administration des douanes par M. le Ministre des finances, seuls les vieux papiers de tenture, qui peuvent être suspects de contamination—ou les expéditions qui sont mélangées à des papiers de cette espèce—doivent être emballés conformément à l'arrêté royal du 24 Septembre 1894.

Quant aux vieux papiers comprenant des registres, cahiers, archives, papiers de bureau, rognures, livres, brochures, etc., il suffira qu'ils remplissent les conditions suivantes pour être admis à l'entrée et au transit :

1. S'ils sont expédiés en vrac, ils devront être transportés par wagons complets, fermés, chargés au lieu d'expédition et livrés au destinataire dans son usine, sans déchargement ou manipulation au cours de route.

L'administration des chemins de fer a été priée de veiller à ce que cette mesure soit exécutée, une fois la visite de la douane effectuée ;

2. S'ils sont expédiés par charges incomplètes, soit par chemin de fer, soit par toute autre voie, ils seront emballés en sacs solides, hermétiquement fermés.

Dans les deux cas, l'administration des douanes devra toujours exiger la production du certificat d'origine légalisé par l'autorité locale ou le consul de Belgique du lieu d'expédition.

Ces dérogations aux dispositions en vigueur sont prises en vertu de l'article 2 de l'arrêté royal du 17 juin 1894.

Je vous serais obligé, monsieur le gouverneur, de donner la plus large publicité à la présente dépêche par la voie du *Mémorial administratif*.

IN pursuance of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, Her Majesty's Postmaster-General hereby gives notice that a Warrant, dated the 31st day of December, 1894, has been made on his representation by the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury in pursuance of the Post Office Acts, ordering, directing, and declaring that on and from the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, Parcels may, subject to the provisions of the said Warrant, and at the rates of postage therein specified, and in accordance with the regulations therein contained, be transmitted by post

- (a.) Between the United Kingdom and France, and
- (b.) Viâ France, between the United Kingdom and Algeria, Corsica, and Tunis, and
- (c.) Viâ France, between the United Kingdom and any place for the conveyance of Parcels to and from which arrangements between the British and French Post Offices may for the time being exist. Provided that the transmission of parcels to and from such places is not regulated by any other Treasury Warrant.

And the Postmaster-General further gives notice that copies of the said Warrant may be purchased, either directly or through any bookseller, from Eyre and Spottiswoode, East Harding-street, Fleet-street, E.C.; or John Menzies and Co., 12, Hanover-street, Edinburgh, and 90, West Nile-street, Glasgow; or Hodges, Figgis, and Co. Limited, 104, Grafton-street, Dublin.

ORDER of the Local Government Board under the District Auditors Act, 1879: Assignment of Duties and District:—

Herefordshire and Monmouthshire Audit District.

To Alfred Walker Dolby, of Edlestone House, Crewe, in the county of Chester, District Auditor;—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions named in the First Schedule to this Order;—

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised within the said Unions respectively;—

To the Highway Boards for the Highway Districts named in the Second Schedule to this Order;—

To the Urban District Councils for the Urban Districts named in the Third Schedule to this Order;—

To the School Board for the United School District of Newchurch;—

To the Authorities referred to in Article I (6) of this Order;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts

in which such Auditors respectively are to act; and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas the said Alfred Walker Dolby, hereinafter referred to as "the said District Auditor," is a District Auditor duly appointed under the provisions of the Statutes in that behalf:

And whereas George Henry Brett is a District Auditor duly appointed under the provisions of the Statutes in that behalf, and is the Auditor for the Herefordshire and Monmouthshire Audit District;

And whereas another District has been assigned to the said George Henry Brett, and it is expedient that the Herefordshire and Monmouthshire Audit District should be assigned to the said District Auditor, in lieu of to the said George Henry Brett:

And whereas the said Alfred Walker Dolby is now acting as Assistant Auditor in "The North Western Counties Audit District":

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, hereby certify the appointment of the said District Auditor accordingly, and hereby Order and Prescribe as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—It shall be the duty of the said District Auditor, from and after the date hereof, to audit the Accounts of the following Authorities and their Officers; namely,—

- (1.) The Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions named in the First Schedule to this Order.
- (2.) The Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said several Unions.
- (3.) The Highway Boards for the Highway Districts named in the Second Schedule to this Order.
- (4.) The Urban District Councils for the Urban Districts named in the Third Schedule to this Order, and the Local Boards for the same Districts.
- (5.) The School Board for the United School District of Newchurch.
- (6.) The several other Authorities for the time being whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being wholly situated within one or more of the said Unions, and whose accounts are not subject to Audit by any other District Auditor.
- (7.) Such of the other Authorities whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be so audited, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within one or more of the said Unions, as We may by Order under Seal hereafter prescribe.

ARTICLE II.—The said District Auditor shall audit the said Accounts according to the provisions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority, in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the audit of such Accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.

ARTICLE III.—The District in which the said District Auditor shall, from and after the date hereof, act as Auditor, and which We hereby assign to him, in lieu of to the said George Henry Brett, for the performance of his duties under this Order, and which shall be termed "The Herefordshire and Monmouthshire Audit District," shall, until We otherwise prescribe, comprise the

area for the time being included in the several Poor Law Unions and Districts named in the Schedules to this Order, and in paragraph (5) of Article I of this Order, and the Districts or areas subject to the jurisdiction of any such Authority as is mentioned in paragraph (7) of the said Article I.

By the Board of Agriculture:

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every

other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area declared by Order of the Board dated the fifteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—in the county of Cambridge included within a boundary line commencing at a point where the Roman road crosses the road from Balsham to Hildersham, thence along the latter road in a southerly direction to its junction with the back road from Bartlow to Little Abington, thence along the latter road in a south-easterly direction to its junction with the main road leading from Linton to Balsham, thence in a northerly direction along the latter road to its junction with the Roman road aforesaid, and thence along the latter road in a westerly direction to its junction with the road from Balsham to Hildersham aforesaid; the said roads described as the boundary line not being included in the Area,—is, except such portion thereof as is included in the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and the Area above described, except as aforesaid, shall as from the commencement of this Order cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order shall continue to be and is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, and shall for the purposes of the Order of the Board dated the twentieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four be deemed to be the Area described in the Schedule to that Order, and as from the commencement of this Order the said Order of the twentieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four shall be read and have effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the second day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.
