COMMERCIAL RELATIONS WITH SPAIN.

THE Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received the following Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Madrid:—

MY LORD, *Madrid, January 2, 1895.*

I HAVE now the honour to inclose a copy of my note to the Spanish Minister for Foreign Affairs confirming the commercial agreement between the United Kingdom and Spain, together with a copy and translation of His Excellency's reply.

The original note from Señor Groizard will be forwarded to your Lordship by the first safe opportunity.

Madrid, December 28, 1894.

MONSIEUR LE MINISTRE,
CIRCUMSTANCES having impeded the further negotiations for a definite Commercial Treaty, the Government of Her Majesty, my August Sovereign, are prepared to record in a more formal manner the understanding now existing* between the United Kingdom and Spain for the regulation of their mutual commercial relations. They understand that this course will for many reasons be convenient to the Government of His Catholic Majesty.

It is therefore understood between the two Governments that they maintain the agreement entered into between them in the month of June last, by the note addressed by me to Your Excellency's predecessor on the 20th of June, 1894, and the note I had the honour to receive from Señor Moret under date of the 29th of the same month. Such agreement shall remain in force until a permanent Treaty be concluded, or unless it be terminated by one of the parties, who shall with this object give the other a notice of six months.

As before, it is agreed that it shall be open to any British Colony to withdraw from the present agreement, on notice to that effect being given by Her Majesty's Ambassador at Madrid to the Spanish Minister for Foreign Affairs within six months after the date of its signature.

MONSIEUR L'AMBASSADEUR,

I HAVE had the honour to receive the note which your Excellency communicated to me on the 28th instant, to the effect that circumstances having impeded the continuation of the negotiations for a definitive Treaty of Commerce between Spain and the United Kingdom, the Government of Her Britannic Majesty is prepared to record, in a more formal manner, the understanding now existing for the regulation of their commercial relations.

The Government of His Catholic Majesty, who believe that this understanding will be, for various reasons, equally convenient to that of Her Britannic Majesty, consider that the agreement entered into by exchange of notes under date of the 20th and 29th of June last, between your Excellency and my predecessor, Señor Moret, is maintained until the conclusion of a definitive Treaty, unless it be terminated by one of the High Contracting Parties, who, with this object, give to the other a notice of six months.

As before, it is agreed that it shall be open to any British Colony to withdraw from the present agreement on notice to that effect being given by the Ambassador at Madrid to the Spanish Minister for Foreign Affairs within six months after the date of its signature.

* The following is the understanding now existing between Great Britain and Spain referred to in Sir H. Wolff's above despatch and made public in July, 1894.

"Under the provisions of an Act recently passed by the Spanish Cortes, goods arriving in Spain and her Colonies from the United Kingdom and the British Colonies will continue to receive the same treatment as heretofore, namely, in the Peninsula and the adjacent islands the Minimum Tariff, together with the advantages conceded by Treaty to Switzerland, Sweden and Norway, and the Netherlands, or other European States, except Portugal.

"In the Spanish Colonies, such goods will continue to be treated under the Minimum Column of the Colonial Tariff.

"This treatment will be maintained until a permanent Commercial Treaty is concluded be-

tween the United Kingdom and Spain, or until the negotiations now pending for the conclusion of such a Treaty are formally broken off."

Wolverhampton Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Wolverhampton Union ;

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Townships in the said Union ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by certain General Orders bearing date respectively the 24th day of July, 1847, the 12th day of February, 1879, the 3rd day of November, 1892, and the 8th day of March, 1894 addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Wolverhampton Union (among others), the Poor Law Commissioners and the Local Government Board prescribed Rules and Regulations relating to the government and guidance of the said Guardians, the Government of the Workhouse of the said Union, the appointment by the said Guardians of Officers and Assistants at the said Workhouse, and the duties, remuneration, and continuance in office of such Officers and Assistants ;

And whereas by a General Order dated the 14th day of January, 1867, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Union (among others), the Poor Law Board prescribed Regulations for the keeping, examining, auditing, and

allowing of the Accounts of the said Guardians and their Officers, including the Accounts relating to the said Workhouse ;

And whereas the said Guardians propose, with Our approval, to hire certain premises situate in Bilston-road, Wolverhampton, to be used as a temporary Workhouse for the said Union ;

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows :—

ARTICLE I.—The several Orders above mentioned shall, so far as they are applicable to the said temporary Workhouse, and subject as hereinafter mentioned, apply to such Workhouse accordingly.

ARTICLE II.—Articles 172 and 188 of the said Order of the 24th day of July, 1847, and Article 1 of the said Order of the 12th day of February, 1879, relating to the remuneration and the continuance in office of Officers or Assistants, are hereby suspended with respect to the said temporary Workhouse.

ARTICLE III.—Every Officer or Assistant at the said temporary Workhouse shall be appointed for such term and at such salary or remuneration as the said Guardians may determine ; but the particulars of every such appointment, including the name of the Officer or Assistant, the term for

which he is appointed, and the salary or remuneration assigned to him, shall be reported to Us by the Clerk to the said Guardians as early as practicable.

ARTICLE IV.—Every such Officer or Assistant may be dismissed by the said Guardians at their discretion.

ARTICLE V.—The provisions contained in the above-mentioned Orders, and which are by Article I of this Order made applicable to the said temporary Workhouse, shall, as regards such Workhouse, be subject to any modification thereof or departure therefrom to which, on the application of the said Guardians, We may assent.

No. 690.—NORTH AMERICA AND WEST INDIES STATION.

NOVA SCOTIA.

(1) *Cape Breton Island—Alterations in Lights at Chetican Harbour.*

THE Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice, dated 20th November, 1894, that the undermentioned alterations have been made in the leading lights at Eastern Harbour, Chetican Island:—

Eastern Harbour Front Light is a catoptric fixed red light, visible over a small arc on either side of the bearing S. 20° W. (leading lights in

line), from a distance of 8 miles in clear weather, and elevated 45 feet above high water.

Eastern Harbour Rear Light is a catoptric fixed white light, visible over a small arc on either side of the bearing S. 20° W., from a distance of 13 miles in clear weather, and elevated 62 feet above high water.

The masts from which the lights were previously shown have been removed, and each light is now exhibited from a four-sided, pyramidal, wooden building, painted white, lantern red, erected on the sites formerly occupied by the masts. The Front Lighthouse is 30 feet high, and the Rear Lighthouse 38 feet.

Approximate position, Front Lighthouse on Chart No. 2727, lat. 46° 38' 15" N., long. 61° 0' 15" W.

(2) *Gut of Canso—Intended alteration in Eddy Point Light.*
