THE Earl of Kimberley, K.G., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received from Mr. F. W. Kerr, Her Majesty's Agent for the British Claims, the following Notice to British subjects having claims against the Government of Chile arising out of the Civil War of 1891.

Notice is hereby given to claimants that the undersigned, British Vice-Consul at Santiago, has been appointed Her Majesty's Agent for the British claims arising out of the acts committed against their persons or property during the period between the 7th day of January and the 28th day of August, 1891, inclusive.

The Mixed Commission, established under the Anglo-Chilean Convention of the 28th day of September, 1893, held their first meeting on the 24th ultimo, and in accordance with Article I of the above-named Convention every claim must be presented to the Commissioners within six months from that date.

And whereas various claims, and documents in support of them, have from time to time been transmitted to the Foreign Office in London and to Her Majesty's Legation in Santiago, the claimants are hereby notified that each claim must be accompanied by a Memorial to the Commissioners, and their claims formulated in conformity with the Rules of Procedure adopted by the Commissioners.

By order of the Commissioners the Memorials must be in print, and twelve copies thereof in Spanish and English must be forwarded for the use of the Commissioners.

Such claimants as may desire copies of the Rules of Procedure, as laid down by the Commissioners for the guidance of claimants in the presentation of their claims, can obtain them on application to me.*

Claimants are requested to file their Memorials, together with all documents connected with their claims, at my office, No. 34, Calle Bandera, Santiago, with as little delay as possible.

M. LE MINISTRE,

I HAVE the honour to acknowledge receipt of the note which your Excellency was good enough to address to me on $\frac{\text{November 26}}{\text{December 8}}$, proposing a Commercial Convention for a period of two years with Customs duties of $10\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. ad valorem on British imports into Bulgaria.

I am instructed to inform your Excellency that Her Majesty's Government are prepared to accept the above-mentioned proposal on the following conditions:—

1. That British merchandize imported into Bulgaria should enjoy the treatment of the most favoured nation both in regard to transport tariffs or dues, and also in every other respect.

2. That British merchandize should not be subject to any municipal taxes or octroi duties which shall exceed a maximum of 2 per cent. ad valorem, with the exception of certain articles, specified in a tariff agreed upon between the two Governments. It is also understood that, in no circumstances, British merchandize shall pay higher taxes or duties than native merchandize of the same category, or than merchandize of the most favoured nation.

On receipt of a note from your Excellency, conveying the assent of the Bulgarian Government to the above conditions, Her Majesty's Government will consent that, from 13th January, 1895, British merchandize imported into Bulgaria should be subjected, till 13th January, 1897, to Customs duties of 10 per cent. ad valorem, together with the additional ½ per cent. hitherto accorded.

EN réponse à la note que vous avez bien voulu m'adresser le $\frac{17}{19}$ Décembre, 1894, j'ai l'honneur de vous informer que l'arrangement commercial Anglo-bulgare est prolongé pour une période de deux ans, à partir du 18 Janvier, 1895, jusqu'au 12 Janvier, 1896, durant laquelle les marchandises britanniques importées en Bulgarie seront soumises à un droit de douane de 10½ pour cent. ad valorem.

A cette occasion le Gouvernement Bulgare déclare que les marchandises britanniques jouiront. sur le territoire bulgare, du traitement de la nation la plus favorisée, soit sous le rapport des tarifs et frais de transport, soit à tout autre point de vue, qu'elles ne paieront pas de taxes ou droits plus élevés que ceux acquittés par les marchandises indigènes de même catégorie ou par les produits similaires des pays les plus favorisés, et qu'elles ne seront soumises à aucune taxe municipale ou droit d'octroi qui dépasse un maximum de 2 pour cent. ad valorem, à l'exception de certains articles spécifiés dans le tableau existent, sur lequel un accord a été établi entre les deux Gouvernements.

En ce qui concerne les marchandises bulgares, importés dans le Royaume-Uni, elles continueront à y être traitées, durant la dite période, sur le même pied d'égalité que celles de la nation la plus favorisée. Veuillez, &c.

IN reply to the note which you addressed to me on the 17th (29th) of December, 1894, I have the honour to state that the Anglo-Bulgarian Commercial Arrangement is prolonged for a period of two years, from the 1st (13th) of January, 1895, till the 31st December, 1896, during which time British merchandize imported into Bulgaria will be subject to a Customs duty of

101 per cent. ad valorem.
The Bulgarian Government now declares that British merchandize shall, on Bulgarian territory, enjoy the treatment of the most favoured nation, in regard either to transport tariffs or dues, or to any other matter: That it shall pay no higher taxes or duties than native merchandize of the same category, or than similar produce of the most favoured nations: That it shall not be subject to any municipal tax or octroi duty which shall exceed a maximum of 2 per cent, ad valorem, with the exception of certain articles specified in the existing tariff, agreed upon between the two Governments.

Bulgarian merchandize imported into the United Kingdom shall continue to be freated, during the aforesaid period, on the same footing of equality as that of the most favoured nation.

(Translation.) Board of Health, Monte Video, December 1, 1894. Decree No. 16.

ART. 1. Complementary quarantine is to be imposed on ships which have sailed from Rio de Janeiro and Santos before the 25th of November.

ART. 2. Eight days' quarantine to be imposed on vessels which have left after that date.

ART. 3. Ships which have sailed from other

Brazilian ports after the above-mentioned date to be disinfected.

ART. 4. This disinfection to comprise passengers' wearing apparel, and to be carried out in the "Lyons" stoves of the lazaret on Flores Island.

If the vessel ends her voyage at this port the clothes of the crew will also be disinfected.

ART. 5. Steamers are to proceed to Flores Island to receive the health visit.

ART. 6. Sailing vessels will be inspected in this port provided they do not carry passengers and have no sickness on board.
