Ir having been officially reported that the conditions of public health in Portugal, Belgium, the Low Countries, and Germany are satisfactory:

In view of the Law of December 22, 1888, No. 5849 (Series 3), for the protection of hygiene and of public health

Decrees :-The Quarantine Notice, No. 5, of the 22nd of April, 1894, is revoked so far as concerns vessels arriving from Portugal, and the later Notice, No. 10, of the 11th of August, 1894, respecting wessels arriving from the ports of Belgium and Molland, and the Baltic ports of Germany, is -entirely revoked.

In consequence, vessels arriving from the said · States will in future be permitted to enter the
