CANCELLATIONS.

BROADWAY, Stratford.	Six Carriages. In the Broadway, Stratford, commencing at the West end of Stratford Church Yard, midway between the Romford and Woodford Roads, side by side; horses' heads towards Bow.
ROMNEY PLACE and CHURCH STREET, Greenwich.	Five Carriages. One to stand at the West end on the North side of Romney Place, clear of the Ship Restaurant, the remainder extending in a Northerly direction along the East and West sides of Church Street, as far as necessary.
DOCK STREET, Whitechapel.	Ten Carriages. Commencing opposite the Sir Sidney Smith Public-house, and extending Southward as far as necessary for Nine Carriages, One Carriage to stand at end of street opposite the London Dock Wall.
KING'S ROAD, Chelsea, (World's End Passage).	Eight Carriages. By the triangular paved space at the junction of Dartrey Road and Blantyre Street.
HIGH HOLBORN, Chancery Lane.	Twenty Carriages. In the centre of Roadway, High Holborn, from the City Boundary to Chancery Lane. Horses' heads towards the West.
KNIGHT'S HILL, Lower Norwood Station.	Four Carriages. Commencing opposite the Jews' Hospital, and extending along the West side of Knight's Hill, opposite the Lower Norwood Railway Station.
FULHAM ROAD, Walham Green.	Five Carriages. In two portions, viz.:— First portion—One Carriage on the North side of refuge, in centre of road, at Broadway, Walham Green. Horse's head facing North. Second portion—Four Carriages at kerb on East side of Fulham Road, outside St. John's Schools, Walham Green, four yards North of the cattle drinking trough. Horses' heads facing South. The first portion to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion.
VICTORIA EMBANKMENT, Temple Railway Station.	Twelve Carriages. Next the kerb on the North side of the Temple Railway Station, commencing opposite the South-West corner of Arundel Street, and continued to opposite the South-East corner of Surrey Street. Horses' heads towards the East.
CRANBROOK ROAD, Ilford.	Four Carriages. At the junction of Ley Street and Balfour Road, Ilford, the backs of the carriages to be against the kerb, and the horses to face the Great Eastern Railway Station.
