*Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Temporary Order of 1894 continued until 28th February, 1895.*

1. The Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Temporary Order of 1894 shall be read and have effect as if the twenty-eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five were substituted for the thirtieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four in Article 1 of that Order, as the date from and immediately after which that Order shall cease to operate, and the operation of that Order which was continued by subsequent Orders is hereby further continued accordingly.

*Existing Regulations of Local Authority.*

2. Any Regulation made by a Local Authority under the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Temporary Order of 1894 as continued by subsequent Orders and in force on the thirty-first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, shall, unless altered or revoked by such Local Authority, remain in force until the twenty-eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.

*Short Title.*

3. This Order may be cited as THE SWINE-FEVER (MOVEMENT FROM IRELAND) TEMPORARY ORDER OF 1895.
