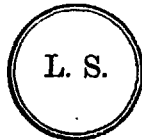


Statutes or under Statute XXXI of the Statutes approved by the Queen in Council on sixteenth April one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one: also all charges arising from necessary repairs of buildings such stipends and salaries to the officers and servants of the College as may have been fixed by the Master and Fellows and all other ordinary burthens. Of the net income resulting ten per centum shall be paid to the General Scholarship Fund. The remainder after deducting the allowances of the Master and Fellows as fixed from time to time by vote of the Master and Fellows shall be called the "Divisible Income."

From the "Divisible Income" shall be paid to each Fellow under these Statutes one dividend such dividend not to exceed two hundred and fifty pounds, to the Master three such dividends and to each person who shall have acquired under Statute XV of these Statutes a right to a pension so many one-fifth parts of such dividend as under Statute XV he is entitled to (such payments by way of pension to be made *pari passu* with payments by way of dividend and without priority as between fellowships and pensions). The balance of "Divisible Income" if any shall be set aside for the use and emolument of the College. Provided that if any person shall have been Master or Fellow for a part only of such preceding year he shall be entitled to one-fourth part only of his annual share for each quarter of a year or part of a quarter greater than the half during which he may have been Master or Fellow.
