Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or

Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained

at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be very distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

WHEREAS Her Majesty the Queen has jurisdiction within the Ottoman dominions:

And whereas "The Colonial Prisoners Removal Act, 1884," provides that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to direct that that Act shall apply as if, subject to the conditions, exceptions, and qualifications (if any) contained in the Order, any place out of Her Majesty's dominions in which Her Majesty has jurisdiction, and which is named in the Order, were a British possession and part of Her Majesty's dominions, and to provide for carrying into effect such application.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890," and the said recited Act, or otherwise in Her Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. "The Colonial Prisoners Removal Act, 1884," shall apply to Egypt and to the Ottoman dominions (except Egypt) as if those places were respectively British possessions and parts of Her Majesty's dominions.

Subject as follows :--

As respects Egypt, Her Majesty's Agent and Consul-General, and as respects the Ottoman dominions (except Egypt), Her Majesty's Ambassador at Constantinople, shall be substituted for the Governor or Government of a British possession.

2. This Order may be cited as "The Ottoman Dominions (Prisoners' Removal) Order in Council, 1895," and shall be read as one with "The Ottoman Order in Council, 1873," and the Orders amending that Order.

And the Right Honourable the Earl of Kimberley, K.G., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, is to give the necessary directions herein.

And whereas the immediate operation of this Order is urgent, this Order shall come into operation forthwith.

Vu l'avis conforme de Messieurs les commissaires-directeurs de la Caisse de la Dette Publique en ce qui concerne l'Article 7:

Avec l'assentiment des Puissances:

Decretons

ARTICLE PREMIER.

A partir de l'exercice financier 1894, il sera prévue dans les lettr prelevé annuellement sur les recettes actuelles des Commerciales intervencies de phare, une somme de 40,000 L.E., qui dits Gouvernements.

sera employée comme il est expliqué dans les articles suivants:

ARTICLE 2.

La somme prélevée en 1894 sera affectée, l° à combler le déficit eventuel de l'exercice financier 1894 du Conseil quarantenaire, au cas où ce déficit n'aurait pas pu être entièrement couvert avec les ressources provenant du fonds de réserve du dit Conseil, ainsi qu'il sera dit à l'article qui suit: 2°, à faire face aux dépenses extraordinaires nécessitées par l'aménagement des établissements sanitaires d'El Tor, de Suez et des Sources des Moïse.

ARTICLE 3.

Le fonds de réserve actuel du Conseil quarantenaire sera employé à combler le déficit de l'exercice 1894, sans que ce fonds puisse être réduit à une somme inférieure à 10,000 L. E.

Si le déficit ne se trouve pas ainsi entièrement couvert il y sera fait face, pour le reste, avec les ressources créees à l'article premier.

ARTICLE 4.

Sur la somme de L.E.80,000, provenant des exercices 1895 et 1896, il sera prélevé: t° une somme égale à celle qui aura été payée en 1894 sur les mêmes recettes, à valoir sur le déficit de la dite année 1894, de manière à porter à L.E.40,000 le montant des sommes affectées aux travaux extraordinaires prévus à l'article 1 er pour El Tor, Suez et les Sources de Moïse; 2°, les sommes nécessaires pour combler le déficit du Budget du Conseil quarantenaire pour les exercices financiers 1895 et 1896.

Le surplus, après le prélevement ci-dessus, sera affecté à la construction de nouveaux phares dans la mer Rouge.

ARTICLE 5.

A partir de l'exercice financier 1897 cette somme annuelle de L.E 40.000 sera affectée à combler les déficits eventuels du Conseil quarantenaire; le montant de la somme nécessaire à cet effet sera arrêté définitivement en prenant pour base les résultats financiers des exercices 1894 et 1895 du Conseil.

Le surplus sera affecté à une réduction des droits de phares; il est entendu que ces droits seront réduits dans la même proportion dans la mer Rouge et dans la Méditerranée.

ARTICLE 6.

Moyennant les prélèvements et affectations cidessus, la Gouvernement est à partir de l'année 1894, déchargé de toute obligation quelconque en ce qui concerne les dépenses soit ordinaires soit extraordinaires, du Conseil quarantenaire.

Il est entendu, toutefois, que les dépenses supportées jusqu'à ce jour par le Gouvernement Égyptien continueront à rester à sa charge.

ARTICLE 7.

A partir de l'exercice 1894, lors du règlement de compte des excédents avec la Caisse de la Dette Publique, la part de ces excédents revenant au Gouvernement sera majorée d'une somme annuelle de 20,000L.E.

ARTICLE 8.

Il a été convenu entre le Gouvernement Égyptien et les Gouvernements d'Allemagne, de Belgique, de Grande-Bretagne et d'Italie, que la somme affectée à la réduction des droits de phare, aux termes de l'article 5 du présent décret, viendra en déduction de celle de 40,000 L.E., prévue dans les lettres annexées aux Conventions Commerciales intervenues entre l'Égypte et les dits Gouvernements.

ARTICLE 9.

Notre Ministre des Finances est chargé de l'exécution du présent décret.

Journal Officiel of December 31, 1894. WE, Khedive of Egypt, on the proposal of Our Minister of Finance and the advice of Our Council and Ministers;

In view of the advice of the Commissioners and Directors of the "Caisse de la Dette Publique," touching Article 7:

With the assent of the Powers:

Decree.

ARTICLE 1.

From the commencement of the financial year 1894 there shall be deducted annually from the actual receipts of the light dues the sum of £.E.40,000, which shall be used as explained in the following Articles:

ARTICLE 2.

The sum deducted in 1894 shall be appropriated, 1° to make good the possible deficit for the financial year of 1894 of the Quarantine Board, in case this deficit shall not have been entirely covered by the resources derived from the reserve fund of the said Board, as will be specified in the following Article: 2° to provide for the extraordinary expenses entailed by the erection of the sanitary establishments of El Tor, Suez, and Moses' Wells.

ARTICLE 3.

The present reserve fund of the Quarantine Board shall be used to make good the deficit of the financial year 1894, but without reducing this fund below £.E.10,000.

If the deficit is not entirely covered by this means the remainder shall be made up from the resources provided in the first Article.

ARTICLE 4.

From the sum of £.E.80,000 derived from the financial years 1895 and 1896 there shall be taken: 1° a sum equal to that which shall have been paid in 1894 on the same receipts, towards the deficit of the said year 1894, so as to bring the amount of the sums appropriated for the extraordinary works mentioned in the first Article for El Tor, Suez and Moses' Wells up to £.E.40,000; 2° the sums necessary to make good the deficit of the budget of the Quarantine Board for the financial years 1895 and 1896.

The surplus, after the above-mentioned deduction, shall be appropriated for the construction of new lights in the Red Sea.

ARTICLE 5.

From the commencement of the financial year 1897 this annual sum of £.E.40,000 shall be appropriated to make good the possible deficits of the Quarantine Board; the amount of the sum necessary for this purpose shall be definitely fixed by taking as a basis the Board's financial results for the years 1894 and 1895.

The surplus shall be appropriated to reduce the light dues; it is understood that these dues shall be reduced in the same proportion in the Red Sea and in the Mediterranean.

ARTICLE 6.

By means of the above-mentioned payments and appropriations the Government is, from the year 1894, freed from all and every obligation respecting the expenses, whether ordinary or extraordinary, of the Quarantine Board.

It is, nevertheless, understood that the expenses hitherto borne by the Egyptian Government, shall continue to be borne by them.

ARTICLE 7.

From the financial year 1894, at the time of the settlement of the surplus with the "Caisse de la Dette Publique," the portion of that surplus accruing to the Government shall be increased by the payment of an annual sum of £.E.20,000.

ARTICLE 8.

It has been agreed between the Egyptian Government and the Governments of Germany, Belgium, Great Britain, and Italy, that the sum appropriated to the reduction of light dues, according to Article V of this Decree, shall be deducted from that of £40,000, as stipulated in the letters annexed to the Commercial Convention concluded by Egypt with the said Governments.

ARTICLE 9.

Our Minister of Finance is charged with the execution of this Decree.
