THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 9th February, 1895, from Her Majesty's Representative at Belgrade, reporting that in consequence of the appearance of cholera at Constantinople, the following regulations have been published in the Official Gazette of that date by the Servian Government. All travellers arriving in Servia from infected districts—from Constantinople in the present instance—and remaining in the country, are placed under medical supervision for a period of five days, including the day of arrival. They will be visited once a day at their residences by Medical Officers appointed for the purpose, but no restraint will be placed upon the freedom of their movements during that period. Travellers through Servia will be inspected at the stations of arrival, and any who may be found to be suffering from cholera or from its symptoms will be detained and placed in quarantine.
