**REGULATIONS  
TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING  
ROOMS.**

*By Her Majesty's Command,*

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

## PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The number of Presentations is limited to 200 at each Drawing Room.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at a Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at two o'clock.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 8th February, 1895, from Her Majesty's Representative at Constantinople, enclosing Turkish quarantine notices to the following effect:—

(a.) Pilgrim ships leaving Constantinople for the Hedjar will be subject to ten days' quarantine at Clazomene, with thorough disinfection both of pilgrims' clothes, and the ship, &c.

(b.) Vessels from the coast between Cavak and Callicratia, and Cavak and Touzla, bound for a port of the Sea of Marmora, the Straits, and the European Coast up to Salonica (inclusive), are subjected to five days' quarantine with disinfection at Touzla. Those bound for Turkish ports of the Black Sea between Cavak and Sinope will undergo this quarantine at Cavak, for ports beyond Sinope at Sinope. Those bound for Turkish ports beyond Tchanak Kale will proceed to Clazomene, Beyrouth, or Tripoli in Africa to undergo the same quarantine.

GENERAL RULES made pursuant to section 26 of the Companies (Winding-up) Act, 1890.

##### Time for holding First Meetings.

1. Rule 45 of the Companies Winding-up Rules, 1890 (providing that the First Meetings of creditors and contributories shall not be held until the Company's statement of affairs has been submitted) is hereby annulled.

##### Meetings of Creditors and Contributories.

2. Sub-section 2 of Rule 63 of the Companies Winding-up Rules, 1890, is hereby annulled, and instead thereof the following Rule, which may be cited as Rule 63 (2A), shall have effect:—

Upon the result of the meetings of creditors and contributories being reported to the Court, the Court may, if the meeting of creditors and the meeting of contributories have each passed the same resolutions, or if the resolutions passed at the two meetings are identical in effect, upon the application of the Official Receiver forthwith make the appointments necessary for giving effect to such resolutions. In any other case the Court shall, on application by the Official Receiver, fix a day for considering the resolutions and determinations of the meetings, deciding differences (if any), and making such appointments and orders as shall be necessary.

##### Commencement.

3. These Rules shall come into operation on the day of 1895, and shall apply to every winding-up of a company under an Order of the Court made on or after the same day.

##### Citation.

4. These Rules may be cited as the Companies Winding-up Rules, 1895.

#### PORT OF LONDON—TRANSHIPMENT No. 4.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Notwithstanding anything in the Foreign Animals Order of 1893 dated the twenty-seventh day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, animals brought from the Argentine Republic to the port of London may be transhipped in the River Thames or in any Dock in the port of London from the vessel in which they are brought to another vessel for conveyance to the Foreign Animals Wharf, known as the Foreign Cattle Market at Deptford, subject to the following conditions:

*First.* That the vessel (in this Order called the landing-vessel) into which the animals are transhipped be provided by the Local Authority for the City of London, and be specially fitted and appropriated for the purpose of conveying such animals.

*Second.* That the Local Authority for the City of London have received the special permission of the Commissioners of Customs so to employ the landing-vessel under this Order.

2. Those animals shall be transhipped in the presence and under the supervision and control of an Officer of Customs, and an Officer of Customs shall remain in charge of the animals on board the landing-vessel until its arrival at the Foreign Animals Wharf.

3. The landing-vessel shall proceed direct to that Wharf, and the animals shall be landed there in the presence and under the supervision and control of an Officer of Customs.

4. The landing-vessel shall not be used for any other purpose during the time of its being so appropriated.

5.—(1.) The landing-vessel shall immediately after each occasion of use, and before being again used, be cleansed and disinfected as follows:

(i.) All parts of the landing-vessel with which animals or their droppings have come in contact shall be scraped and swept: then

(ii.) The same parts of the landing-vessel shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water: then

(iii.) The same parts of the landing-vessel shall

have applied to them a coating of lime-wash: except that

(iv.) The application of lime-wash shall not be compulsory as regards such parts of the landing-vessel as are used for passengers or crew.

(2.) The scrapings and sweepings of the landing-vessel shall not be landed unless and until they have been well mixed with quicklime.

6. Animals so transhipped shall continue to be deemed foreign animals.

7. If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order, the owner or consignee of the animals, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the landing-vessel, and in the case of the animals being transhipped in a Dock the person owning the Dock, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or omissions, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

8. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in the Foreign Animals Order of 1893.

## No. 89.—CAPE, EAST INDIES, CHINA, AND AUSTRALIA STATIONS.

AFRICA—SOUTH COAST.

*Cape Agulhas—Reported Dangers near.*

A REPORT has been recently received that the steam-vessel "Mexican" struck, on the 2nd December, 1894, some obstruction off Cape Agulhas, with the lighthouse bearing N.E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  E. (N.  $53^{\circ}$  E.), distant about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles.

A former Notice to Mariners, No. 208 of 1892, stated that the steam-vessel "Alcostis" had then struck an obstruction off this cape, but that the particulars given were not sufficient to enable the position to be ascertained with any degree of exactness; it was however assumed to lie about  $2\frac{3}{4}$  miles W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N. (N.  $84^{\circ}$  W.) from Cape Agulhas.

Mariners should remember that not only off Cape Agulhas, but off all other parts of the south coast of Africa, and especially off salient points, sunken wrecks and uncharted dangers may exist close to the coast; and that it is not advisable to approach this surf-beaten shore, even in full-powered steam-vessels, within at least 2 or 3 miles. When a strong adverse current prevails the temptation is great, but west of Algoa Bay there is nothing to be gained by so doing, while a risk is run (in case of a breakdown in the machinery or any temporary error in the course) of total wreck before any efforts can be made to avoid such a catastrophe. Sailing vessels should keep 7 or 8 miles off shore as recommended in Africa Pilot, Part III, page 77.

On this coast the water breaks in heavy swells in 10 fathoms. If therefore a rock, with its top near enough the surface to bring up a ship, existed in this position in about that depth, it would, unless a most unusual pinnacle, undoubtedly break long before the whole area is a mass of breakers, which occurs in bad weather. The lighthouse keepers at Agulhas report no such occurrence, and it appears more probable that the obstruction is a wreck.

On the Admiralty Charts however "rock hereabouts" has been written at the spot where "Mexican" reports touching.

The above lights in line bearing N.  $30^{\circ}$  E. lead through the south-west channel into Port Maria.

Leeds Corporation Tramways.

(Limits of Stations for Generating Electric Power; Revival of Powers for Construction of Tramways.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that it is intended to empower the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the city of Leeds (in this Notice referred to as the Corporation) by the Bill now pending in Parliament under the above name or short title, to construct stations for generating electric power for the purpose of working their existing authorised and intended tramways on the lands and within the limits following (that is to say):—

In the case of electricity, such power is intended to be applied by means of the rails of the tramways and of conductors placed under, on, or above the surface of the streets, in connection with a generating station or generating stations, or to be carried with the carriages; in the case of steam such power is intended to be carried with the carriages, or applied by means of locomotives, or of cables, wires, or ropes placed under the surface of the streets and in connection with a stationary engine, or stationary engines, and in the case of pneumatic, gas and oil, or other mechanical power, the power is intended to be carried with the carriages or applied by means of locomotives.

To apply some or all of the provisions of the Leeds Tramways Order, 1871, the Leeds Tramways Act, 1872, the Leeds Tramways Act, 1877, the Leeds Tramways Act, 1881, and the Leeds Corporation Tramways Order, 1888, to the tramways and works proposed to be authorised and revived, and to alter, amend, extend, enlarge, or repeal some or all of the provisions of those Acts and Orders.
