W HEREAS by Treaty, grant, usage, suffer-ance, and other lawful means, Her Majesty the Queen has power and jurisdiction in and over Cyprus:

And whereas Her Majesty on the fifteenth day of July one thousand eight hundred and eightyone made an Order in Council entitled the Cyprus Extradition Order in Council 1881 and it

is expedient to amend the same.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act 1890, or otherwise, in Her Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as "The Cyprus Extradition Order in Council 1895," and shall be construed as one with the Cyprus Extradition Oider in Council 1881.

2. Section forty of the Cyprus Extradition Order in Council 1881 is hereby repealed.

3. In case of the extradition of any person to Cyprus by the Government of a foreign country or by the Ottoman Government he shall not be triable or punishable in Cyprus for an offence of a political character.

4. In the case of the extradition of any person to Cyprus by the Government of a foreign country he shall not be triable in Cyprus for any offence committed within British jurisdiction before his extradition, other than a scheduled offence provable by the facts on which the extradition is grounded, unless and until he has been restored to the country by whose Government he was given up, or has had, in the judgment of the High Commissioner, reasonable opportunity of returning thereto.

And the Most Honourable the Marquess of Ripon one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State is to give the necessary directions herein C. L. Peel. accordingly.

Now therefore Her Majesty by virtue and in exercise of the power by the aforesaid Act in Her Majesty vested is pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council to order and it is hereby ordered that the twentieth section of ""The Finance Act, 1894," shall apply to the Colony of Newfoundland. HEREAS by Part III of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is enacted that, where the legislature of any British Possession provides for the survey of, and grant of certificates for, passenger steamers, and the Board of Trade report to Her Majesty the Queen that they are satisfied that the certificates are to the like effect, and are granted after a like survey, and in such manner as to be equally efficient with the certificates granted for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under this Act, Her Majesty by Order in Council may :-

(1.) Declare that the certificates granted in the said British Possession shall be of the same force as if granted under this Act; and

(2.) Declare that all or any of the provisions of this part of this Act which relate to passenger steamers' certificates shall, either without modification or with such modifications as to Her Majesty may seem necessary, apply to the certificates granted in the said British Possession; and

(3.) Impose such conditions and make such regulations with respect to the certificates, and to the use, delivery, and cancellation thereof, as to Her Majesty may seem fit, and impose fines not exceeding fifty pounds for the breach of those conditions and regula-

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the Legislature of the British Possession of Victoria has provided for the survey of and grant of certificates for passenger steamers.

And whereas the Board of Trade have reported to Her Majesty that they are satisfied that such certificates are, as regards foreign-going passenger steamers, to the like effect, and are granted after a like survey, and in such manner as to be equally efficient with the certificates granted for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under the said Act.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Act, is hereby pleased to declare as follows, viz.:-

(1.) That the certificates granted under the said provision by the Legislature of the British Possession of Victoria for foreign-going passenger steamers shall be of the same force as if they had been granted for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894;

(2.) That all the provisions of the third part of the said Act which relate to passenger steamers' certificates shall, without modification, except as hereinafter mentioned, apply to the certificates for foreign-going passenger steamers granted in the said British Posses-

sion of Victoria;

(3.) That it shall not be lawful for a passenger steamer to which this Order relates to proceed to sea with passengers on board from any port or place in the United Kingdom, on any voyage other than to the said possession of Victoria, or to any intermediate place or

places situate on such voyage;

(4.) That if any such passenger steamer goes or attempts to go to sea from any port or place in the United Kingdom, with any passengers on board upon any other voyage than a voyage to the said possession of Victoria or any intermediate place or places as aforesaid, the owner and master thereofshall, for each such offence, incur a fine not exceeding fifty pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner, and such fine is herebyimposed accordingly.

And whereas the Board of Trade have reported to Her Majesty that they are satisfied that such: certificates are, as regards foreign going passenger steamers, to the like effect, and are granted after a like survey, and in such manner as to be equally: efficient with the certificates granted for the samepurpose in the United Kingdom under the said

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Act, is hereby pleased to declare as follows, viz.:

(1) That the certificates granted under the said provision by the Legislature of the British Possession of Queensland for foreign going passenger steamers shall be of the same forceas if they had been granted for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894.

(2) That all the provisions of the third part of the said Act which relate to passengersteamers' certificates shall, without modification, except as hereinafter mentioned, applyto the certificates for foreign going passenger steamers granted in the said British Posses-

sion of Queensland.

(3) That it shall not be lawful for a passenger: steamer to which this Order relates to proceed to sea with passengers on board from any port or place in the United Kingdom one. any voyage other than to the said Possession. of Queensland or to any intermediate places:

or places situate on such voyage.

(4) That if any such passenger steamer goes or attempts to go to sea from any port or places in the United Kingdom with any passengers: on board upon any other voyage than a voyage to: the said Possession of Queenslands. or any intermediate place or places as aforesaid the Owner and Master thereof shall for. each such offence incur a fine not exceeding: fifty pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner and such fine is hereby imposed accordingly.

N pursuance of the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Most Honourable Privy Council, to order as follows :-

1. The Northern and Salford Divisions (as defined by the Order in Council of the 4th day of May, 1864) of the County of Lancaster shall. for the purpose of the next Spring Assizes, be united together under the name of the Spring Assize County, No. 2.

2. The said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County shall be held at Manchester.

3. The Court at the said Spring Assizes at Manchester shall have jurisdiction to try any prisoner committed in the said Spring Assize County who may be brought before it, and shall have the same powers with respect to the trial of and passing sentence upon such prisoner as a Court of Over and Terminer and Gaol Delivery would have had at the Assizes in the county where, but for the said Spring Assizes Act, 1879, such prisoner would have been tried.

The provision of Section three of the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, shall apply to the execution of any capital sentence passed at such Assizes as herein mentioned; provided that the expression in the said section "the Sheriff of the county for which such Assizes were held" shall mean the Sheriff of the county in which the prisoner so sentenced would have been tried if the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, had not been passed.

4. The Sheriff of the County of Lancaster shall act for the purpose of the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County.

5. The precepts of the Judges to the said Sheriff shall direct him to summon the Grand Jurors and Petty Jurors from the County of Lancaster.

6. The Gaol Delivery precept of the Judges to the said Sheriff shall direct him to cause the prisoners from all the prisons in the said Spring Assize County who under the provisions of this Order will have to be tried at Manchester, to be brought there, and the Sheriff shall cause such prisoners to be brought accordingly without any Writ of Habeas Corpus.

7. All Justices of the Peace, Mayors, Coroners, Escheators, Stewards, Bailiffs, Gaolers, Constables, Officers, and persons having authority and being under an obligation to attend the Assizes for either Division comprised in the said Spring Assize County, or to certify, transmit, or deliver to the Court of Assize, or the proper officer thereof, any indictment, inquisition, recognizance, examination, deposition, or document, shall have the same authority, and be under the same obligation to attend at the said Spring Assizes held for the said Spring Assize County, and to certify, transmit, or deliver to the Court of Assize, or the proper officer thereof, such indictment, inquisition, recognizance, examination, deposition, or document.

8. In all indictments and presentments at the said Spring Assizes the venue laid in the margin thereof shall, in addition to the name of the county where the offence is charged to have been committed, contain the words "Spring Assize

County, No. 2."

9. Any person who after the date of this Order and before the said Spring Assizes, enters into a recognizance to appear and prosecute, or give evidence, or to appear and answer before a Court |

T the Court at Windsor, the 8th day of | of Oyer and Terminer or General Gaol Delivery. to be holden for either of the Divisions constituting the said Spring Assize County, shall be bound to attend at the said Spring Assizes for

the said Spring Assize County.

10. In all cases in which the like recognizances have been entered into in respect of any offence committed in either of the Divisions constituting the said Spring Assize County prior to the making of this Order, such recognizances shall be deemed to have been entered into for attendance at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County, and every person bound by such recognizance shall be bound to appear at such lastmentioned Spring Assizes or forfeit his recognizance.

11. Ten days before the day fixed for the opening of the Commission at Manchester, a list of the prisoners to be removed for trial at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County, so far as the same list can then be made out, shall, together with a short statement of the offences with which they are charged, be transmitted by the Gaoler of each prison in which such prisoners may be, to the Sheriff of the County of Lancaster, and the said Sheriff shall cause to be inserted in one or moré newspapers in the Spring Assize County the said list and statement, and a notice that the persons bound by recognizances to appear and prosecute or give evidence for or against the prisoners so removed shall appear and prosecute

and give evidence at Manchester.

12. It shall be lawful for the Gaoler of the Gaol in which prisoners who are to take their trial at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County shall be in custody, three days before the day upon which the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County are appointed to be held, to send, without any Writ of Habeas Corpus, such prisoners to Her Majesty's Gaol at Strangeways, Manchester, in the county of Lancaster, for the purposes of their trial, and to take all proper seps for their transmission to the said Gaol, and their maintenance by the way, and the Gaoler of the said Gaol shall receive such prisoners into his charge and custody on their arrival, and shall keep and maintain them in the said Gaol until they are either ordered to be discharged or remanded by proper authority, or until they shall have been tried and sentenced, and proper arrangements have been made for their being sent back to the prison from which they were sent for trial, or sent to any other prison which has been duly appointed as an alternative for such prison. If, however, the said Gaol has itself been duly appointed as an alternative prison for the prison from which such prisoners were sent to trial, the Governor of the said Gaol shall, subject to the orders of the Secretary of State, keep and maintain in the said Gaol such prisoners after sentence, until they are discharged in due course of law.

13. The Clerk of Assize at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County, shall have all powers of taxation of Bills of Costs, expenses of prosecution and witnesses, and all other powers necessary for checking and paying such costs relating to the trial of prisoners that the Clerk of Assize in the county where such prisoners were committed would have had if such prisoner had been tried at the Assizes held in such

last-mentioned county.

Where any person is committed for trial, or is bound by any recognizance to appear and answer, in the said Spring Assize County, any Judge of the High Court of Justice, or the committing Justice or Justices, or any two of the Justices of the county or place from which he is committed or admitted to bail, may, upon the application of such person, direct the Treasurer of the county or place where such person was committed, or entered into any recognizance to appear and answer as aforesaid, to advance to such person a sum not exceeding 201. to enable him to defray the travelling expenses of such of his witnesses as may have been bound bу recognizances to appear on his behalf, and the Treasurer shall advance such sum, and shall deduct it out of the amount ultimately allowed in respect of such witnesses.

14. In any case where money is ordered by the Court at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County to be paid in respect of costs and expenses of prosecutors and witnesses, the same shall be paid by the Treasurer of the county or place by whom the same would have been payable had a like order been made by a Court of Oyer and Terminer or Gaol Delivery in the county where the trial would have taken place but for the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, and this Order; and every such Treasurer, or some known agent on his behalf, shall attend the said Spring Assizes during the sitting of the

Court to pay all such orders.

15. Where the Court at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County remand a prisoner or adjourn any trial, or otherwise make an order respecting a prisoner committed for trial but not acquitted or convicted, the Court may make such order with respect to the removal of such prisoner to a prison in the county or place in which he was committed for trial as to the Court seems just, and the prisoner may be removed accordingly, without any Writ of Habeas Corpus.

16. Except where the context otherwise requires, terms used in this Order shall have the same meaning as that which the same terms have in the

Spring Assizes Act, 1879.

17. This Order, unless earlier revoked, shall be in force during the continuance of the Spring C. L. Peel. Assizes, 1895.

IN pursuance of the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Most Honourable Privy Council, to order as follows:

1. The North and East Riding Division and the West Riding Division (as defined by the Order in Council of the 9th day of July, 1864) of the County of York and the County of the City of York, shall, for the purpose of the next Spring Assizes, be united together under the name of the Spring Assize County, No. 3.

2. The said Spring Assizes for the said Spring

Assize County shall be held at Leeds.

3. The Court at the said Spring Assizes at Leeds shall have jurisdiction to try any prisoner committed in the said Spring Assize County who may be brought before it, and shall have the same powers with respect to the trial of and passing sentence upon such prisoner as a Court of Oyer and Terminer and Gaol Delivery would have had at the Assizes in the county where, but for the said Spring Assizes Act, such prisoner would have been tried.

The provision of Section three of the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, shall apply to the execution I

of any capital sentence passed at such Assizes as herein mentioned; provided that the expression in the said Section" the Sheriff of the County for which such Assizes were held" shall mean the Sheriff of the County in which the prisoner so sentenced would have been tried if the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, had not been passed.

4. The Sheriff of the County of York shall alone act for the purpose of the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County, and subject to the provisions of this Order shall have jurisdiction for that purpose over the whole district constituting the said Spring Assize County, and precepts and other documents relating to the said Spring Assizes shall be addressed to him

5. The Gaol Delivery precept of the Judges to the said Sheriff shall direct him to summon the Grand Jurors and Petty Jurors from the County of York; and the Jurors so summoned shall be deemed to be good and lawful men of the body of the several counties constituting the said Spring Assize County; and the Grand and Petty Jury formed out of those Jurors shall be deemed to be a Grand and Petty Jury respectively of the body of the said Counties respectively, and shall have jurisdiction accordingly.

6. The precepts of the Judges to the said Sheriff shall direct him to cause the prisoners from all the prisons in the said Spring Assize County who under the provisions of this Order will have to be tried at Leeds, to be brought there, and the Sheriff shall cause such prisoners to be brought accordingly without any writ of Habeas

Corpus.

7. In all matters not before specifically mentioned the precepts to the said Sheriff shall direct him to issue, and he shall issue the like notices, precepts, warrants, and documents, and perform the same acts (mutatis mutandis) as if he were Sheriff for the whole of the said Spring Assize County, and all Under Sheriffs, Bailiffs, Constables, and Officers in the said Spring Assize County shall obey accordingly.

8. The said Sheriff shall, as to all matters in relation to such Spring Assizes for which no specific provision is made by this Order, have the same power, jurisdiction, and responsibility as if he were Sheriff for the whole of the said Spring Assize County, except that this provision shall not authorize the said Sheriff to carry sentences into execution outside the county of York, or to levy outside the said County fines imposed or recognizances estreated at the said Spring Assizes.

9. All Justices of the Peace, Mayors, Coroners, Escheators, Stewards, Bailiffs, Gaolers, Constables, Officers, and persons having authority and being under an obligation to attend the Assizes for either of the Counties comprised in the said Spring Assize County, or to certify, transmit, or deliver to the Court of Assize or the proper officer thereof any indictment, inquisition, recognizance, examination, deposition, or document, shall have the same authority, and be under the same obligation to attend at the said Spring Assizes held for the said Spring Assize County, and to certify, transmit, or deliver to the Court of Assize or the proper officer thereof such indictment, inquisition, recognizance, examination, deposition, or docu-ment. This provision shall not apply to the Sheriff of the County of the City of York.

10. In all indictments and presentments at the said Spring Assizes, the venue laid in the margin thereof shall, in addition to the name of the county where the offence is charged to have been committed, contain the words "Spring Assize

County, No. 3."

11. Any person who after the date of this Order ! and before the said Spring Assizes, enters into a recognizance to appear and prosecute, or give evidence, or to appear and answer before a Court of Oyer and Terminer or General Gaol Delivery, to be holden for any of the Counties constituting the said Spring Assize County, shall be bound to attend at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County.

12. In all cases in which the like recognizances have been entered into in respect of any offence. committed in any of the Counties constituting the said Spring Assize County prior to the making of this Order, such recognizances shall be deemed to have been entered into for attendance at the said-Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County, and every person bound by such recognizance shall be bound to appear at such last-mentioned

Spring Assizes, or forfeit his recognizance.
13. Ten days before the day fixed for the opening of the Commission at Leeds, a list of the prisoners to be removed for trial at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County, so far as the same list can then be made out, shall, together with a short statement of the offences with which they are charged, be transmitted by the Gaoler of each prison in which such prisoners may be, to the Sheriff of the County of York, and the said Sheriff shall cause to be inserted in one or more newspapers in the Spring Assize County the said list and statement; and a notice that the persons bound by recognizances to appear and prosecute or give evidence for or against the prisoners so removed shall

appear and prosecute and give evidence at Leeds.

14. It shall be lawful for the Gaeler of the Gaol in which prisoners who are to take their trial at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County shall be in custody, three days before the day upon which the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County are appointed to be held, to send, without any Writ of Habeas Corpus, such prisoners to Her Majesty's Gaol at Leeds for the purposes of their trial, and to take all proper steps for their transmission to the said Gaol, and their maintenance by the way, and the Gaoler of the said Gaol shall receive such prisoners into his charge and custody on their arrival, and shall keep and maintain them in the said Gaol until they are either ordered to be discharged or remanded by proper authority, or until they shall have been tried and sentenced, and proper arrangements have been made for their being sent back to the prison from which they were sent for trial, or sent to any other prison which has been duly appointed as an alternative for such prison. If, however, the said Gaol has itself been duly appointed as an alternative prison for the prison from which such prisoners were sent to trial, the Governor of the said Gaol shall, subject to the orders of the Secretary of State, keep and maintain in the said Gaol such prisoners after sentence, until they are discharged in due course of law

15. The Clerk of Assize at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County shall have all powers of taxation of Bills of Costs, expenses of prosecution and witnesses; and all other powers necessary for checking and paying such costs relating to the trial of prisoners that the Clerk of Assize in the county where such prisoners were committed would have had if such prisoner had been tried at the Assizes; held in such last-mentioned county.

Where any person is committed for trial, or is bound by any recognizance to appear and answer, in the said Spring Assize County, any Judge of

the High Court of Justice, or the committing Justice or Justices, or any two of the Justices of the county or place from which he is committed or admitted to bail, may, upon the application of such person, direct the Treasurer of the county or place where such person was committed, or entered into any recognizance to appear and answer as aforesaid, to advance to such person a sum not exceeding 201., to enable him to defray the travelling expenses of such of his witnes es as may have been bound by recognizances to appear on his behalf, and the Treasurer shall advance such sum, and shall deduct it out of: the amount ultimately allowed in respect of such witnesses.

16. In any case where money is ordered by the Court at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County to be paid in respect of: costs and expenses of prosecutors and witnesses, the same shall be paid by the Treasurer of the county or place by whom the same would have been payable had a like order been made by a Court of Oyer and Terminer or Gaol Delivery in the county where the trial would have taken place but for the Spring Assizes Act, 1879, and this Order; and every such Treasurer, or some known agent on his behalf, shall attend the said Spring Assizes during the sitting of the Court to

pay all such orders.

17. Where the Court at the said Spring Assizes for the said Spring Assize County remand a prisoner or adjourn any trial, or otherwise make an order respecting a prisoner committed for trial but not acquitted or convicted, the Court may make such order with respect to the removal of such prisoner to a prison in the county or place in which he was committed for trial as to the Court seems just, and the prisoner may be removed accordingly-without any Writ of Habeas Corpus.

18. Except where the context otherwise 1equires, terms used in this Order shall have the same meaning as that which the same terms have in the Spring Assizes Act, 1879.

19. This Order, unless earlier revoked, shall be in force during the continuance of the Spring C. L. Peel. Assizes, 1895.

And whereas by the said Order in Council it was provided that in certain circumstances Lower

Grade Clerks in the service of the said Commissioners should be eligible for promotion to Clerk-

And whereas by the Schedule attached to such Order in Council it was provided that the increments of salary payable to such Lower Grade Clerks should be £15 every three years:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Order in Council should be amended as hereinafter set forth, and it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that, in pursuance of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," the Board of Trade have consented to the amendments hereinafter epo ified :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the power vested in Her by "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct and hereby directs as follows, that is to

Subject to the other conditions specified in 'the said Order in Council of the twenty-eighth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, Lower Grade Clerks in the service of the Commissioners of Irish Lights shall be eligible for promotion to Clerkships after eight years aggregate service instead of ten years as therein specified: and as from the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, the increments of salary payable to Lower Grade Clerks in the service of the said Commissioners shall, in lieu of the increments specified in the schedule attached to the said Order in Council, be as follows, viz.: £5 per annum until the salary reaches £100 per annum and £7 10s. per annum thereafter until the maximum salary of £200 per annum has been reached: and Lower Grade Clerks appointed before the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, shall receive as from that date an increment of salary equal to the proportion of their triennial increment of £15 (omitting any fraction of a pound sterling) which may have accrued up to that date, and the subsequent increments shall successively accrue on the 1st day of April of each year.

And Her Majesty, by virtue and in further exercise of the power so vested in Her as aforesaid, and by and with the advice aforesaid, is further pleased to fix and doth hereby fix that the salaries which under the provisions of the present Order in Council are for the time being payable to the said Officers of the Establishment of the Commissioners of Irish Lights shall be paid out of the Mercantile Marine Fund.

HEREAS by section twenty-six of "The Pluralities Act 1838," after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, "chapelries, and other places or districts may "be separated from the parishes or mother " churches to which they belong, with great advan-"tage, and places altogether extra-parochial may " in some instances with advantage be annexed to " parishes or districts to which they are con-"tiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for "ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with respect to his 4 own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop " of the Province, or when the Bishop of any "diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop "that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or |

"district within the diocese of such Archbishop, "or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may " be, may be advantageously separated from any " parish or mother church, and either be consti-"tuted a separate benefice by itself or be united "to any other parish to which it may be more " conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining "tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial so as to form a "separate parish or benefice, or that any extraparochial place may with advantage be annexed "to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be "constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical "purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop "shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said "Archbishop for his consideration), describing the " mode in which it appears to him that the altera-"tion may best be effected, and how the changes "consequent on such alteration in respect "ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, " rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical ducs, rates, "and payments, and in respect to patronage and "rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons " of the benefice or benefices to be affected by "such alteration shall consent in writing under "his or their hands to such scheme, or to such " modification thereof as the said Archbishop may "approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full " consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any "such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall " certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, "by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it " shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to " make an Order for carrying such scheme, or "modification thereof, as the case may be, into " effect."

And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Edward White Lord Archbishop of Canterbury hath pursuant to the enactment aforesaid made a report dated the thirty-first day of January one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five to Her Majesty in Council in the words and figures following that is to say:

"That the Right Reverend John James Stewart Lord Bishop of Worcester has represented unto us (amongst other things)

"That in the north-eastern part of the parish of Claines in the county and diocese of Worcester are certain districts or places known as Fernhill Heath and Spellis and also a detached portion of the said parish known as Smite Hill all which said districts or places adjoin the parishes of Hindlip and Martin Hussingtree in the same county and diocese.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that under the provisions of the Pluralities Act 1838, the said districts or places may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Claines and certain portions thereof being thepplaces known as Fernhill Heath and Smite Hill annexed to the said parish of Hindlip and a certain other portion thereof being the district known as Spellis to the said parish of Martin Hussingtree for ecclesias-

tical purposes only.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said Pluralities Act 1838, the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may be best effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the said Bishop.uss patron of the perpetual curacy or viearage of Claines, of the Right Honourable Samuel Charles

Baron Hindlip the patron of the rectory of Hindlip of the Very Reverend Robert William Forrest D.D. Dean of the Cathedral Church of Christ and the Blessed Mary the Virgin of Worcester and the Chapter of the same church the patrons of the rectory of Martin Hussingtree and of the Reverend Alfred Stephenson Porter M.A. Vicar of Claines, Frederick William Wallis M.A. Rector of Hindlip and John Webster M.A. Rector of Martin Hussingtree has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to

are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act 1838, certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect."

And whereas the scheme and consents referred to in the said Archbishop's report are in the words following:—

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate the districts or portions of land hereinafter described the acreage of which is inconsiderable being part of the parish of Claimes in the county and diocese of Worcester from the said parish and to annex them to the parish of Hindlip in the same county and diocese for ecclesia-tical purposes.

"That the Rector of Hindlip shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the said portions of land the population whereof is two

hundred and ninety-two or thereabouts.

"That all ecclesiastical offices shall be performed for the inhabitants of the said portions of land in the church of the said parish of Hindlip and that the fees for all such offices shall belong to the rector of the said parish of Hindlip.

"That the annual stipend or yearly sum of twenty-six pounds payable to the curate or vicar for the time being of the perpetual curacy or vicarage of Claines and charged upon part and parcel of the estate called Spellis aforesaid now the property of the Right Honourable Lord Hindlip, which it is proposed to annex to the parish of Hindlip be reserved and continue to be due and payable as heretofore to the vicar of Claines for the time being.

"The districts or portions of land thus proposed to be transferred from the parish of Claines to the parish of Hindlip are as follows:—

"All those parts of the parish of Claines de-lineated and described in the accompanying plan and thereon coloured green and marked B and C The boundary line of the part respectively. marked B commences at the south-eastern corner of Sandyway-lane, proceeds in a southerly direction along the western boundary of the present parish of Claines to Spellis Brook, thence turns in a western and north-western direction round Spellis Fields to the eastern side of the Great Western Railway, thence northerly along the said railway to the main road but taking in and including three cottages and a small piece of land lying in the corner between the railway and the main road leading from Worcester to Droitwich and thence proceeds along the said main road in a north-easterly direction to Sandyway-lane corner aforesaid. The part marked C is known as Upper Smite Farm and Smite Hill and is bounded by the parishes of Hindlip, Warndon, and Martin Hussingtree.

"It is also proposed to separate the district or

portion of land (the acreage of which is inconsiderable) hereinafter described being part of the parish of Claines aforesaid from the said parish and to annex it to the parish of Martin Hussingtree in the same county and diocese for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That the Rector of Martin Hussingtree shall have exclusive core of souls within the limits of the said last-mentioned portion of land the population whereof is two hundred and sixty or

thereabouts.

"That all reclesiastical offices shall be performed for the inhabitants of the said lastmentioned portion of land in the church of the said parish of Martin Hussingtree and that the fees for all such offices shall belong to the rector of the said parish of Martin Hussingtree.

"The district or portion of land thus proposed to be transferred from the parish of Claines to the parish of Martin Hussingtree is as follows:

"All that part of the parish of Claines delineated and described in the accompanying plan and thereon coloured pink and marked A the boundary line whereof commences at a point in the main road leading from Worcester to Droitwich and on the north side thereof to the cast of the third milestone from Worcester, extends in a direct line in a northerly direction across certain closes or pieces of land to the road leading from the Great Western Railway Station to Lower Town thence along that road and proceeds in an easterly direction along the northern boundary of the land owned by the Worcestershire Hunt and occupied as the Kennels, to Martin Brook following the course of Martin Brook in a southerly and southeasterly direction to Sandyway-lane and thence proceeds in a south-westerly direction along the east side of the main road to the third milestone aforesaid.

"CONSENTS.

Dean of the Cathedral Church of Christ and the Blessed Mary the Virgin of Worcester and the Chapter of the same church the patrons or persons entitled to present to the rectory of Martin Hussingtree in case the same were now vacant and we Alfred Stephenson Porter, M.A. Vicar of Claines, Frederick William Wallis, M.A. Rector of Hindlip, and John Webster, M.A. Rector of Martin Hussingtree do hereby signify our consents to the scheme above proposed.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, and of the Act of the fifth year of Her Majesty (Session 2) chapter twenty-six duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the twenty-first day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and nincty-five, in the words and figures following that is to say;

that is to say;

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years, of His late Majesty King William the Fourth chapter seventy-seven, and of the Act of the fifth year of Your Majesty (Session 2) chapter twenty-six have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing certain additions and improvements at the episcopal residence belonging to the See of Carlisle which is situate in the county of Cumberland and is known as Rose Castle.

"Whereas the Right Reverend John Wareing now Bishop of the diocese of Carlisle is desirous that certain additions and improvements should be made at the said episcopal residence known as Rose Castle and has submitted to us the particulars of such improvements and we have signified

our general approval of the same.

"And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid additions and improvements a sum of two hundred and thirty pounds (being a sum which does not exceed two years' income of the See) should be provided by borrowing the same by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter

belong to the Bishoprick of Carlisle.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said John Wareing Bishop of the said Diocese of Carlisle (testified by his having affixed his signature and episcopal seal to this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that the said bishop be authorized to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above-mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding two hundred and thirty pounds and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tene-ments and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See, to the said Governors by deed for the term of fifteen years or until the said sum of two hundred and thirty pounds with the interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof, shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in manner following that is to say during and in respect of the first period of twelve months of the said term computed from the day of the date of the mortgage no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of twelve months so computed, and at the end of every such like period of twelve months thereafter pay to the said Governors their No. 26606. В

principal sum of two hundred and thirty pounds until the whole thereof shall be repaid and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of twelve months computed as aforesaid pay interest at the rate of four pounds per centum per annum on the said principal sum, or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid. And that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of forty days after the same shall have become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same. and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale, in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors, from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale. And that such mortgage deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us the the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and shall bind as well the said John Wareing now Bishop of the said diocese of Carlisle as every succeeding Bishop of the same diocese until the principal money and interest costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said sum of two hundred and thirty pounds shall be paid to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and that the receipt of our joint treasurers for the time being endorsed on the said mortgage deed shall be a good and sufficient discharge of the Governors and their successors for the same, who shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof and that upon the receipt of the said sum of two hundred and thirty pounds the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such time or times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards defraying the cost of the aforesaid additions and improvements at the Episcopal

residence aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the herein named Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Carlisle.

Burnley has become a new parish of the character contemplated by the Act of the sixth and seventh years, of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the sixteenth day of May in the year one thousandeight, hundred and seventy one and published in: the London Gazette upon the same day the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint James Burnley were again, altered.

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the fifth day of July in the year one thousand. eight hundred and eighty-nine and published in the London Gazette on the ninth day of the same month the boundaries, of the said new parish of Saint James Burnley were further altered.

"And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.
