THE following Statute made by the University of Cambridge has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877:—

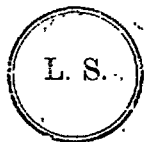
STATUTE to alter the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877" in relation to the University of Cambridge and now submitted to Her Majesty the Queen in Council.

We the Chancellor Masters and Scholars of the University of Cambridge in pursuance and in exercise of the powers given to us by the 53rd section of the said Act do hereby alter the Statutes framed by the said Commissioners in relation to our said University in manner following:—

By substituting in "Statute A Chapter VI Sermons and Commemorations" for the first paragraph of "Section 1—Sermons" the following paragraph to form an amended first paragraph of Section 1 of such Chapter:—

Sermons shall be preached in the University Church every Sunday during Term, also on Christmas Day, Good Friday, Easter Day and Ascension Day and on such other days as may be appointed by the Chancellor or by Grace of the Senate.
