WHEREAS by section 2 of the "Wild Birds Protection Act, 1894," power was given to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State upon application by the County Council of any administrative County by Order to prohibit the taking or destroying of Wild Birds' eggs in any year or years in any place or places within that

County. And whereas the County Council of the East Riding of Yorkshire have applied to me requesting that an Order may be made to prohibit the taking or destroying of Wild Birds' eggs on the promontory of Spurn, including Kilnsea Warren south of the line taken by the road leading from the village of Kilnsea towards the site of the old village of Kilnsea, for a period of five years from

the 31st of March, 1895.

Now therefore, I, the Right Honourable Herbert Henry Asquith, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the said Act, and on such application as aforesaid, hereby order as follows :-

That the taking or destroying of Wild Birds' eggs on the promontory of Spurn, including Kilnsea Warren south of the line taken by the road leading from the village of Kilnsea towards the site of the old village of Kilnsea, shall be prohibited for a period of five years from the 31st March, 1895.
