Madrid, April 18. He Marquis de Leganez began his Journey this week for Alicant, from whence he will puls by Sea to Genoua, in order to take polletion of the Government of Milan. There are very preffing Orders fent to Cadiz, to haften out the Men of War that are fitting there. The new Great Matter of Males has appointed Don Alongs de Caf-

man to refide as his Ambaffador at this Court. Milan, April 25. Our Governor-General the Count de Fuenfallela is returned from Alexandria, where he took a review of the Troops that are ordered to march to Piedmone. Don Gafpir Minnques de Lara, our new Maistre de Camp-General, puted from hence this week for Turin, to confer with the Duke of Savoy about the march of the Spanish Forces designed for his Royal Highness's Service, which he is to command this Campagne. Our Governor has fent 1000 Foot and 200 Horse to reinforce the Garifon of Final. The Marquis d' O-bigg, the Emperor's Envoy to the Princes of Italy, is arrived at Genoua, where he is to have his first publick Audience on the 27th of this month.

Venice, May 4. Several new raited Troops are arrived this week at the Lido; from whence they will be transported with the next Convoy to the Levant. The last Letters from Rome gave an account, that the Ecclefiastical Galleys are fitting out with great diligence for the affiftance of this State. In the Conclave, the Cardinals in the French Interests finding they cannot prevail for one of their own Faction, do all they can to embroil Thing, and to re-

tard the Election of a Pope.

Lightne, May 1. The English and Dutch Squadron, confilling or 15 Men of War, commanded by Captain Aylmer, with the Turker and other Merchant Ships under their Convoy, fetsfail from Caglian in Sardinia on the 26th past for Cadiz. The Reserve, is gone for Tunes and Tripoli, and the Sinallow will fail from hence to morrow with the Merchant Ships that are here, in order to rejoyn the faid Convoy. Captain Arliner was a days before Argiers, where the new English Consul, Mr. Baker, was very kindly received by the Dey 'Fis said, that Governtient inclines to a Peace with the Dutch, and to

break with the French.

Warfam, April 20. The Count de Thun, Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor, has frequent Conferences with the Ministers of this Crown about dispoing Matters for the approaching Campagne, which are in fuch forwardness, that we are affured the whole damy will be in the Field by the beginning of June; The King is still resolved to command it in Person; and tis the general opinion, He will march directly into Modavia to fecure that Province; and that if there be occasion, he will at the same time fend a tirong Detachement to joyn the Imperial Forces in Translatinis. The last advices from Moscowy confirm our former accounts of the little Success which the Turkith and French Miniflers, who were not long fice feet privately thisher to follicite . Peace between he M. dovites and the Tartars, have had in their

rations that are miking by the Czurs for the profecution of the War, which the Partars feem fo fend fible of, that they are drawing their Forces that way for the defence of their Country.

Vienna, Mar 6. Great quantities of Provisions and Ammunition are brought daily hither from the Hereditary Countries, in order to be transported to Hungary for the tile of the Imperial Army. Prince Louis of Baden is expected here the Beginning of the next week, part of his Biggage being afready arrived. Count Gaids of St. ormberg is gone to command a flying Camp on the Draw; and the Duke de Croy is appointed to command the Forces that are drawing together in Croatia. The main Army is to Rendezvous towards the end of this month near Badr.

Berlin, May 8: On the 29th past was Celebrated here the Marriage between the Duke of Courland and the Princels Eizaberh of Brandenburg; with great Solemnity. On the first instant the Elector fet out for Grossen, where on the 3d he took a review of his Troops that are going for Hungary; They are one third Detachements out of the old Regiments, and filled up with new Levies, and together make a very compleat Body of 1034 Horfe, 409 Dragouns, and 4809 Foor, in all 6252 Man; They are commanded by Lieute-nant-General Brifus and Major-General Brance, and were to march forward on the 4th, and to be delivered to the Emperor's Commissioner the Count de Shafenteh at Geunberg on the Prontiers of Steffa. Their Elexoral Highnoffes of Brandeneury are gone to Carelsharls in B. Somes.

On Thursday the last of April Captain Clayton went with a Party of men to relieve the Garifon of Balim.1300ly 5 Captain Hernycroft then commanded there, who was the same day to march his Men to Cork, but understanding that the Irish Garison of Ballyclough had a defign to intercept them, he would not murch by day, but flayed till night, however this was not to privately carried; but that the Irish had notice of it, and thereupon detached 120 of their best Horse, and 120 Dragoom, with 250 Voluntiers and Rapperies commanded by Beigadier Carroll, Sir James Carter, the Lord of Kinfale, Colonel Lafer, Major Slingsby, Captain Copinger, and Captain Comdon, who fell on our Party just on the other fide of Six-mile Water, about 3 of the clock in the morning; upon their approach our men faced, and about 20 fired, which broke their Front, and put them into some disorder, and gave opportimity to ours to retreat to a final Pound made of Mud, claying up a Truckle to the Door where they entied; Immediately the Enemy came up and offecompts and Memorandums with the Wast-Peper theres. Who received them so warmly, that they killed serveral of them. The Enemy made a second and third attack, but went off with the same Success; This continued several hours, till the news of it being corried to Cork, a Party was sent from thence to their Relies, but the Enemy were all fled before they came, leaving-dead on the spot Captain Copinger and Captain Condon, with 14 So kliers, and Major and shyd, spot a ely wounded; Colonel Laser and the Lord of Kinstelle were likewise dargerously wounded.
