In the Matter of the Triumph Cycle Company Limited.

AT an Extraordinary General Meeting of the above named Company duly convened and held at the registered office of the Company Earl's-court Much Park-street Coventry on Friday the 19th day of April 1895 the following Resolutions were duly passed and at a subsequent Extraordinary General Meeting of the Members of the said Company also duly convened and held at the same place on the 7th day of May 1895 the following Resolutions were duly confirmed viz. :—

1. "That the whole of the business, undertaking property and assets of this Company be sold and transferred as a going concern to a new Company to be formed with the same name as this Company upon the terms contained in a conditional Agreement dated the 9th day of April 1895 and made between George Sawyer, Albert S. Tomson, Ph. Schloss, M. J. Schulte, and S. Bettmann the present Directors of this Company of the one part

and William Charles Taylor for and on behalf of the said new Company of the other part and that the said Agreement be and the same is hereby approved and adopted.

2. "That for the purpose of enabling the formation of a new Company with the same name as this Company and of carrying the said sale and transfer into effect and of enabling the assets of this Company to be distributed and this Company wound up after the completion of such sale and transfer this Company be wound up voluntarily under the Companies Acts 1862 to 1890.

3. "That Mr. William Hutton (of the firm of Charles Baker and Co.) Chartered Accountant of No. 39 Bennett's-hill Birmingham be and he is hereby appointed Liquidator for the purposes of such winding up.

4. "That the said Liquidator be and he is hereby authorized to consent to the registration of a new Company to be named the Triumph Cycle Company Limited.
