ARTICLE IV.—Nothing in this Order shall affect or interfere with the duties and powers of the said Charles Luxmoore Hockin as regards any proceedings in relation to any Audit which may have been already commenced or which may have been held by him as District Auditor for the said Audit District.

ARTICLE V.—In this Order the term "Overseers of the Poor" includes Churchwardens and Assistant Overseers.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby revoke their Order bearing date the twenty-seventh day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety approving of a part of the Port of Hull as a landing-place for foreign animals not subject to slaughter or quarantine: Provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order before the date of this revocation, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order before the date of this revocation.

(PORT OF HULL—LANDING-PLACE FOR FOREIGN ANIMALS.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby approve of and define the following part of the Port of Hull as a landing-place for foreign animals not subject to slaughter or quarantine:

All that space on the South Quay of the Albert Dock in the borough of Kingston-upon-Hull bounded by a line commencing at the southern face of the Quay abutting on the River Humber at a point sixteen hundred and seventy-four feet or thereabouts west from the entrance to the Albert Dock, thence running at a right angle in a northerly direction along a gate for thirteen feet six inches or thereabouts, thence at a right angle easterly along the south side of the slaughter-house for forty feet or thereabouts, thence at a right angle in a northerly direction along the eastern end of the slaughter-house for sixteen feet or thereabouts, thence at a right angle westerly along the north side of the slaughter-house and along the gate for fifty feet or thereabouts, thence at a right angle northerly along the eastern end of lair No. 1 for nine feet or thereabouts, thence at a right angle westerly along the north side of the said lair for two hundred and five feet or thereabouts, thence at a right angle northerly to the face of the Albert Dock coping for one hundred and one feet or thereabouts, thence at a right angle westerly along the coping for forty feet or thereabouts, thence at a right angle southerly for ninety-one feet or thereabouts, thence at a right angle westerly along the north side of lair No. 2 along a gate and along the north side of lair No. 3 for two hundred and twenty-one feet or thereabouts, thence at a right angle northerly to the face of the Albert Dock coping for ninety-one feet or thereabouts, thence at a right angle westerly along the coping for twenty feet or thereabouts, thence at a right angle southerly for thirty-two feet or thereabouts, thence at an angle in a south-easterly direction for sixty feet or thereabouts, thence at an angle in a southerly direction along the east end of the Dock Company's No. 22 warehouse and along a gate for forty-nine feet or thereabouts to the southern face of the Quay abutting on the river Humber, thence at a right angle in an easterly direction along the southern face of the said Quay for four hundred and eighty-four feet to the point first mentioned, all which space is coloured pink on the plan of part of the Albert Dock deposited for the purposes of an Order of the twenty-seventh day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety at the office of the Board of Agriculture, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the borough of Kingston-upon-Hull.
