And We do further ordain that you, or any five or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time, if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is, that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us, under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any five or more of you, your opinion on the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

And for the purpose of aiding you in your inquiries, We hereby appoint Our trusty and well-beloved Richmond Thackeray Willoughby Ritchie, Esquire, to be Secretary to this Our Commission.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a copy of a Quarantine Notice, dated 18th May, 1895, issued by the Governor of Malta. The following is an extract therefrom:—

Government Notice. No. 114.

6. The importation of cattle from the Black Sea, Sea of Azov, Syria including Alexandretta, Albania, Roumelia, Thessaly, and Salonica, not otherwise prohibited, may be permitted subject to the undermentioned conditions; provided that in the opinion of the Chief Government Medical Officer such cattle are not affected with disease so that they may be admitted in the lazaretto without detriment to cattle already in the Island.

(a.) Such cattle shall only be admitted to the enclosures which may be assigned or approved for that purpose at the lazaretto, and they shall be subjected to isolation and observation for three

months.

(b.) Application must be made for leave to import, and permission is to be obtained in writing from Government in each case before shipment, stating the approximate number of animals intended to be shipped. No cattle shall be allowed to be landed unless the consignee has obtained such leave from Government and agreed to abide by any regulations which may be established.

(c.) The application referred to in the preceding article shall imply that the applicant has consented to pay the usual fees for entrance into the lazaretto and for guards and extraordinary expenses on each head of cattle, besides 2s. 6d. on each head of cattle per month or part thereof in cases in which it is found necessary to keep cattle in the lazaretto for a longer period than fifteen days.

(d.) That such cattle, if slaughtered at the lazaretto, will be subject to the regulations which may from time to time be made by the Port

Authorities.

(e.) The owners of cattle in the lazaretto shall be subjected to such regulations as to slaughtering of cattle, disposal of offal, blood, &c., as may from time to time be made by the Port Authorities.

The importation, however, of horses, mules, and asses from Odessa is prohibited.

EXCHEQUER BILLS.

WHEREAS by Section 13 of "The Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment

Act, 1876," it is enacted as follows: —

"The Local Government Board may, when
"they see fit, by their Order change the
"name of any Union, and direct how such
"change of name shall be published; no
"such change of name shall affect any rights

"to, the said Union, or render defective any "legal proceedings instituted by or against "the said Union; and any legal proceedings "may be continued or commenced by or against the said Union by their new name

"or obligations of, or securities given by or

"which might have been continued or com-"menced by or against the Union by their "former name."

And whereas by an Order dated the 28th

day of September, 1835, the Poor Law Commissioners declared that the several Parishes and Places specified in the margin thereof should be united for the administration of the laws for the relief of the Poor, and the Union so constituted has since been known by the name of the Alderbury Union;

And whereas by certain Orders issued by the Poor Law Board and by Us, the Local Government Board, the Parishes of Earldoms, Langley Wood, No Man's Land, Old Sarum, Saint Edmund, Saint Martin, Saint Thomas, and West Dean have been added to the said Alderbury

And whereas by the County of Wilts (Stratford-sub-Castle, Downton, &c.) Confirmation
Order, 1894, the said Parish of Old Sarum was
amalgamated with the said Parish of Stratfordsub-Castle, and the said Parish of Langley Wood
was amalgamated with the Parish of Downton:

And whereas it is expedient that the name of the said Union should be changed as hereinafter

mentioned:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We

hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—From and after the twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, the name of the said Union shall be changed to the Salisbury Union, and the Guardians of the Poor thereof shall be described as the Guardians of the Poor of the Salisbury Union.

ARTICLE II.—The said Guardians shall cause this Order to be published for two successive weeks within one month from the date hereof in some newspaper circulating within the Union.
