Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereor, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

## PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office,

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly written on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

3. The landing-vessel shall proceed direct to the Foreign Animals Wharf, and the animals shall be landed there in the presence and under the supervision and control of an Officer of Customs.

4. 'The landing-vessel shall not be used for any other purpose during the time of its being so appropriated.

5.-(1.) The landing-vessel shall immediately

after each occasion of use, and before being again used, be cleansed and disinfected as follows :

- (i.) All parts of the landing-vessel with which animals or their droppings have come in contact shall be scraped and swept: then
- (ii.) The same parts of the landing-vessel shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water: then
- (iii.) The same parts of the landing-vessel shall have applied to them a coating of lime-wash.

(2.) The scrapings and sweepings of the landing-vessel shall not be landed unless and until they have been well mixed with quicklime.

6. Animals transhipped under this Order shall continue to be deemed foreign animals.

7. If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order, the owner or consignee of the animals, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the landing-vessel, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or omissions, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
