REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE, BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY.

By Her Mojesty's Command,

Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose

can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office. Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially

should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly written on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that · there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

HER Majesty the Queen has been graciously pleased to confer the Decoration of the Albert Medal of the Second Class on-

Sub-Lieutenant CHARLES WOOD ROBINSON, R.N.R., Third Officer of the R.M.S. "Teutonic," of Liverpool.

The following is an account of the services in respect of which the decoration has been conferred :-

While the "Teutonic" was steaming at the rate of about 21 knots an hour in St. George's Channel on the 17th April, 1895, at 6.30 A.M., when few people were about the deck, Mr. ROBINSON noticed a Passenger climbing on to the rail of the ship with the evident intention of jumping overboard. He made an ineffectual

attempt to prevent him and then without divesting himself of any of his clothing immediately dived after the man from a height of 25 feet above the water, and only about 30 feet forward of the propellers of the vessel.

Mr. ROBINSON reached the man and did his nimost to rescue him, but his efforts were met with violent resistance, and in the end the man succeeded in drowning himself.

Mr. ROBINSON ran great risk of being drawn under the propellers, and when picked up was in a very exhausted condition.


