

rald Commander, of 8 Guns and 70 Men, who had lately appeared about *Waterford*. They came from *Limerick* on the 10th, and say, that 3 French Men of War, and the Merchant Ships with Provisions, Clothes and Ammunition, were come into that River, and that the French Squadron that conveyed them was returned home.

Dublin, May 21. Great Stores of Ammunition and Provisions have been lately sent from hence under good Convoys towards *Mullingar* and *Belturbur*. On the 14th the Prince of *Wurtemberg*, General of the Danish Forces, returned towards *Manister*. General *Gonke* is come back from *Mullingar*, whether he went to view that Garrison, and intends to take the Field the next week, the Troops being in the mean time marching from their several Quarters to the places appointed for their Rendezvous. Several Deserters continue to come in daily, and among others one *O. N. a* Major in the Rebels Army, came on the 9th instant to *Mullingar*. *Mark Bigger*, the Spy, who was taken in Womens Clothes, and sentenced to dye by a Court Martial, was hanged here yesterday.

The Lords Justices and Council of this Kingdom have put out a Proclamation, dated the 14th of this instant *May*, which sets forth: *That to prevent the Robberies, wilful burning of Buildings, Corn and Hay, Murders and Insurrections, with which those Parts of this Kingdom now under Their Majesties Obedience are threatened by the Rebels, and their Adherents, during such time as Their Majesties Army shall be upon their march to the Frontiers, or in the Quarters now possessed by the Rebels, They have thought it necessary, and do thereby Publish and Declare, That the Popish Irish Inhabitants of the respective Baronies at present under Their Majesties Obedience, where any Rebels, commonly called Rapperies, shall commit any such Robberies, Burnings or Murders, or where any such Insurrection shall happen, if they do not immediately give notice of such Rapperies and Insurrections respectively to the Justice of the Peace, or Chief Officer of the Militia next to their respective Habitations, and assist them in the Taking or Destroying of such Rapperies, and Suppression of such Insurrection, that then the said Popish Irish Inhabitants of the said Barony where such Fact shall be committed, so neglecting their Duties, shall be deemed Confederates with the said Rebels and Enemies to Their Majesties Government, and by Order to be given by the Lords Justices as occasion shall require, shall be proceeded against with the utmost Severity of Military Execution; And They do farther Order, That no Protected Irish Papists shall be abroad out of his or their Dwelling-houses, or Place of Abode, after the hours of Nine at night, or before the hours of Four in the morning, under the pain and penalty of being put out of Their Majesties Protection. And if after the 30th day of this instant month of May any Arms or Ammunition shall be found upon the Person, or in the possession of any such Irish Papists, he and they shall be looked upon as Rebels, and Punished accordingly. And as They intend severely to Punish all such as shall offend in any of the Particulars above-mentioned, so They do assure all these Irish Papists who live under Their Majesties Protection, That they, behaving themselves as becoming good Subjects, shall have the Benefit thereof.*
