*For Dissolving the present Parliament, and  
declaring the calling of another.*

**W**HEREAS We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to dissolve this present Parliament which stands prorogued to Wednesday, the twenty-fourth day of July instant: We do, for that end, publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby dissolve the said Parliament accordingly; and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for shires and burghs, of the House of Commons, are discharged from their meeting and attendance on the said Wednesday, the twenty-fourth day of July instant: And We, being desirous and resolved, as soon as may be, to meet Our people, and to have their advice in Parliament, do hereby make known to all Our loving subjects Our Royal Will and Pleasure to call a new Parliament; and do hereby further declare, that, with the advice of Our Privy Council, We have given order that Our Chancellor of that part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain and Our Chancellor of Ireland do respectively, upon notice thereof, forthwith issue out writs, in due form and according to law, for calling a new Parliament. And We do hereby also, by this Our Royal Proclamation under Our Great Seal of Our United Kingdom, require writs forthwith to be issued accordingly by Our said Chancellors respectively, for causing the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons who are to serve in the said Parliament to be duly returned to, and give their attendance in, Our said Parliament on the twelfth day of August next, which writs are to be returnable in due course of law.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, this eighth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, and in the fifty-ninth year of Our Reign.

A PROCLAMATION,  
*In order to the Electing and Summoning the  
Sixteen Peers of Scotland.*  
VICTORIA, R.

**W**HEREAS We have in Our Council thought fit to declare Our pleasure for summoning and holding a Parliament of Our

United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, on Monday, the twelfth day of August next ensuing the date hereof; in order, therefore, to the electing and summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland who are to sit in the House of Peers in the said Parliament, We do, by the advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet at Holyrood House, in Edinburgh, on Wednesday, the twenty-fourth day of July instant, between the hours of twelve and two in the afternoon, to nominate and choose the Sixteen Peers to sit and vote in the House of Peers in the said ensuing Parliament by open election and plurality of voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the proxies of such as shall be absent (such proxies being Peers, and producing a mandate in writing duly signed before witnesses, and both the constituent and proxy being qualified according to law); and the Lord Clerk Register, or the two Principal Clerks of the Session appointed by him to officiate in his name, are hereby respectively required to attend such meeting, and to administer the oaths required by law to be taken there by the said Peers, and to take their votes, and immediately after such election made and duly examined to certify the names of the Sixteen Peers so elected, and to sign and attest the same in the presence of the said Peers the Electors, and return such certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain. And We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly command and require the Provost of Edinburgh, and all other the Magistrates of the said city, to take especial care to preserve the peace thereof during the time of the said election, and to prevent all manner of riots, tumults, disorders, and violence whatsoever. And We strictly charge and command that this Our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market-Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the county towns of Scotland, ten days at least before the time hereby appointed for the meeting of the said Peers to proceed to such election.

**T**HE following Statutes passed on the twenty-second day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, by the Governing Body of Jesus College, Oxford, have been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877:—

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 40 and 41. Victoria, cap. 48, and approved by the Queen in Council on the third day of May one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in relation to Jesus College in the University of Oxford in the matter of "A Statute for Jesus College concerning the Meyricke Endowment," such amending Statutes being duly made at a general meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose held on the twenty-second day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, and passed by the unanimous votes of those present and voting. In Clause 3 as amended and approved by the Queen in Council on the twenty-third day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, omit the words "shall as a first charge" as far as the words "on such Committee and" inclusive.

Clause 6 omit the whole of this clause and substitute the following "The net interest of £20,000 at present invested in consols in the name of the Principal and Fellows of Jesus College, Oxford, shall be applied annually within the College as follows:—Either (a.) in Major Exhibitions of £60 per annum each, to be awarded to Welshmen qualified according to Clause 4, such Exhibitions to be tenable for two years, but renewable for a further period not exceeding three years."

"Or (b.) in Minor Exhibitions of not less than £5 per term each, tenable by Welsh Undergraduates Members of the College qualified according to Clause 4, such Exhibitions to be awarded at the end of each term to such candidates as shall be approved by the Principal and Fellows after due consideration of the circum-

stances of each candidate and of his progress during the term."

"Or (c.) partly in Major and partly in Minor Exhibitions."

Altering Name of Union:—

Bradford (Bradford-on-Avon) Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Bradford Union, in the County of Wilts;—

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes and Places comprised in the said Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 13 of "The Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876," it is enacted as follows:—

"The Local Government Board may, when they see fit, by their Order change the name of any Union, and direct how such change of name shall be published; no such change of name shall affect any rights or obligations of, or securities given by or to the said Union, or render defective any legal proceedings instituted by or against the said Union; and any legal proceedings may be continued or commenced by or against the said Union by their new name which might have been continued or commenced by or against the Union by their former name."

And whereas by an Order dated the 18th day of February, 1835, the Poor Law Commissioners declared that the several Parishes and Places specified in the margin thereof in the counties of Wilts and Somerset should be united for the administration of the laws for the relief of the Poor, and the Union so constituted has since been known by the name of the Bradford Union;

And whereas the said Order was amended by an Order of the Poor Law Commissioners dated the 1st day of June, 1837, and by an Order issued by Us, the Local Government Board, and dated the 30th day of January, 1873;

And whereas by an Order issued by Us and dated the 28th day of July, 1882, the parish of Freshford, in the County of Somerset, was separated from the said Union;

And whereas by an Order issued by Us and dated the 19th day of December, 1884, certain parts of the parish of Bradford and the several parts of each of the Parishes of Great Chalfield and Little Chalfield were amalgamated with the Parish of Cottles, and the Parish of Cottles, as so altered, was designated the Parish of Atworth;

And whereas by the County of Wilts (Bradford) Confirmation Order, 1894, the Parish of Bradford, in the said Union, was divided into two separate Parishes, namely the Parishes of Bradford-on-Avon and Bradford Without, which new Parishes were included in the said Union;

And whereas by the County of Wilts (Bradford Rural) Confirmation Order, 1894, the said Parish of Bradford Without as constituted by the last-recited Order was divided into five separate Parishes, namely, the Parishes of Holt, South Wraxall, Winsley, Limpley Stoke, and Bradford Without, which new Parishes were included in the said Union;

And whereas it is expedient that the name of the said Union should be changed as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—From and after the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, the name of the said Union shall be changed to the Bradford-on-Avon Union, and the Guardians of the Poor thereof shall be described as the Guardians of the Poor of the Bradford-on-Avon Union.

ARTICLE II.—The said Guardians shall cause this Order to be published for two successive weeks before the expiration of one month from the date hereof in some newspaper circulating within the Union.

*Inland Rules of the Road to be Followed in Certain Ports.*

THE United States Government has given

notice, dated 18th May, 1895, that the Inland Rules of the Road of the United States are to be followed in the undermentioned ports, when within the limits given below:—

1. Boston Harbour.—The limits are:—From Point Allerton, a line running N.N.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E., Ely., to North-east Grave Whistle Buoy; thence N.N.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E. to Outer Breaker (Great Pigs Rocks) Bell Buoy; thence N.E. by E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  E. to Halfway Rock Beacon; and thence N.E. by E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E. to Eastern Point Lighthouse.

2. New York Harbour.—From Navesink Lighthouse, N.E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  E., Ely., to Scotland Light-vessel; and thence through the Gedney Channel Whistle Buoy (proposed position) to Rockaway Point Life-saving Station.

3. Baltimore Harbour and Chesapeake Bay.—From Cape Henry Lighthouse, N.E., by E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  E., Ely., to Outer Entrance Whistle Buoy; and thence N. by E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  E. to Cape Charles Lighthouse.

4. Galveston Harbour.—From Galveston Bar Whistle Buoy, N. by W.  $\frac{3}{4}$  W., to the beacon marking the outer extremity of North Jetty; and from the same buoy S.W. by W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., Wly., to North Breaker Beacon.

5. San Francisco Harbour.—From Point Bonita Lighthouse, S.E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  S., to Point Lobos.

NOTE.—The Rules of the Road for Inland waters of the United States, so far as they affect vessels navigating the above harbours, are similar to the International Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea, with the following additions or alterations:—

#### *Rules concerning Lights.*

Art. 3. A steamer of over one hundred and fifty feet register length shall also carry when under way an additional bright light similar in construction to that mentioned in sub-division (a.), so placed as to throw the light all around the horizon and of such character as to be visible at a distance of at least three miles. Such additional light shall be placed in line with the keel at least fifteen feet higher from the deck and more than seventy-five feet abaft the light mentioned in sub-division (a.).

Art. 4. A steam-vessel, when towing another ship, in addition to the lights prescribed in this article, shall also carry a small bright light abaft the funnel or after mast for the towed vessel to steer by, but such light shall not be visible forward of the beam.

Art. 5. A steam-vessel having a raft in tow shall, instead of the forward lights mentioned in Article 4, carry on or in front of the foremast, or if a vessel without a foremast then in the fore part of the vessel, at a height above the hull of not less than 20 feet, and if the beam of the vessel exceeds 20 feet, then at a height above the hull not less than such beam, so however that such height need not exceed 40 feet, two bright lights in a horizontal line athwartships and not less than eight feet apart, each so placed as to throw the light all around the horizon and of such character as to be visible at a distance of at least five miles. Such steamer shall also carry the small bright steering light aft, of the character and placed as required in Article 4 above.

Art. 6. A vessel in tow shall, in addition to the lights prescribed in this article, also carry a small bright light aft, but such light shall not be visible forward of the beam.

Art. 8. A vessel of 150 feet or upward in register length, when at anchor, shall carry in the forward part of the vessel, at a height not less than 20 and not exceeding 40 feet above the hull, the light prescribed in this Article, and at or near the stern of the vessel, and at such a height that

it shall be not less than 15 feet lower than the forward light, another such light.

Special Articles. Sailing vessels shall at all times, on the approach of any steamer during the night-time, show a lighted torch upon that point or quarter to which such steamer shall be approaching.

The exhibition of any light on board of a vessel of war or revenue cutter of the United States may be suspended whenever in the opinion of the Secretary of the Navy, the commander-in-chief of a squadron, or the commander of a vessel acting singly, the special character of the service may require it.

#### *Sound Signals for Fog, &c.*

Art. 14.—(a.) A steam vessel under way, excepting only a steam vessel with raft in tow, shall sound at intervals of not more than one minute three distinct blasts of her whistle.

Every vessel in tow of another vessel shall, at intervals of one minute, sound four bells on a good and efficient and properly placed bell as follows:—By striking the bell twice in quick succession, followed by a little longer interval, and then again striking twice in quick succession (in the manner in which four bells is struck in indicating time).

A steamer with a raft in tow shall sound at intervals of not more than one minute a screeching or Modoc whistle for from three to five seconds.

(b, c.) The rules for sailing-ships under way and for steam and sailing-ships at anchor are the same as prescribed in this Article.

Special Articles. Vessels of less than ten tons registered tonnage, not being steam-vessels, shall not be obliged to give the above-mentioned signals, but if they do not they shall make some other efficient sound signal at intervals of not more than one minute.

Produce-boats, fishing-boats, rafts, or other water craft navigating by hand power or by the current of the river, or anchored or moored in or near the channel or fairway and not in any port, and not otherwise provided for in these rules, shall sound a fog horn, or equivalent signal, at intervals of not more than one minute.

Every vessel shall, in thick weather, by reason of fog, mist, falling snow, heavy rain storms, or other causes, go at moderate speed. A steam-vessel hearing, apparently not more than four points from right ahead, the fog signal of another vessel shall at once reduce her speed to bare steerage-way, and navigate with caution until the vessels shall have passed each other.

#### *Steering and Sailing Rules.*

Special Articles. In all narrow channels where there is a current, when two steamers are meeting, the descending steamer shall have the right of way, and shall, before the vessels have arrived within the distance of half-a-mile from each other, give the signal necessary to indicate which side she elects to take.

In all channels less than 500 feet in width, no steam-vessel shall pass another going in the same direction unless the steam-vessel ahead be disabled or signify her willingness that the steam-vessel astern shall pass, when the steam-vessel astern may pass, subject, however, to the other rules applicable to such a situation. And when steam-vessels proceeding in opposite directions are about to meet in such channels, both such vessels shall be slowed down to a moderate speed, according to the circumstances.

If the pilot of a steam-vessel to which a passing signal is sounded deems it unsafe to accept and assent to said signal, he shall not sound a cross signal; but in that case, and in every case where the pilot of one steamer fails to understand the

course or intention of an approaching steamer, whether from signals being given or answered erroneously, or from other causes, the pilot of such steamer so receiving the first passing signal, or the pilot so in doubt, shall sound several short and rapid blasts of the whistle; and if the vessels shall have approached within half-a-mile of each other both shall reduce their speed to bare steerage-way, and, if necessary, stop and reverse.

*Buoyage of Gedney and Main Channels.*

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 238 of 1895:—

The United States Government has given further notice, that, on or about 1st July, 1895, the experimental system of electric light buoys established on the edges of Gedney and Main Channels, entrance to New York Lower Bay, will be lighted at night, by 100 candle-power incandescent electric lights, and the oil lights hitherto shown from those buoys will be discontinued.

The buoys on the southerly sides of the channel are black with white lights, those on the northerly sides red with red lights.
