HER Majesty the Queen has been graciously pleased to confer the Decoration of the Albert Medal of the Second Class on Mr. HEREWARD HEWISON, of Newcastle, New South Wales.

The following is an account of the services in respect of which the Decoration has been conferred:—

While a number of men were bathing on the sea beach at Newcastle, New South Wales, on the morning of the 28th November, 1894, the cry of "Shark!" was suddenly raised; every one at once made for the shore, with the exception of Mr. Horace Hewison, who cried out that the shark had seized him, and immediately afterwards disappeared under the water.

Mr. HEREWARD HEWISON, realizing the dangerous position of his elder brother, promptly turned, and swimming to the spot, found that the shark had seized his brother's right arm.

He at once grasped his brother round the body, and the two fought the shark as well as they were able until the complete severance of the arm, just below the elbow joint, released Mr. HORACE HEWISON, and afforded them an opportunity to escape to the shore, which they succeeded in reaching without further accident.

Mr. HEREWARD HEWISON assisted his injured brother by keeping behind him and pushing him

forward.
