HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-pinth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirtyfour; of the Act of the first and second years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and seven; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twentieth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninetyfive, in the words and figures following, that is to

say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the first and second years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and seven of the Act of the second and third years of Your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Simon and Saint Jude situate at Milton-under-Wychwood in the parish of Shipton-under-Wychwood in the county of Oxford and in the diocese of Oxford.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Simon and Saint Jude situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William Bishop of the said diocese of Oxford (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Shipton-under-Wychwood, together with the contiguous territory known as the extra-parochial liberty or ville of Bruern in the county and diocese aforesaid which is described in the

T the Court at Windsor, the 16th day of said extra-parochial territory delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Simon and Saint Jude situate at Milton-under-Wychwood as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Simon and Saint Jude, Miltonunder-Wychwood.

"And with the like consent of the said William Bishop of the said diocese of Oxford (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Simon and Saint Jude situate at Milton-under-Wychwood as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing representation has reference.

"The district chapelry of Saint Simon and Saint

Jude Milton-under-Wychwood comprising:—
"I. All that part of the ancient ecclesiastical parish of Shipton - under - Wychwood, in the county of Oxford and in the diocese of Oxford which is comprised within, and is co-extensive with the limits of the township or civil parish of Milton-under-Wychwood and the limits of the hamlet or civil parish of Lyncham.

"II. And also the whole of the extra-parochial liberty or ville (now a civil parish) of Bruern in

the county and diocese aforesaid."

JHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years. of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-two; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of April; in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, in the words and figures

following; that is to say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Your Majesty, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Your Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter fifty-five, and of the Act of the thirtyfourth and thirty-fifth years of Your Majesty, chapter eighty-two, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of All Saints Penarth situate within the limits of the parish of Penarth in the county of Glamorgan and in the diocese of Llandaff.

Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Pennrth, of the parish of Cogan in the said county and diocess, and of the parish of Llandough-juxta-Cardiff in the same county and diocese which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parishes respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being'the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said parish of Penarth of the said parish of Cogan, and of the parish of Llandough-juxta-Cardiff aforesaid should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of All Saints Penarth situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Richard, Bishop of the said diocese of Llandaff, as such Bishop, with the consent of the Right Honourable Robert George, Baron Windsor the patron of the rectory of the said parish of Penarth, with the consent of the Most Honourable John Patrick Marquess of Bute and Earl of Dumfries, Knight of the most Ancient and most Noble Order of the Thistle, who as tenant for life under the will of the late John Crichton Stuart, Marquess of Bute and Earl of Dumfries, is the patron of the rectory of the said parish. of Cogan, and also of the rectory of the said parish of Llandough, subject to an assignment of the next presentation to the two last-mentioned

parish of Pulham Saint Mary in the county of Norfolk, and to the Reverend Lewis Jones now Vicar or Incumbent of the vicarage of the parish of Cadoxton-juxta-Neath in the county of Glamorgan aforesaid, and with the consents of the said William Henry Cleaver and of the said Lewis Jones (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and scaled this representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Penarth; of the said parish of Cogan and of the said parish of Llandough which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of All Saints Penarth situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints Penarth.

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall reem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of All' Saints "3/ and jugary s Penarth comprising:

"I. All that part of the parish of Penarth in the county of Glamorgan and in the diocese of Llandaff, which is bounded upon the south by the parish of Lavernock in the said county and diocese upon the west and upon the north-west partly by the parish of Cogan and partly by a certain detached portion of the parish of Llandough-juxta-Cardiff both in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the north-east and upon the east-by an imaginary. line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parishmof Cogan from the parish of Penarth aforesaid at a point distant eight chains or thereabouts due west from the junction of Maughan-street with Windsor-road at the centre of the culvert which carries the line of the Penarth and Cadoxton Branch of the Taff Vale Railway over the stream flowing from Lvy Cottage towards Cogan and extending thence first south-eastward and then southward along the middle of the said branch line of railway for a distance of one mile and forty-five chains or thereabouts to a point a little to the south-east of the place called Lower Penarth upon the boundary, which divides the said parish of Penarth from the parish of Lavernock aforesaid.

"II. All that contiguous part of the said parish." of Cogan which comprises the houses known as Grove-terrace and which is bounded upon the south-west and upon the south by the hereinbefore described portion of the parish of Penarth aforesaid upon the east and upon the north parily by the said portion of the parish of Penarth and parily by the above-mentioned detached portion of the parish of Llandoughjuxta-Cardiff and upon the remaining side that is. to say upon the west by an imaginary line com-mencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Penarth from the parish of Cogan aforesaid at the point opposite to Ivy Cottage aforesaid where the public footpath; leading from Arcot-street and Windsor-road towards Corners well intersects the road called or known as Groverectories to the Reverend William Henry Cleaver 1 terrace at its northern end, and extending thence

southward along the said road for a distance of one chain and a half or thereabouts to the boundary at the eastern corner of the garden and land upon which Ivy Cottage aforesaid stands, which boundary divides the said parish of Cogan from the parish of Penarth aforesaid.

"III. And also all that detached part of the said parish of Llandough-juxta-Cardiff, which is referred to above, and which is entirely surrounded by the above described portions of the parishes of

Penarth and Cogan."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Llandaif. WHEREAS the Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley, Baronet, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has, under the provisions of an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the "laws concerning the burial of the dead in " England beyond the limits of the Metropolis, "and to amend the Act concerning the burial " of the dead in the Metropolis," made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parish without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discentinued therein with the following modifications, viz. :-

CHIEVELEY.-Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Chieveley, in the county of Berks; and also in the churchyard except as

follows:

: (a.) In such waults as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brick-

work properly cemented.

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the twenty-seventh day of August next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct "that this Order be forthwith published in the

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS by an Act passed in the Session . of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventcenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning "the burial of the dead in England beyond the "limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act "concerning the burial of the dead in the Metro-"polis," it is enacted that, in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the representation of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial-ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of one of such Secretaries of State, should be prohibited; or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial-grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any, exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that no new burialground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burialgrounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered; provided also that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and vestry clerk or churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas by another Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act further to amend the laws concerning "the burial of the dead in England," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas the Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley, Baronet, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has made a representation stating that he is of opinion that the Order of Her Majesty in Council of the fourteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, so far as it affects burials in the Cleobury Mortimer churchyard, should be varied, by substituting for it the following Order viz.:—

That burials be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Cleobury Mortimer, in the county of Salop; and also in the churchyard except as follows:—

In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the twenty-seventh day of August next:

# Prohibition of Movement out of District in Schedule.

1. Notwithstanding anything in the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1894, No. 3 or in any other Order of the Board of Agriculture swine shall not be moved out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order.

Provided that nothing in this Article shall be

deemed to apply to the movement of swine where they are moved through the District described in the Schedule to this Order by railway from a place outside that District to another place outside that District without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or rebooked within that District.

Offences.

2.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If a person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act,

1894.

#### Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-fifth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.
