

hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has made a representation stating that he is of opinion that the Order of Her Majesty in Council of the fourteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, so far as it affects burials in the Cleobury Mortimer churchyard, should be varied, by substituting for it the following Order viz. :—

That burials be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Cleobury Mortimer, in the county of Salop; and also in the churchyard except as follows :—

In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the twenty-seventh day of August next :

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation, one month before the said twenty-seventh day of August. *C.
