GULF OF MEXICO—TEXAS.

Brazos Santiago—Light on Isabel Point.

THE United States Government has given notice that, on or about 15th July, 1895, a light would be shown from a lighthouse erected on Isabel Point, south end of Madre Lagoon:—

Isabel Point Light is a third order, fixed and flashing white light, elevated 87 feet above the sea, and visible from a distance of 15 miles in clear weather.

The lighthouse is a conical brick tower painted white, with a black lantern, and is situated on the observation spot; a keeper's dwelling, painted white stands about 125 feet northward of the lighthouse.

Approximate position, lat. $26^{\circ} 4' 35''$ N., long. $97^{\circ} 12' 30''$ W.

*Leghorn Roadstead—Alteration in Position of
Meloria Shoal Light-vessel.*

THE Italian Government has given notice, dated 26th June, 1895, that Meloria Shoal Light-Vessel (fixed white light) has been moved about 11 cables N.N.W. (N. 22° W.) from the position in which she was previously moored, and now lies in a depth of about 4 fathoms, with Leghorn principal light-house bearing S.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ S. (S. 36° E.), distant $5\frac{1}{10}$ miles; and Meloria Lighthouse S. $\frac{3}{4}$ W. (S. 4° W.).

Approximate position, on Chart No. 157, lat. $43^{\circ} 35' 55''$ N., long. $10^{\circ} 12' 10''$ E.
