THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, from Her Majesty's Representative at Paramaribo, reporting that in accordance with the Quarantine Laws any vessel passing Fort Amsterdam without anchoring for the visit of the health officer, will be fired at with blank cartridge and must immediately drop her anchor, failing which such vessel shall be liable to a fine of from 25 to 500 guilders, and for a repetition of the offence a fine of 1,000 guilders. No ship having disregarded this ordinance, and become liable to the above-mentioned fines, shall be cleared from the port before having deposited with the Procureur-General the security necessary to cover the fine and costs of such transgression as set forth above.

ST. PIERRE AND MIQUELON.

THE METROPOLITAN STREETS ACT,
1867 (30 and 31 Victoria, cap. 134).

IN pursuance of the above-recited Act, I, the Commissioner of Police for the city of London, make the following Regulations, videlicet:—

1. All Metropolitan Stage Carriages passing by way of the south side of St. Paul's Churchyard to London Bridge shall proceed via Cannon-street, and shall return by the same route.

2. All Metropolitan Stage Carriages passing by way of the south side of St. Paul's Churchyard to the Mansion House or places beyond, shall proceed via Cannon-street and Queen Victoria-street, and shall return by the same route.

3. All empty cabs issuing from the Great Eastern Railway Station shall turn eastward and pass out of Liverpool-street into Bishopsgate.

4. All empty cabs issuing from Broad-street Station shall proceed direct into New Broad-street.

5. The above Regulations shall be in force between the hours of eight A.M. and eight P.M.

Civil Service Commission, August 13, 1895.

THE Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, that the following Regulations are published with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for Female Sorterships in the General Post Office, London.

These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

These situations are filled by Open Competitive Examinations under the following rules, viz. :—

1. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners :—

(a.) That their age on the day of the Competitive Examination is not less than 15 nor more than 18.

NOTE.—In reckoning age for competition, persons who have served for two full consecutive years in any civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years which they may have spent in such service.

(b.) That they are unmarried or widows.

(c.) That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

2. At each Examination the number of Candidates to be selected will be such as the Postmaster-General may from time to time fix.

3. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

1. Reading and copying MS.

2. Handwriting.

3. Spelling.

4. Arithmetic (first four rules, simple and compound).

5. Geography of the United Kingdom.

4. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service will not be eligible unless they produce to the Civil Service Commissioners the written permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination, dated before the commencement of the competition.

5. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

6. A fee of 2s. 6d. will be required from each Candidate attending the Examination.

REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Male Telegraph Learner in London, in the Department of the Postmaster-General.

These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

1. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

(a.) That their age on the day of the Examination is not less than 14 nor more than 18.

NOTE.—In reckoning age for competition, persons who have served for two full consecutive years in any Civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, or as Registered Copyists in connection with the Civil Service, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years which they may have spent in such service.

(b.) That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

2. At each Examination the number of Candidates to be selected will be such as the Postmaster-General may from time to time fix.

3. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

1. Handwriting.

2. Orthography.

3. English Composition, to be tested by a short essay or letter on a simple subject.

4. Arithmetic, including vulgar and decimal fractions and percentages.

5. Geography (general).

4. Persons who may have accepted a situation as Telegraph Learner in any London office will not be eligible to compete.
