**W**HEREAS by "The Seal Fisheries (North Pacific) Act, 1895," it is enacted that Her Majesty the Queen may by Order in Council prohibit, during the period specified by the Order, the catching of seals by British ships in such parts of the seas to which that Act applies as are specified by the Order; and that for carrying into effect an arrangement with any foreign State an Order in Council may provide that the powers under the Act of any commissioned officer on full pay in the Naval Service of Her Majesty the Queen may, subject to any limitations, conditions, modifications, and exceptions specified in the Order, be exercised in relation to a British ship, and the equipment, crew, and certificate thereof, by such officers of the said foreign State as are specified in the Order, and that any such Order may contain any limitations, conditions, modifications, and exceptions which appear to Her Majesty in Council expedient for carrying into effect the object of that Act;

And whereas the said Act applies to the seas within that part of the Pacific Ocean known as Behring Sea, and within such other parts of the North Pacific Ocean as are north of the forty-second parallel of north latitude;

And whereas an arrangement has been made between Her Majesty the Queen and His Majesty the Emperor of Russia whereby British ships engaged in hunting seals within such parts of the said seas as are hereinafter specified may be seized by Russian cruisers:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Act, and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. From and after the date of the present Order, until Her Majesty in Council shall otherwise direct, the catching of seals by British ships is hereby prohibited within such parts of the seas to which the recited Act applies as are comprised within the following zones (in this Order referred to as "the prohibited zones"), that is to say:—

(1.) A zone of ten marine miles on all the Russian coasts of Behring Sea and the North Pacific Ocean; and

(2.) A zone of thirty marine miles round the Kormandorsky Islands and Tulénew (Robben Island).

2. The powers under the recited Act of a commissioned officer on full pay in the Naval Service of Her Majesty may be exercised in relation to a British ship, and the equipment, crew, and certificate thereof, by the Captain or other officer in command of any war-vessel of His Majesty the Emperor of Russia (hereinafter referred to as an "authorized Russian officer"), but subject to the limitations, conditions, modifications, and exceptions following, that is to say:—

(1.) The said powers shall not be exercised by an authorized Russian officer, except in relation to British ships engaged in hunting seals within either of the prohibited zones.

(2.) A British ship shall not be liable to seizure or detention by an authorized Russian officer by reason of the contravention of any Regulations made under section two of the recited Act.

(3.) The powers under section three of the recited Act of detaining any portion of the equipment or any of the crew, and the powers under section four of giving a provisional certificate in lieu of a ship's certificate which is seized and retained, or of indorsing on a certificate the grounds on which it was seized, and of directing the ship to proceed forthwith to a specified port, shall not be exercised in relation to a British ship by an authorized Russian officer.

(4.) Where an authorized Russian officer in exercise of the said powers stops and examines and detains a British ship or her certificate of registry, he shall as soon as possible hand over the ship, or deliver or transmit the certificate, as the case may be, either to the Commanding Officer of a British cruiser or to the nearest British authority, as defined by this Order, and shall then, or within a reasonable time thereafter, satisfy such officer or authority that there were reasonable grounds for the detention or seizure, and that the case is proper to be adjudicated in a British Court, and also furnish to such officer or authority the evidence sufficient, in the opinion of such officer or authority, for such adjudication; and if the said Russian officer fails to satisfy such officer or authority, or to furnish to such officer or authority such sufficient evidence as aforesaid, the said officer or authority may release the ship.

3.—(1.) Where the Commanding Officer of a British cruiser receives a British ship from an authorized Russian officer, and is satisfied that there were reasonable grounds for the detention or seizure, and that the case is proper to be adjudicated in a British Court, he may exercise the powers conferred by section 4 of the recited Act as if he had himself stopped and examined and detained the ship, and that section shall apply accordingly.

(2.) Where the Commanding Officer of a British cruiser, or a British authority, receives a British ship from an authorized Russian officer, and sends the case for adjudication in a British Court, he shall, for the purposes of section seventy-six of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," be deemed to have himself seized or detained the said ship.

4. For the purposes of this Order, the expression "British authority" means any officer of Customs in Her Majesty's dominions, and any British Consular officer having authority as such in any port or place.

5. "The Seal Fishery (North Pacific) Order in Council, 1894," is hereby revoked, without prejudice to anything done or suffered under that Order.

6. This Order may be cited as "The Seal Fisheries (North Pacific) Order in Council, 1895."

And the Most Honourable the Marquess of Salisbury, K.G., and the Right Honourable Joseph Chamberlain, two of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them respectively appertain.

And whereas the immediate operation of this Order is urgent, this Order shall come into operation forthwith and shall be a *provisional* Order within the meaning of "The Rules Publication Act, 1893."

**W**HEREAS by "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890," it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for Her Majesty to hold, exercise, and enjoy any jurisdiction which Her Majesty then had, or might at any time thereafter have, within a foreign country, in the same and as ample a manner as if Her Majesty had acquired that jurisdiction by the cession or conquest of territory.

And whereas by certain Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date at Westminster, the twenty-eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, Her Majesty's Settlement of Sierra Leone was erected into a separate Colony,—to be called the Colony of Sierra Leone, and by the said Letters Patent provision was made for establishing a Legislative Council for the said Colony of Sierra Leone with certain powers and authority to legislate for the said Colony as by the said Letters Patent will more fully appear.

And whereas Her Majesty hath acquired jurisdiction within divers foreign countries on the West Coast of Africa, near or adjacent to Her Majesty's said Colony of Sierra Leone, and it is

expedient to determine the mode of exercising such jurisdiction.

Now therefore, Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order as follows:—

1. It shall be lawful for the Legislative Council for the time being of the Colony of Sierra Leone, by Ordinance or Ordinances, to exercise and provide for giving effect to all such jurisdiction as Her Majesty may, at any time before or after the passing of this Order in Council, have acquired in the said territories adjacent to the Colony of Sierra Leone.

2. The Governor for the time being of the Colony of Sierra Leone shall have a negative voice in the passing of all such Ordinances as aforesaid. And the right is hereby reserved to Her Majesty, Her heirs and successors, to disallow any such Ordinances as aforesaid, in whole or in part, such disallowance being signified to the said Governor through one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and also to make and establish from time to time, with the advice and consent of Parliament, or with the advice of Her or their Privy Council, all such Laws or Ordinances as may to Her or them appear necessary for the exercise of such jurisdiction as aforesaid as fully as if this Order in Council had not been made.

3. In the making and establishing all such Ordinances, the said Legislative Council shall conform to and observe all such rules and regulations as may from time to time be appointed by any instruction or instructions issued by Her Majesty under Her Sign Manual and Signet, and, until further directed, the instructions in force for the time being as to Ordinances passed by the said Legislative Council for the peace, order, and good government of the said Colony of Sierra Leone shall, so far as they may be applicable, be taken and deemed to be in force in respect of Ordinances passed by the said Council, by virtue of this Order in Council.

4. The Courts of the Colony of Sierra Leone shall have in respect of matters occurring within the said territories adjacent to the said Colony so far as such matters are within the jurisdiction of Her Majesty the same jurisdiction, civil and criminal, original and appellate, as they respectively possess from time to time in respect of matters occurring within the said Colony, and the judgments, decrees, orders, and sentences, of any such Court made or given in the exercise of the jurisdiction hereby conferred may be enforced and executed, and appeals therefrom may be had and prosecuted in the same way as if the judgment, decree, order, or sentence had been made or given under the ordinary jurisdiction of the Court.

5. In the construction of this Order in Council the term "Governor" shall include the officer for the time being administering the government of the Colony of Sierra Leone.

And the Right Honourable Joseph Chamberlain, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS by the twentieth section of "The Finance Act, 1894," it is enacted that Her Majesty the Queen may, by Order in

Council, apply that section to any British possession, where Her Majesty is satisfied that, by the law of such possession, no duty is leviable in respect of property situate in the United Kingdom when passing on death.

And whereas Her Majesty is satisfied that by the law of the Colony of Fiji no duty is leviable in respect of property situate in the United Kingdom when passing on death.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the power by the aforesaid Act in Her Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the twentieth section of "The Finance Act, 1894," shall apply to the Colony of Fiji.

WHEREAS by the five hundred and eighty-second and five hundred and eighty-third sections of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is enacted that a Pilotage Authority may, by By-law made under Part X of that Act, do all or any of the things specified in the said five hundred and eighty-second section, but that a bye-law so

made shall not take effect until it is submitted to Her Majesty in Council and confirmed by Order in Council:

And whereas the Corporation of the Guild or Brotherhood of Masters and Pilots Seamen of the Trinity House in Kingston-upon-Hull, being a Pilotage authority within the meaning of the said Act, have, in exercise of the powers vested in them by that Act, made certain bye-laws fixing the rates to be demanded and received for pilotage between the Ports of Hull and Goole, and for reducing the Commission formerly payable to the Pilot Master at Goole for collection of Pilotage, keeping the accounts, and general management:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the said bye-laws should be approved: And whereas the operation of this Order is urgent:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to approve of and signify Her consent to the said bye-laws, as set forth in the schedule hereto annexed, and to direct that the same shall come into force from the date hereof, and be *provisional* Rules within the meaning of "The Rules Publication Act 1893."

For a fractional part of a foot, such fractional part being not less than half a foot, a proportionate rate.

Exemptions from Pilotage:—

Vessels—

- (1) Employed in the regular coasting trade of the Kingdom.
- (2) Wholly laden with stone from Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, and being the production thereof.
- (3) Not exceeding 150 tons register.
- (4) Not exceeding 10 feet draught of water.

2.—The Commission to be paid to the Pilot Master at Goole for collection of Pilotage, keeping the accounts and general management, shall be five per cent.

WHEREAS by section sixteen of "The Pluralities Act 1838" as amended by "The Pluralities Act 1850" it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the Bishop of any diocese, or by the Bishops of any two dioceses, that two or more benefices, or that one or more benefice or benefices, and one or more spiritual sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, in his or their diocese or dioceses, being either, in the same parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed one thousand five hundred persons, may,

“with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such inquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the patron or patrons of the said benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such consent being signified in writing under the hands of such patron or patrons, the said Archbishop shall, six weeks before certifying such inquiry and consent to Her Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own diocese, a statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such benefices, sinecure rectories, or vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested, that he, she, or they, may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop, against such union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to Her Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, into one benefice, with cure of souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only; and it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to give directions for regulating the course and succession in which patrons if there be more than one patron shall present or nominate to such united benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant.”

And whereas the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, hath duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a certificate in writing, bearing date the sixth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, in the words following, that is to say:—

“We the undersigned Edward White Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of All England and Metropolitan do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council.

“That the Right Reverend William Bishop of Oxford as Bishop of the diocese within which are situate the vicarage of Great Kimble and the rectory of Little Kimble both in the county of Buckingham having represented unto us that the said benefices being contiguous to each other and of which the aggregate population does not exceed one thousand five hundred persons might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one benefice we enquired into the circumstances of the case.

“That on such enquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully made and would not be of inconvenient extent and that the Earl of Buckinghamshire (being the patron or person entitled to present to the said benefice of Great Kimble if the same were now vacant) and the Reverend Arthur Kennet Hobart Hampden (being the patron or person entitled to present to the said benefice of Little Kimble if the same were now vacant) consent to the proposed union.

“That six weeks and upwards before certifying such enquiry and consent to Your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed on the principal outer door of the

parish church of each of the said benefices with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such union and no such cause has been shown.

“The representation of the said Lord Bishop of Oxford our enquiry into the circumstances of the case the statement of circumstances in reply thereto the consent in writing of the patrons and the copies of the representation and notices before-mentioned are hereunto annexed.

“And we do hereby certify the enquiry and consent aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for uniting the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes.”

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered that the vicarage of Great Kimble in the county of Buckingham and diocese of Oxford and the rectory of Little Kimble situate in the same county and diocese shall be united into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

And Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council is further pleased to direct that the right of presentation to such united benefice shall belong to the Right Honourable Sidney Carr Hobart Hampden Earl of Buckinghamshire as the sole patron thereof subject only to the Reverend Arthur Kennet Hobart Hampden being entitled to the first turn, or right of presentation to the said united benefice upon the first avoidance thereof if he shall then be living.
