THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 31st July, 1895, from Her Majesty's Representative at Tokio, stating that he has received from the Japanese Minister for Foreign Affairs information to the effect that the following regulations for the inspection of vessels will now be put in force at the Ports of Yokohama, Kobe, Nagasaki, Kuchinotsu, Shimonoseki and Moji, in the case of all vessels arriving directly, or otherwise, from Ports in Formosa and Corea, being localities infected with cholera.

The said inspection will take place:—

For vessels proceeding to the Port of Kobe, at Wada Point.

For vessels proceeding to the Port of Yokohama, at Nagaura; and

For vessels proceeding to the Port of Moji or Ujina, at Shimonoseki.

When it is necessary to enforce disinfection in the case of vessels bound for the Port of Kuchinotsu in Nagasaki Prefecture, or for any other special Port of export, they shall proceed to the nearest disinfecting station.

CHERRY AND MID LENT FAIRS, ODIHAM.

THE Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that, by Memorial dated the 31st of August, 1895, a representation has been duly made to him by the Hartley Wintney Rural District Council, that Fairs have been annually held in Odiham, in the county of Southampton, and known as the Cherry Fair and the Odiham Mid Lent Fair, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fairs should be abolished:

On the 7th day of October, 1895, the Secretary of State will take such representation into consideration, and any person who may desire to object to the abolition of the Fair, should intimate his objections to the Secretary of State before that day.

I, THE Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley, Bart., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1894, and on the representation of the County Council of Wiltshire, hereby make the following order:—

The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the whole of the county of Wilts, to the Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate, Snakebird), Swallow, Martin (two species), Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling, Reed Pheasant), Kestrel, Merlin, Hobby, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, and the Osprey, as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act.

ARTICLE II.—If the said Guardians shall so direct, it shall also be the duty of the Clerk to the Guardians to send to each Guardian, by post or otherwise, forty-eight hours at least before each ordinary Meeting of the Guardians, a printed copy of the Minutes of the last ordinary Meeting and of every other Meeting of the Guardians held since the last ordinary Meeting; and if, in pursuance of any such direction, a printed copy of such Minutes shall have been so sent to each Guardian it shall not be necessary that the Minutes so sent shall be read at the next ordinary Meeting if at such Meeting the Guardian resolve that such Minutes be taken as read. Any such Resolution shall be entered upon the

Minutes in lieu of an entry to the effect that the Minutes have been read.
