Depositions of Persons examined before the Court.

Filing and Custody of Depositions taken at Private Examinations.

(1.) Notwithstanding anything contained in the Companies (Winding-up) Rules, 1890–1892, the notes of the depositions of a person examined under section 115 of the Companies Act, 1862, or under any Order of the Court before the Court or before any Officer of the Court, or person appointed to take such an examination (other than the notes of the depositions of a person examined at a public examination under section 8 of the Companies (Winding-up) Act, 1890), shall not be placed on the file of proceedings to be open to the

inspection of any creditor, contributory, or other person, other than the Official Receiver or Liquidator, unless and until the Court shall so direct, nd the Court may from time to time give such general or special directions as it shall think expedient as to the custody and inspection of such notes, and the furnishing of copies of or extracts therefrom.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 17TH SEPTEMBER 1895.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1.
