THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 11th September, 1895, from Her Majesty's Representative at Copenhagen, enclosing the following Notice as to quarantine:—
Le Ministère des Affaires Etrangères a l'honneur de présenter ses compliments à la Légation de S. M. Britannique et de l'informer que le Gouvernement des Antilles Danoises, en vue de l'épidémie de fièvre jaune régnant à San Juan dans l'île de Porto Rico a imposé une quarantaine de 5 jours aux provenances de Porto Rico et des îles d'alentour. Cette quarantaine sera maintenue indépendamment de la quarantaine de 15 jours existant depuis le mois d'avant de l'année passée a cause de l'épidémie de variole régnant dans les mêmes îles.
