MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT, 1894.

OTICE is hereby given that, after the expiration of forty days from the date hereof, it is proposed to submit to Her Majesty in Council, in pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, the draft of an Order in Council for confirming certain Bye-laws made by the Manchester Ship Canal Company, being the Pilotage Authority for the Port of Manchester, relating to Pilotage in the Manchester Ship Canal.

And notice is hereby further given that, in accordance with the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, copies of the proposed draft Order in Council can be obtained by any public body, within forty days of the date of this notice, at the Privy Council Office, Whitehall.

THE Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received, from the Chilean Minister at this Court, a Note, dated the 3rd September instant, denouncing the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation, signed between Great Britain and Chile on the 4th of October, 1854. This notice of denunciation has been accepted, and the provisions of the Treaty,—except those relating to peace and friendship between the two countries and their subjects and citizens, which continue obligatory for both parties,—will cease and determine on the 3rd of September, 1896.
