THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 17th September, 1895, from Her Majesty's Representative at Rome, stating that, in consequence of the existence of cholera at Tangier, the quarantine regulations of the 11th November, 1892, will be applied to all vessels arriving from Morocco until further notice.
