THE FAIRS ACT, 1873.

DRAYCOTT FAIR.

WHEREAS a representation has been duly made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Rural District Council of Wells, that a Fair known as Draycott Fair has hitherto been held at Rodney Stoke on the second Monday in September, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fair, hitherto held at Rodney Stoke on the second Monday in September, be held on the first Tuesday in that month.

And whereas notice of the said representation and of the time when I should take the same into consideration has been duly published in pursuance of "The Fairs Act, 1873."

And whereas on such representation and consideration it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the time for the holding of the said Fair should

be altered as proposed:

Now, therefore, I, as the Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Fairs Act, 1873" do . hereby order that the days shall be altered for the holding of the Fair which has been hitherto held at Rodney Stoke, and that the Fair hitherto held in the said parish on the second Monday in September shall in future be held instead on the first Tuesday in September.
