THE FAIRS ACT, 1873.

DRAYCOTT FAIR.

WHEREAS a representation has been duly made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Rural District Council of Wells, that a Fair known as Draycott Fair has hitherto been held at Rodney Stoke on the second Monday in September, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fair, hitherto held at Rodney Stoke on the second Monday in September, be held on the first Tuesday in that month.

And whereas notice of the said representation and of the time when I should take the same into consideration has been duly published in pursuance of "The Fairs Act, 1873."

And whereas on such representation and consideration it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the time for the holding of the said Fair should be altered as proposed :

Now, therefore, I, as the Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Fairs Act, 1873" do hereby order that the days shall be altered for the holding of the Fair which has been hitherto held at Rodney Stoke, and that the Fair hitherto held in the said parish on the second Monday in September shall in future be held instead on the first Tuesday in September.

WHEREAS by section 2 of the "Wild Birds Protection Act, 1894," power was given to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, upon application by the County Council of any administrative County, by Order to prohibit the taking or destroying of Wild Birds' eggs in any year or years in any place or places within that County.

Now therefore, I, the Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley, Bart., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the said Act, and on such application as aforesaid, hereby order as follows :—

That the taking or destroying of Wild Birds' eggs within that part of the County of Cambridge known as Wicken Sedge Fen shall be prohibited for a period of three years from the 7th of September, 1895.

Occulting Light on South Negril Point.
