THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at San Sebastian, reporting that the port has been declared foul owing to cholera, and that vessels leaving that place after 11th ultimo will be subjected to quarantine in Spanish ports, and that ports within 150 kilometres of Constantinople, measured in a direct line with that port, will be considered specially compromised.
