Vienna, May 27. Prince Louis of Baden arrived here this Evening from Bohemia, and will fet out in few days for Hungary to command the Imperial Army, which has its Rendezvous near Peft. This last week 18 large Boats laden with Artillery, Mortars, Bombs, Sc. were sent from hence down the Danube towards Budit. And several thousands Shovels, Spades, Pickaxes, Sc. are sent to Newhousel, to be employed in repairing the Fortifications of that place. The Turks are drawing their Troops together about Sophia, and it's reported, that they have already between 30 and 40000 men in a Body there; And that they have fent a Reinforcement of 4000
