DEMERARA RIVER APPROACH.

Sunken Wreck South-westward of the Light-vessel.

THE United States Government has given notice, dated 14th September, 1895, that the wreck of the schooner "Eagle" lies in 15 feet

water, $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles W.S.W. from the light-vessel, Demerara River Approach, and is marked by a green can buoy, moored eastward of the wreck.

As the wreck is likely to move from the above position, caution must be used when approaching or leaving the port, in any direction westward of the light-vessel.

OSTEND APPROACH.

Leading Lights for the Fairway over Stroom Bank.

THE Belgian Government has given notice, dated September, 1895, that the undermentioned leading lights are exhibited near Raversyde to mark the fairway over Stroom Bank, Ostend Road:—

The upper light is fixed white, elevated 77 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather, from a distance of 10 miles; over an arc of 180° , between the bearings N. 78° E. through south, and S. 78° W.

The lower light, also fixed and 57 feet above high water, shows a sector of red light over the fairway $1\frac{6}{10}$ cables wide, bordered on each side with a rose-coloured sector half a cable wide, thus covering the whole fairway; in other directions it is white. It is visible in clear weather, from a distance of 10 miles.

The lights in line, (or the turrets by day,) S. 22° E. lead through the centre of the fairway; when the upper light is not seen, the central red sector from the lower light marks the fairway.

Both lights are shown from iron turrets, painted white.

The low light stands on the shore, $10\frac{1}{2}$ cables, S. 75° W. from Mariakerke Steeple; the upper light bears S. 22° E., distant about 150 yards from the lower light.

Approximate position, on Chart No. 125, lat. $51^{\circ} 12' 10''$ N., long. $2^{\circ} 50' 55''$ E.

(1.) *Occulting Light on Lamholmen.*

THE Norwegian Government has given notice, that, on 1st October, 1895, a light will be exhibited on Lamholmen, Tran Islands:—Lamholmen Light will be occulting, elevated

48 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of six miles. It shows red from S. 46° W. through south and east to N. 36° E., white from N. 36° E. to N. 11° E.; red from N. 11° E. to N. 8° W. over Surenöbo, and white from N. 8° W. to N. 35° W.

The lighthouse is an octagonal iron building, 10 feet in height, painted white.

(2.) *Occulting Light on Hannæs holm.*

(3.) *Occulting Light on Bionnerö, Lille Molla.*

Bionnerö Light is occulting, elevated 39 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of six miles. It shows white from N. 9° W. to N. 72° W.; red from N. 72° W. through west to S. 70° W., and white from S. 70° W. through south to S. 50° E. Shown from 15th August to 30th April.

The lighthouse is an octagonal iron structure, 13 feet high, painted white.

Approximate position, lat. 68° 12' 35" N., long. 14° 51' 50" E.

(4.) *Occulting Light on Skaarvaag.*

Also, that a light will be exhibited on Fladholmen, Skaarvaag:—

Fladholmen Light will be occulting, elevated 45 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 6 miles. It shows white from N. 13° E. to N. 17° E.; red from N. 17° E. to N. 62° E., and white from N. 62° E. through east to S. 9° E., also, white towards Skaarvaag.

Shown from 15th August to 30th April.

The lighthouse is a small octagonal iron structure, 24 feet high, painted white.

Approximate position, lat. 68° 40' 45" N., long. 14° 24' 30" E.

(5.) *Light Exhibited at Hellands-Ness, Senjenö.*

Hellands-Ness Light is elevated 77 feet above high water, and is visible in clear weather from a distance of 6 miles. It shows red between the bearings S. 42° E. and S. 71° E., and white between S. 71° E. and S. 80° E.

VERA CRUZ COAST.

Fixed Light Established at Tuxpan River.

INFORMATION has been received through

the Board of Trade, dated 28th September, 1895, that a light is exhibited from a lighthouse at the entrance to Tuxpan or Tuspan River, Vera Cruz Coast.

Tuxpan Light is fixed white, of 80 candle power, elevated 59 feet above the sea, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 13 miles.

The lighthouse is 54 feet high.

No. 562.—NEWFOUNDLAND—WEST COAST.

Shoals in the Approach to Port au Port.

THE following information relating to the shoals in the approach to Port au Port has been received from Staff-Commander W. Tooker, in charge of the Survey of Newfoundland:—

1. Round Shoal has a depth of four feet over it, where seven feet is now charted.

Approximate position, lat. 48° 51' 40" N., long. 58° 38' 30" W.

2. A shoal patch with twenty-eight feet over it lies three and two-tenths miles S. 85° W. from the south-west extreme of Shag Island.

Approximate position, lat. 48° 50' 20" N., long. 58° 39' 20" W.

3. A patch about half a mile long in a north-east and south-west direction, and two cables wide, with depths of four and a quarter to five fathoms, lies half a mile S.S.E. of the southern dry portion of Long Ledge, with nine to ten fathoms between it and the rocks of Long Ledge, which are steep to within a distance of 150 yards.

Approximate position, lat. 48° 52' 39" N., long. 58° 39' 50" W.

4. A patch of five fathoms, lies three-quarters of a mile N. 61° W. from the north extreme of Shag Island.

Approximate position, lat. 48° 52' 30" N., long. 58° 38' 40" W.

5. Long Ledge is four and a quarter miles in length within the five fathoms line, the southern limit of which is five miles N. 75° W. from south extreme of Shag Island, a depth of seventeen feet lies four cables N. 67° E. of the south extreme of Long Ledge as given above.

Cone Peak in line with the centre of Shag Island S. 78° E., leads southward of Long Ledge.

Good anchorage in seven to 10 fathoms will be found eastward of the ledge during winds between West and N.W.

Approximate position, S.W. extreme of ledge in five fathoms, lat. 48° 50' 50" N., long. 58° 42' 45" W.

6. At one and one-third miles W.S.W. of Rope Cove Head, and four and three-quarter cables from the shore, there is a patch of boulders, with nineteen feet water over it. The Snout of Bear Head seen open of the land southward of it, leads westward of the patch.

Approximate position, lat. 48° 53' 50" N., long. 58° 32' 30" W.

7. Vessels wishing to communicate with the land near Coal River should not approach the shore nearer than half a mile, as shoal water extends nearly that distance.

Approximate position, Coal River entrance, lat. 48° 56' 30" N., long. 58° 30' 15" W.

(1.) *Ship Harbour—Light Established on Wolf Point.*
