VICTORIA, R.I.

VICTORIA, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith, &c.

To our trusty and well-beloved Sir Francis Mowatt, Knight Commander of Our Most Honourable Order of the Bath; Permanent Secretary of the Treasury ;

Whereas by the Patriotic Fund Act of 1881, it was, among other things, enacted that " it should " be lawful for. Her Majesty, from time to time, " by Warrant under Her Sign Manual, to appoint "any person to fill any vacancy among the Com-"missioners of the Patriotic Fund which has "arisen either before or after the passing of this "Act, from death, resignation, or otherwise ;

And whereas, since the date of the last Commission, a vacancy has so occurred :

Now, know ye, that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your zeal, discretion, and ability, do, by these presents, authorize and appoint you, the said Sir Francis Mowatt, to be a Commissioner of and for the administration of the Patriotic Fund.

Given at Our Court at Balmoral, this twenty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, in the fifty-ninth year of Our reign.
