THE Queen has been pleased to grant unto Ellen Caroline, Lady Hume, of Royal York-crescent, Clifton, near Bristol, in the county of Gloucester, widow and relict of Sir Gustavus Hume, late of Royal York-crescent aforesaid, Knight, Lieutenant-Colonel in the Army, and sometime Lieutenant of Her Majesty's Honourable Corps of Gentlemen-at-Arms, deceased, and to George Robert Vernon Hume, of Royal York-crescent aforesaid, Esquire, a Captain in Her Majesty's Seaforth Highlanders (Ross-shire Buffs, the Duke of Albany's), eldest son of the said Ellen Caroline, Lady Hume, Her Royal licence and authority that they may, in compliance with a declaration contained in the last will and testament of George Gore, late of Clifton, in the county of Gloucester, Esquire, sometime Lieutenant-Colonel of the 9th (Queen's Royal) Regiment of Lancers, deceased, take and respectively use the surname of Gore in addition to and after that of Hume, and that the said surnames may in like manner be taken, borne, and used by the issue of the said George Robert Vernon Hume:

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms, otherwise to be void and of none effect.
