

make such addition to the said certificate as he may deem necessary, specifying the particulars in which he finds the quantities of stock to be incorrectly stated.

ARTICLE VII.—The Dispenser shall, when required by the Stocktaker to do so, on the days and at the times referred to in Article V, submit to him the stock and Account therein mentioned, and render to him such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of such examination and comparison as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VIII.—The Dispenser shall lay the said Account before the Guardians at their next meeting after the date of the entry therein of any such certificate as aforesaid.

ARTICLE IX.—So long as a Stockholder is appointed it shall not be necessary for the Dispensary Visiting Committee to compare, in pursuance of Article 7 of the above-cited Order, the stock with the Account kept by the Dispenser.

ORDER of the Local Government Board:  
Altering General Out-Relief Distributor's Order  
(Metropolis): Appointment of Stocktaker:—  
Parish of Saint Giles, Camberwell.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of  
Saint Giles, Camberwell;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the 27th day of February, 1875, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Parish of Saint Giles, Camberwell (amongst others), We, the Local Government Board, prescribed regulations in respect to the duties of any officer appointed by the said Guardians to take charge of and to distribute the Stores for Out-door Relief in kind, termed the Out-Relief Distributor;

And whereas by the said Order the Out-Relief Distributor is required to keep an Account, termed "A Quarterly Balance of the Out-Relief Distributor's Stores Account," of the provisions and stores committed to his charge by the said Guardians, and of the consumption of the same, and to submit such Account, when made up and balanced, to the Visiting Committee, who are required to examine such Account;

And whereas it is expedient to empower the said Guardians to appoint a competent person or persons to examine the stock of provisions and stores kept by any Out-Relief Distributor appointed by the said Guardians, and to perform the other duties hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the said Parish of Saint Giles, Camberwell, may, as and when they shall think fit to do so, appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of a Stocktaker as hereinafter set forth.

ARTICLE II.—Every such appointment shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Regulations, as to the appointment of Officers in force in the said Parish for the time being.

ARTICLE III.—The said Guardians shall pay to the person or persons appointed under this

Order such salary or remuneration as We may from time to time direct or approve.

ARTICLE IV.—Every person appointed under this Order shall hold office until he shall die, or resign, or be dismissed by the Guardians, subject to Our consent, or be removed by Us, or be proved to be insane by evidence which We may deem sufficient; and the said Guardians shall give notice to Us of every such death or resignation, and state the cause of such resignation, so far as it may be known to them.

Provided nevertheless, that the Guardians may, if they think fit, with Our assent, appoint a person or persons to discharge, for a limited period only, the duties hereby prescribed for the Stocktaker.

ARTICLE V.—The Stocktaker shall, on the day next after the termination of each quarter, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stock of provisions and stores kept by any Out-Relief Distributor appointed by the said Guardians, and shall compare the same with the Account kept by such Distributor as aforesaid, showing the receipt and consumption of the stock committed to his charge.

ARTICLE VI.—After making the examination and comparison referred to in Article V, the Stocktaker, if he find the stock to be, as nearly as may be, correct, shall sign a certificate at the foot of the aforesaid Account in the following form:—

"Submitted to me this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 18\_\_\_\_, and found to be, as nearly as may be, correct, as regards the quantities of " stock remaining in store.

If he find the stock to be incorrect, he shall make such addition to the said certificate as he may deem necessary, specifying the particulars in which he finds the quantities of stock to be incorrectly stated.

ARTICLE VII.—The Out-Relief Distributor shall, when required by the Stocktaker to do so, on the days and at the times referred to in Article V, submit to him the stock and Account therein mentioned, and render to him such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of such examination and comparison as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VIII.—The Out-Relief Distributor shall lay the said Account before the Guardians at their next meeting after the date of the entry therein of any such certificate as aforesaid.

ARTICLE IX.—So long as a Stocktaker is appointed it shall not be necessary for the Visiting Committee to examine, in pursuance of Article I of the above-cited Order, the stock with the Account kept by the Out-Relief Distributor.
