

No. 714.—ENGLAND—SOUTH COAST.*Southampton Water—Intended Experimental Lights on Fawley Beacon.*

INFORMATION has been received through the Trinity House, London, dated 13th December, 1895, that the Southampton Harbour Board are about to substitute an iron screw-pile beacon for the old wooden Fawley Beacon, west side of Southampton Water :—

Also, that experimental occulting lights will be exhibited from the new Fawley Beacon for a period of about two months, of which further notice will be given when the particulars of the lights, and the date of their exhibition, are known.

Approximate position, beacon, lat. 50° 50' 40" N., long. 1° 20' 15" W.

No. 715.—ITALY—WEST COAST.*Leghorn—Intended Alteration in Lights at Vegliaia Mole.*

THE Italian Government has given notice that, on 1st January, 1896, the light buoy, moored at the western extremity of Vegliaia Mole, will be withdrawn, and a light will be shown from a lighthouse recently erected on the western end of that Mole.

Vegliaia Mole Light will be a fixed green light, elevated 56 feet above the sea, and visible from N. 18° W., through north and east, to S. 72° W., a distance of 5 miles in clear weather.

The lighthouse, 62 feet high, is an iron quadrangular truncated pyramid, painted white.

Approximate position, lat. 43° 32' 15" N., long. 10° 17' 25" E.

Vegliaia Tower has been taken down.
