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MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACTS, 1882 and 1885.

THE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities &c. of the Urban District Council of Todmorden, in the West Riding of the county of York, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act 1882 :—

WHEREAS by the "Municipal Corporations Acts 1882 and 1885" it is enacted that where a Petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to a Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter the said Committee of Council may settle a Scheme for the purposes in the said Acts named and containing such provisions as are in the said Acts particularized :

And whereas certain inhabitant householders of the town of Todmorden in the West Riding of the county of York in the month of December one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three petitioned Her Majesty the Queen praying for the Grant of a Charter of Incorporation :

And whereas the said Petition for a Charter was referred to the Committee of Council and it was subsequently proposed to create the district comprised within the limits intended to be defined in the Charter a Municipal Borough by the name of the "Borough of Todmorden" and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof and to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Borough so to be created :

And whereas under and by virtue of a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board dated the fourteenth day of June one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five and confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Abingdon Barnsley, &c.) Act 1875 the then existing local government districts of Cornholme and Todmorden were dissolved and all those parts of the rural sanitary districts of the Burnley and Todmorden Unions described in the schedule to the said Provisional Order were constituted an urban sanitary district under the name of the Todmorden Urban Sanitary District and such urban sanitary district became a local government district and subject to the jurisdiction of a local board :

And whereas under the provisions of the "Local Government Act 1894" the name of the said local board has been changed and the said authority are now called the Urban District Council of Todmorden and are hereinafter referred to as "the Urban District Council" :

And whereas the area of the proposed Borough is the same as the area of the Urban District of Todmorden except that it is proposed to exclude from the Borough the northern portion of the parish of Stansfield now forming part of that district and it is expedient to annex (in accordance with the provisions in that behalf of the "Local Government Act, 1894") the portion of the said parish so excluded to the adjoining parish of Blackshaw :

And whereas the Local Government Board by orders dated respectively the thirtieth day of January one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four and the twenty-seventh day of September one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four and made in pursuance of Part V of the "Public Health Acts Amendment Act 1890" consented to the exercise by the Urban District Council of their statutory borrowing powers in respect of the sums in the said orders respectively mentioned by the creation and issue of stock under the regulations prescribed by the Local Government Board by order dated the third day of July one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one and confirmed by Order in Council on the twenty-sixth day of September one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one :

And whereas on the twelfth day of November one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five the Local Government Board made an Order in pursuance of section 33 of the "Local Government Act 1894" transferring to the Urban District Council the power of appointing and revoking the appointment of any Assistant Overseer for each parish wholly comprised within their district.

And whereas on the twenty-third day of March one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five the Local Government Board made an order in pursuance of section 33 of the "Local Government Act 1894" conferring upon the Urban District Council the power and duty of appointing overseers for each of the parishes wholly comprised within their district.

And whereas under and by virtue of "The Todmorden Gas Act 1871" and "The Todmorden Local Board Gas Purchases Act 1893" the Urban District Council are empowered to construct and maintain gas works and to supply gas within the

limits described in the said Acts and they are now supplying gas within those limits:

And whereas the following Acts have been adopted by the Urban District Council and are in force within their district (namely) "The Infectious Disease (Notification) Act 1889" "The Infectious Disease (Prevention) Act 1890" and "The Public Health Acts Amendment Act 1891":

And whereas the Rural District Council of Todmorden have adopted "The Infectious Disease (Notification) Act 1889" and "The Infectious Disease (Prevention) Act 1890" and so much of Part III of "The Public Health Acts Amendment Act 1890" as can be adopted by a rural sanitary authority and Part III of "The Housing of the Working Classes Act 1890" and those enactments are now in force within the Todmorden Rural District:

And whereas a School Board was duly formed and constituted under the name of United School District of Todmorden comprising the whole of the Todmorden Poor Law Union including the area of the proposed borough:

And whereas the Urban District Council and the said School Board are local authorities within the meaning of the Municipal Corporations Acts 1882 and 1885:

And whereas this Scheme before being settled by the Committee of Council was referred for consideration to the Local Government Board and to the Education Department:

And whereas it is expedient right and just that a Scheme should be made and settled containing the provisions hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Acts 1882 and 1885 and "The Local Government Act 1894" and every other power enabling them in that behalf the Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein and do hereby direct order and declare as follows:—

Preliminary Provisions

This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as the Todmorden (Borough) Scheme 1896.

The Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Todmorden as proposed to be incorporated are in this Scheme referred to as "the Corporation," and "the Borough" and "the Municipal Borough" mean the Borough of Todmorden as proposed to be created by the said Charter.

This Scheme shall come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough and this Scheme shall be construed and applied as if it had been dated and confirmed by Parliament or Order in Council on the day before the day of the said first meeting and everything thereunder shall be done and had accordingly. This date is hereinafter referred to as "the commencement of this Scheme." So far as may be necessary this Scheme shall operate retrospectively.

From and after the commencement of this Scheme and thenceforward the Municipal Borough shall be placed within the jurisdiction of the Corporation.

Dissolution of Urban District Council, Alteration of Boundaries and Transfer of Power.

From and after the commencement of this Scheme the Urban District Council and their district shall be abolished and shall thenceforth be dissolved and cease to exist, and the Municipal Borough shall be placed within the jurisdiction of the Council of the Borough as the sanitary authority thereof.

From and after the commencement of this Scheme all that part of the parish of Stansfield situate beyond the Borough shall be annexed to and form part of the parish of Blackshaw.

Every person who shall on or before the commencement of this Scheme have acquired a settlement in the existing parish of Stansfield shall be deemed to have acquired such settlement in the parish comprising the area in which the acts or circumstances conferring such settlement shall have been done or taken place or if such acts or circumstances shall have been done or taken place in more than one such area such settlement shall be in the parish comprising the place of residence of such person at the time of acquiring such settlement. Any person who shall have become irremovable from the existing parish of Stansfield shall be deemed to have become irremovable from the parish comprising the area in which he shall reside at the commencement of this Scheme or if he shall then be in receipt of relief shall be deemed to be irremovable from the parish comprising the area in which he was residing at the time of becoming chargeable.

Notwithstanding the alteration of parishes effected by the Scheme all contribution orders made by the Guardians of the Poor of the Todmorden Union shall be as valid in law as if this Scheme had not been made.

All recoverable arrears of poor rates due at the time when this Scheme comes into operation shall be recovered by the Overseers of the existing parish of Stansfield as if such parish had not been altered by this Scheme.

Until new valuation lists are made the portion of the valuation list of the parish of Stansfield which relates to hereditaments in the portion of the said parish which is hereby added to the parish of Blackshaw shall together with the valuation list relating to hereditaments in the last-mentioned parish be deemed to be the valuation list of such parish and the remaining portion of the valuation list of the said parish of Stansfield shall be deemed to be the valuation list of that parish.

The area added by this Scheme to the parish of Blackshaw shall as from the commencement of this Scheme be annexed to and form part of the Rural District of Todmorden:

All powers rights jurisdiction duties and property exercisable by attached to or vested in the Urban District Council under the hereinbefore recited Orders of the Local Government Board relating to the creation and issue of stock or under any general or local Act or under any Provisional Order shall unless otherwise provided in this scheme be transferred to and vest in the Corporation. The power of appointing Overseers and of appointing and revoking the appointment of any Assistant Overseer conferred on the Urban District Council by the orders of the Local Government Board dated respectively the 23rd March 1895 and the 12th November 1895 shall be transferred to and vested in the Corporation.

All liabilities and causes of action which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme attached to and were enforceable by or against the Urban District Council or their property shall attach to or be enforceable by or against the Corporation to the same extent to which they attached to or were enforceable by or against the Urban District Council.

Any investigation legal proceedings or remedy in respect of any debt liability penalty or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf of the Urban District Council may be continued prosecuted or enforced by or against the Corporation.

The term "property" wherever used in this

Scheme means and includes all property real and personal and all things in action and all rights of common and commonable rights and rights to toll and all franchises privileges and rights which have any pecuniary value and all charters records deeds books and documents and all rights including rights to avoid contracts or otherwise and all claims to relief and includes any estate or interest in or in respect of any property so defined.

The district fund and the general district rate of the borough shall take the place of and be substituted for the district fund and the general district rate of the Urban District Council and all sums of money respectively payable to from or out of and all liabilities charged upon or attaching to the last-mentioned district fund or general district rate shall be paid to from or out of and shall be charged upon the district fund and general district rate of the borough.

All mortgages stock charges loans and debts of the Urban District Council shall be the mortgages stock charges loans and debts of the Corporation and all mortgages of and charges upon the undertakings rates or property of the Urban District Council shall be respectively mortgages and charges upon the same undertakings district fund general district rate and property of the Corporation.

All arrears of any general district rates and highway rates and other payments which on the commencement of this Scheme are due or owing to the Urban District Council in respect of hereditaments beyond the borough may be collected levied and recovered by the Corporation.

If at any time the district fund and general district rate of the borough are insufficient to provide the sums required for interest or repayment of principal on or in respect of any money borrowed wholly or partly on the security of the district fund or general district rate of the Urban District Council then (but not otherwise) notwithstanding anything in this Scheme the rights of the creditors against the part of the Urban District excluded from the borough shall be deemed to be subsisting and the Rural District Council of Todmorden shall, if required by one-third in value of the creditors, or by an Order of any competent Court levy or cause to be levied in or upon the part of the Urban District excluded from the borough such portion of the said moneys then due and unpaid as bears the same proportion to the whole of the said moneys then due and unpaid as the then rateable value for sanitary purposes of the property in such excluded part of the Urban District bears to the sum of such rateable value together with the rateable value for sanitary purposes of the property within the borough and the said Rural District Council shall levy and cause to be levied from or in the said excluded part the said portion of the said moneys by the same means and in the same manner as nearly as may be as contributions for special expenses are levied under the Public Health Act, 1875. Any sum or sums paid by the said Rural District Council under this Clause shall and may be recovered by the said Rural District Council as a debt due to the said Rural District Council from the Corporation, and any sum or sums so repaid by the Corporation shall be treated as contributions for special expenses or shall be made applicable in such other way as the Rural District Council with the consent of the Local Government Board may determine.

Gas.

The gas undertaking of the Urban District Council and all the property powers privileges rights and duties of the Urban District Council

in respect of their gas undertaking shall be transferred to and vest in the Corporation and they may supply gas within the whole of the limits defined or referred to in "The Todmorden Local Board Gas Purchases Act 1893."

Adoptive Acts.

The following Acts shall continue in force within the area of the borough that is to say "The Infectious Disease (Notification) Act 1889" "The Infectious Disease (Prevention) Act 1890" and "The Public Health Acts Amendment Act 1890" and so much of the said Acts and of "The Housing of the Working Classes Act 1890" as is in force within the Todmorden Rural District shall continue in force in that district as enlarged by this Scheme and so much of the said Acts as is not in force within the said rural district shall cease to be in force in the area added to that district by this Scheme but without prejudice to any rights privileges obligations or liabilities acquired accrued or incurred under the said Acts with respect to such area.

Bye-laws and Regulations.

All bye-laws of the Urban District Council and the regulations made by them under the Dairies Cowsheds and Milkshops Order of 1885 shall until the same are revoked or varied continue in force and be enforced within the borough substituting only the Corporation and their officers for the Urban District Council and their officers respectively.

School Boards.

From and after the commencement of this Scheme the following provisions shall come into operation and have effect—

- (A) The borough shall be a school district and shall be deemed to have a School Board duly formed and constituted under the Elementary Education Act 1870 and the Acts amending the same:
- (B) All that part of the Todmorden United School District which will be situate within the borough shall be separated from the remainder of the said district and the School Board for the said district shall cease to have or to exercise any jurisdiction within the borough:
- (C) Until an election of a School Board for the borough is held as hereinafter provided the members of the School Board for the said United District named in the schedule to this Scheme (now residing in the district of the Urban District Council) who are in office immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall cease to be members of the said School Board and shall be deemed to have been elected as and shall be the School Board for the borough by the style and title of the "School Board for the Borough of Todmorden" and the remaining members of the School Board for the said United District who are in office immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall until the next election of the last-mentioned School Board be deemed to have been elected as and shall be the School Board for the said United District exclusive of the borough by the style and title of the "School Board for the United District of Hebden Bridge":
- (D) All school and other buildings belonging to the School Board for the said United District and situate within the borough with their appurtenances fittings books and effects shall be transferred to and vest in the School Board for the borough of Todmorden for all

the estate and interest therein of the School Board for the said United District:

(E) So soon as may be convenient after the commencement of this Scheme the Education Department shall have power to order and direct and shall order and direct the election of a School Board for the borough and the election of a new School Board for the said United District of Hebden Bridge and for the purposes aforesaid and all incidental matters the Education Department may and shall have and exercise as nearly as the circumstances will admit of all such powers jurisdictions and duties as it can or may or ought to have and exercise by virtue of or under the Elementary Education Act 1870 and the Acts amending the same in the case of the first constitution of a school board and in order to fully effectuate the purposes of this Scheme relative to the School Boards for the borough and united district the Education Department may and shall exercise all such powers and give all such directions as may be in its opinion necessary or expedient to effectuate such purposes:

(F) (1) The said School Boards may from time to time make and carry into effect agreements for the purpose of adjusting any property income debts liabilities and expenses so far as affected by this Scheme and such agreements may provide for the transfer of any property debts or liabilities with or without any conditions and for the joint use of any property and for the transfer of any duties and for payment by either party to the agreement in respect of property debts duties and liabilities so transferred or retained or in respect of such joint user:

(2) In default of an agreement as to the above such adjustment may be made or determined by an arbitrator appointed by the parties or in the case of difference as to the appointment appointed by the Education Department and the provisions of the Arbitration Act 1889 shall so far as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of this Scheme apply to such arbitration:

(G) All bye-laws of the School Board for the said united district in force immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall thenceforth continue in full force (until revoked or altered) and be the bye-laws of the School Board for the borough and the bye-laws of the School Board for the united district of Hebden Bridge and shall be applicable to and apply to such Boards respectively:

(H) Any order or direction of the Education Department made or given under this Scheme shall be deemed to be part of this Scheme.

General Savings.

Notwithstanding the incorporation of the Borough and the provisions of this Scheme all rates assessments orders apportionments notices compositions charges mortgages contracts leases conveyances deeds documents acts matters and things made entered into given or done before the commencement of this Scheme by to or with reference to the Urban District Council shall be as good and valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for against and with reference to the Corporation instead of the Urban District Council and may be proceeded on and enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation instead of such Council had been party or privy to the same and been named or referred to therein:

Compensation.

In case any officer of the Urban District Council who shall have been employed by that body for a period of not less than five years shall not be employed by the Council of the Borough nor offered by the last mentioned Council a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him he shall be entitled to be paid by way of compensation for the loss of his position out of the funds of or under the control of the Corporation such gratuity or annual allowance as on a full consideration of the circumstances of the case may seem to the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury or any two or more of them to be a reasonable and just compensation for the loss of his position and the said Lords Commissioners in awarding the said compensation shall be guided by the principles which would be applicable in the case of an award of compensation under the provisions of the Superannuation Act 1859 to a person retiring or removed from the public service in consequence of the abolition of his office:

Provided that no special minute within the meaning of the said Act stating any special grounds for granting such allowance shall be necessary or be made and provided nevertheless that if any such officer be so employed by the Council of the Borough and discharged by them for any cause other than inefficiency breach of duty or misconduct within two years after the commencement of this Scheme he shall be entitled to compensation in the same manner as if he had not been employed by the said Council. Provided also that the term "officer" shall include any persons employed by the Urban District Council whose salaries or emoluments are payable at intervals of not less than one month and no other persons:

The said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them shall be the sole judges as to the right title or claim of any officer to compensation whatever and as to the amount thereof and the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them shall be the only judges upon any question which may arise under this clause and every determination of the said Lords Commissioners upon any such right claim amount or question shall be absolutely final and conclusive and every statement or reference to any matter aforesaid made at any time in writing and signed by any two of the said Lords Commissioners for the time being shall be final and conclusive upon any person claiming under or by virtue of this clause upon the said Corporation.

Audit of Accounts.

The accounts of the Urban District Council and of their officers shall be (as soon as conveniently may be) audited by the district auditor in like manner and subject to the like powers duties provisions and right of appeal as if the Charter had not been granted and the provisions of sections 247 and 250 of the Public Health Act 1875 as amended by the District Auditors Act 1879 and any regulations duly issued by the Local Government Board with respect to the audit of accounts of local boards and of their officers shall apply to such audit and the provisions of this Scheme with respect to the Urban District Council shall be construed so as to admit of such exceptions as may be necessary to enable such audit to be duly made but such exceptions shall be strictly limited in time extent character and operation to the purposes of such audit: Any sums certified to be due from any person by

the district auditor shall be paid by such person to the treasurer of the borough.

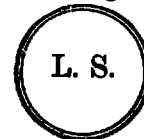

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 6TH JANUARY 1896.)

ST. ALBANS BOROUGH (MUZZLING OF DOGS) TEMPORARY ORDER OF 1896.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Extent and Enforcement.

1. This Order applies to and shall be in force in the District of the Local Authority for the borough of St. Albans, and shall be enforced by that Local Authority within their District.

Commencement and Duration.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six; and shall continue to operate and apply to the District of the borough of St. Albans until this Order is declared by further Order of the Board to cease to apply to such District.

Muzzling of Dogs.

3.—(1.) No dog shall be allowed to be in or on any public place unless such dog is muzzled with a cage muzzle so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while wearing the same to bite any person or animal, but not so as to prevent such dog from breathing freely or lapping water.

(2.) Provided that the provisions of this Article shall not apply to—

(a) Packs of hounds or greyhounds while being exercised or used for sporting purposes, or other sporting dogs while being used for sporting purposes, or any dogs while being used for the capture or destruction of vermin, and in every case in charge of competent persons.

(b) Dogs while being taken to or from Exhibitions, Shows, or other places if such dogs are confined in boxes, cages, crates, baskets, or hampers so constructed as to render it impossible for such dogs while so confined to bite any person or animal.

General Provisions of the Rabies Order of 1895.

4. Subject to the last foregoing Article of this Order, all the provisions of the Rabies Order of 1895 shall, so far as the same are applicable, continue to apply, during the continuance of this Order, to the District to which this Order applies.

Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Unmuzzled Dogs.

5. Any dog found in or on any public place without being muzzled in manner prescribed by this Order may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority as follows :

- (i.) If the dog is diseased it shall be forthwith slaughtered.
- (ii.) If the dog is suspected it shall be detained and kept or otherwise dealt with as the Local Authority think expedient.
- (iii.) If the dog is not diseased or suspected, it shall be detained in some proper place and be there kept for such period as the Local Authority think expedient : Provided that where the person having charge of or the owner of a dog so detained is known, the Local Authority shall cause notice to be forthwith given to such person or owner of the fact of the dog having been so seized and detained, and the dog shall, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of this Order, be given up to such person or owner on payment of the reasonable expenses incurred in respect of such detention.
- (iv.) If the dog so seized and detained has not been claimed by such person or owner within three days after the seizure, or, where such person or owner is known, within two days after the aforesaid notice has been given, the Local Authority may cause the dog to be slaughtered or otherwise disposed of in such manner as the Local Authority deem expedient.

Offences.

6. If any dog is found in or on any public place without being muzzled in manner prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person allowing the same to be in or on such public place in contravention of this Order, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

7. In this Order—

“Public place” includes any street, highway, thoroughfare, public bridge, royal park, public park garden or pleasure ground, common, uninclosed land, or other place to which the public have for the time being access :

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 :

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Rabies Order of 1895.

8. This Order may be cited as the **ST. ALBANS BOROUGH (MUZZLING OF DOGS) TEMPORARY ORDER OF 1896.**
