FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACTS, 1878 to 1891.

WHEREAS by Section 8 (1) of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1891, it is enacted that:—
 "Where the Secretary of State certifies that in his opinion any machinery or process or particular description of manual labour used in a factory or workshop (other than a domestic workshop) is dangerous or injurious to health, or dangerous to

life or limb, either generally or in the case of women, children, or any other class of persons, or that the provision for the admission of fresh air is not sufficient, or that the quantity of dust generated or inhaled in any factory or workshop is dangerous or injurious to health, the Chief Inspector may serve on the occupier of the factory or workshop a notice in writing, either proposing such special rules or requiring the adoption of such special measures as appear to the Chief Inspector to be reasonably practicable and to meet the necessities of the case."

Now I, the Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley, Bart., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do hereby certify that in my opinion such processes as are named in the Schedule hereunder, are dangerous or injurious to health.

Arosa Bay—Amended Position of Barcal Shoal.

THE Spanish Government has given notice, dated 14th December, 1895, that Barcal Shoal (5 feet), west side of Arosa Bay, is not situated in the position hitherto given on the charts, but lies with the Lobeyras Rock above water bearing S. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. (S. 13° W.), distant 3 cables; and centre of Coroso Island W.N.W. (N. 67° W.).

PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND.

(1.) *Intended Removal of North Point Whistle Buoy to North-West of West Point.*

THE Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice that, on the opening of navigation

in the spring of 1896, the whistle buoy (conical red) now moored off North Point, Prince Edward Island, will be moved to a position with West Point Lighthouse bearing S.E. (S. 45° E.), distant $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles, or approximately to lat. $46^{\circ} 40\frac{1}{4}'$ N., long. $64^{\circ} 33\frac{1}{2}'$ W.
