THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the following copy of a Notice issued by the Governor of Malta, viz. :-

Government Notice.

His Excellency the Governor, having heard the opinion of the Board of Health, has been pleased to modify Government Notice No. 10, of 10th January, 1896, and to direct that the following regulations be observed, viz.:-

1. Vessels to stop outside the Harbour with permission for coaling under such restrictions as may in each case be directed by the Collector of Customs.

The following shall not be permitted to enter the Harbour, but may be allowed to coal and take provisions in strict quarantine, with the least delay, and subject to the orders of the Collector of Customs; and shall in all cases be ordered to quit with all despatch after coaling.

(a.) Vessels that have on board, or have had within seven days, cases of cholera, or cases of a disease with symptoms resembling those of

cholera ;

(b.) Vessels with pilgrims from the East;(c.) Vessels from North or South America when cases of yellow fever have occurred on board during the voyage, unless such vessels have been properly disinfected at an intermediate port in Europe;

(d.) Vessels arriving from Arabian Ports in the Red Sea which have not been admitted to free-

pratique at Suez and Port Said.

2. Quarantine for seven days to be reckoned from the commencement of the voyage with permission for handling cargo in quarantine.

The following shall be subject to a period of seven days' quarantine, but shall be permitted, under the directions of the Collector of Customs, to discharge goods (which are not susceptible of communicating contagion) by means of the vessel's crew on lighters, or to employ for handling cargo local labourers subject to seven days' quarantine,

viz.:—
Vessels arriving from any port without a clean bill of health.

Quarantine for eleven days to be reckoned from the commencement of the voyage with permission for handling cargo in quarantine.

The following shall be subject to a period of eleven days' quarantine, but shall be permitted, under the directions of the Collector of Customs, to discharge goods (which are not susceptible of communicating contagion) by means of the vessel's crew on lighters, or to employ for handling cargo local labourers subject to eleven days' quarantine,

Vessels arriving from Alexandria.

4. Other precautionary measures to be adopted when necessary.

Vessels arriving at this port having on board cases of scarlet fever, measles, or small-pox will be subject to such precautionary measures as the Head of the Government may deem necessary.

5. Medical Inspection.

All vessels arriving at Malta shall undergo strict medical inspection.

6. Passengers.

(a.) Passengers, arriving by any vessel subject to quarantine, are required to undergo the same quarantine restrictions as the vessels on which

they arrive.

- (b.) Passengers arriving on vessels having a duly qualified Medical Officer on board, are to be allowed to land without medical inspection, provided that the Medical Officer in charge on board shall declare on oath that during the voyage there has not been on board a case of cholera, or of any disease with symptoms resembling those of cholera either among the passengers or the crew. The declaration above referred to shall be countersigned by the Master of the vessel.
  - 7. Goods.
- (a.) The importation of cotton seed from any port subject to quarantine is forbidden.

(b.) The importation of rags is prohibited.(c.) The importation before disinfection of soiled wearing apparel, or bedding material that is not

new, is prohibited.
(d.) The importation of vines, vine shoots, fruit packed in vine leaves, or roots from any port of

the Mediterranean is prohibited.

(e.) The importation of grapes, poles, or supports used in the cultivation of vines and plants, vegetable earth, vegetable or mixed manure, is prohibited unless the importation is accompanied by a sworn declaration, made by the shipper before the British Consular Authority of the place of its origin to the effect that the shipment does not contain vine plants or cuttings, or that its contents come from nurseries, hothouses, fields or gardens which are at least 100 yards distant from the mearest vines or vineyards, and that moreover the Phylloxera is not known to exist at the place of origin.

(f.) Provided, however, that the Collector of Customs may grant permission for the importation of plants, and vegetable produce under proper restrictions when application has been made and the precautions necessary are established before

the shipment leaves the place of origin.

Ministry of the Interior. Royal Order.

Whereas the appearance of yellow fever at Rio de Janeiro and Santos (Brazil) is officially notified to this Ministry, and conformably to, &c., &c., &c.

The King, &c., &c., has been pleased to dispose that vessels proceeding from the aforesaid places which have sailed after December 31 last, and which, with any kind of bill of health, arrive at our ports after the publication of the present Royal Order, shall be despatched to the quarantine station. Other ports within 165 kilometres of Rio de Janeiro and Santos, measured in a direct line, are to be considered specially compromised.

The dispositions set forth in the Royal Order of July, 28, 1893, are to be observed in the Port of Vigo.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Rome, enclosing the following translation of a Decree of the Italian Government respecting bills of health, viz. :-

Translation of a Decree of the Italian Ministry of the Interior relating to Maritime Sanitary

Precautions.

No. 9.

Considering the convenience, generally speaking, of exempting ships on arrival at Italian ports, under ordinary circumstances, from presenting their bill of health (patente di sanità) when the sanitary information is marked on the ship's papers (carte di bordo); and in virtue of the power conferred by the Marine Sanitary Regulations of determining (in concert with the Minister of Marine) what measures are to be taken in such matters; the Minister of the Interior hereby decrees : -

That every vessel arriving at Italian ports from the other European ports, with the exception of Turkish ports, are exempted from the presentation of the bill of health (patente di sanità); and this exemption applies equally to ships from the Atlantic ports of North America and Canada.

But, in any case, ships arriving from ports which have been either declared infected by the local authorities, or have been proclaimed as such by the Italian Ministry of the Interior, are not included, and will have to be furnished with bills of health.

And every ship included in the terms of the present Decree shall have marked on its list of the crew, or on its certificate, information respecting the sanitary conditions of the place of departure, the hygienic conditions of the ship itself and of its cargo, and the state of health of the crew

starting and at each port touched at.

The Prefects of the Maritime Provinces and the Harbour Authorities are charged with the execution of the present Decree.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: Cholera Regulations: Altering General Order:-

Port of Gloucester. Bristol and Gloucester Port Sanitary Authorities.

To the Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority ;-To the Bristol Port Sanitary Authority;

To the Officers of Customs of the Ports of Bristol and Gloucester ;-

To the Medical Officers of Health of the said Port Sanitary Authorities ; -

To all Masters of Ships ;-

To all Pilots ;-

And to all others whom it may concern.
WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board, by an Order bearing date the 28th day of August, 1890 (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations"), in exercise of the powers conferred upon Us by Section 130 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and by Section 2 of the Public Health Act, 1889, made certain rules and regulations with a view to the treatment of persons affected with Cholera, and for preventing the spread of that disease;

And whereas by a further Order dated the 6th day of September, 1892, We made additional Regulations for the prevention of the spread of Cholera, and by Article V thereof directed that such Order should be read as one with the Regu-

lations;

And whereas by Orders dated the 11th day of June, 1894, which came into operation on the 1st day of August, 1894. We constituted permanently the Council of the City of Bristol and the Council of the City of Gloucester respectively as the Port Sanitary Authorities for the parts of the respective Ports of Bristol and Gloucester described in such Orders:

And whereas it is expedient that other provision should be made as regards ships bound to the said Port of Gloucester, and ships coming or being within that Port; and the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs have signified their consent to the regulations hereinafter set forth so far as they apply to the Officers of Customs:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers before referred to, we hereby alter the Regulations and the said Order dated the sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, so as to provide, with regard to the said Port of Gloucester, and to ships bound to or coming or being within that Port, as follows; namely,

ARTICLE I .- Articles 1 and 19 of the Regultions and Articles II, III, and IV of the said Order dated the sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, shall continue to apply to the Port of Gloucester, and to ships bound to or coming or being within that Port, but the remaining Articles of the Regulations and of the said Order shall, except so far as they are made applicable by this Order, cease to apply thereto.

ARTICLE II .- With regard to ships bound to

the Port of Gloucester which are brought up for Customs purposes within the port of Bristol the following provisions shall have effect:-

- (1.) The duties prescribed by Article 2 of the Regulations to be performed by Officers of Customs shall, on the arrival within the Port of Bristol of any ship bound to the Port of Gloucester, be performed by the Officers of Customs of the Port of Bristol as if such ship were bound to the Port of Bristol.
- (2.) The Officer of Customs of the Port of Bristol detaining, under the provisions of paragraph (1) hereof, any ship bound to the Port of Gloucester, and ascertained by him to be infected with Cholera, or which he may have reason to suspect of being so infected, shall forthwith give notice thereof, and of the cause of such detention, to the Bristol Port Sanitary Authority.

(3.) No person shall leave any ship detained by the Officer of Customs of the Port of Bristol under the provisions of paragraph (1) hereof, during the period of such deten-

tion.

- (4.) The detention by the Officer of Customs shall cease as soon as the ship shall have been duly visited and examined by the Medical Officer of Health of the Bristol Port Sanitary Authority, or if the ship shall, upon such examination, be found to be infected with Cholera, as soon as the same shall have been moored or anchored in pursuance of Article 10 of the Regulations as made applicable by Article VII hereof: Provided, that if the examination be not commenced within twelvehours after notice given to the Bristol Port Sanitary Authority as aforesaid, the ship shall, on the expiration of such period, be released from detention.
- (5.) The Bristol Port Sanitary Authority, on notice being given to them as aforesaid by an Officer of Customs, under the provisions of paragraph (2) hereof, shall forthwith cause the ship in regard to which such notice shall have been given to be visited and examined by their Medical Officer of Health for the purpose of ascertaining whether she is infected with Cholera; and shall, at the same time, inform the Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority of the detention of the ship.
- (6.) The Medical Officer of Health of the Bristol Port Sanitary Authority shall visitand examine the ship mentioned in such notice; and if on such examination, or on visiting and examining any ship under Article 8 of the Regulations as made applicable by Article IV hereof, he shall be of opinion that the ship is infected, he shall give a certificate in duplicate as required by Article 9 of the Regulations, and shall give to the Local Government Board information as to the arrival of the ship, and such other particulars as that Board may require.

ARTICLE III.—With regard to ships bound to the Port of Gloucester which are brought up for Customs purposes within the Port of Gloucester, the following provisions shall have effect :-

(1., The duties prescribed by Articles 2 and 4 of the Regulations shall be performed by the Officer of Customs of the Port of Gloucester, and Article 3 of the Regulations shall apply to any ship detained by such Officer of Customs under Article 2 of the Regula-

Provided that the said Article 2 shall be modified by the substitution of the words "as soon as practicable" for the word "forthwith."

(2.) The detention of any ship by the Officer of Customs shall cease so soon as the ship shall have been duly visited and examined by the Medical Officer of Health of the Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority, or if the ship shall, upon such examination, be found to be infected Cholera, as soon as the same shall have been moored or anchored in pursuance of Article 10 of the Regulations as made applicable by Article VII hereof: Provided that if the examination be not commenced within twelve hours after notice given to the Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority, the ship shall, on the expiration of such period, be released from detention.

(3.) The Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority on notice being given to them by the Officer of Customs shall forthwith cause the ship in regard to which such notice shall have been given to be visited and examined by their Medical Officer of Health for the purpose of ascertaining whether she is infected with

Cholera.

(4.) If the Medical Officer of Health on making such examination shall be of opinion that the ship is infected he shall give a certificate in duplicate as required by Article 9 of the Regulations, and shall inform the Bristol Port Sanitary Authority of the case by the speediest method available, and shall then remain on board such ship until she has been moored or anchored in pursuance of Article 10 of the Regulations as made applicable by Article VII hereof, or until the arrival on board of the Medical Officer of Health of the Bristol Port Sanitary Authority. He shall also give to the Local Government Board information as to the arrival of the ship, and such other particulars as that Board may require.

ARTICLE IV .- Article 8 of the Regulations shall apply to ships bound to the Port of Gloucester, but so that the Medical Officer of Health of the Bristol Port Sanitary Authority as regards ships coming or being within the Port of Bristol, and the Medical Officer of Health of the Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority as regards ships coming or being within the Port of Gloucester, shall be the Medical Officer of Health for the

purposes of that Article:

Provided that as regards ships bound to the Port of Gloucester coming or being within the Port of Bristol, the Medical Officer of Health of the Bristol Port Sanitary Authority shall not under Article 8 of the Regulations examine such ships unless he shall have been requested in writing by the Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority so to do, and such request may be made by the Medical Officer of Health or the Clerk of the Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority on behalf of such Authority and may be a request either to examine such ships generally or to examine a particular ship, and may be for a definite period or until waried or revoked in writing.

ARTICLE V.—If the Medical Officer of Health of the Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority, having visited and examined any ship under Article 8 of the Regulations, find the ship to be infected with Cholera, and if such ship be not moored in or at any of the basins, docks, quays, or wharves within the jurisdiction of the Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority, he shall give the certificate prescribed by Article 9 of the Regulations, and inform the Bristol Port Sanitary Authority of the case by the

speediest method available, and shall then remain on board such ship until she has been moored or anchored in pursuance of Article 10 of the Regulations as made applicable by Article VII hereof, or until the arrival on board of the Medical Officer of Health of the Bristol Port Sanitary Authority. He shall also give to the Local Government Board information as to the arrival of the ship, and such other particulars as that Board may require.

ARTICLE VI.—The Master of any ship certified in accordance with the provisions of Article III (4) or Article V hereof by the Medical Officer of Health of the Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority to be infected with Cholera shall carry out the directions of the said Medical Officer of Health (not relating to matters of seamanship) as to the removal of the ship to and its mooring or anchoring at the Mooring Station of the Bristol Port Sanitary Authority, and any other directions which such Medical Officer of Health may deem necessary to be given for the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions of

Article III (4) and Article V hereof.

ARTICLE VII.—Articles 10 to 18, both inclusive, of the Regulations as amended by Article I of the Order of the sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, shall apply to all ships certified as aforesaid by the Medical Officer of Health of the Bristol Port Sanitary Authority, or by the Medical Officer of Health of the Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority, to be infected with Cholera, and the Medical Officer of Health of the Bristol Port Sanitary Authority, the Port Sanitary Authority of Bristol, and the Mooring Station of the Bristol Port Sanitary Authority, shall be the Medical Officer of Health, the Port Sanitary Authority, and the place for the mooring or anchoring of such ships

for the purposes of those Articles.

ARTICLE VIII.-The Bristol Port Sanitary Authority shall, until We by Order otherwise direct, defray such costs as may reasonably be incurred by them as regards ships bound to the Port of Glousester, in connection with the visitation, examination, and disinfection of such ships, the towage of such ships, the removal to, and the maintenance in the hospital provided by such Port Sanitary Authority of persons affected with Cholera and removed thereto from such ships, the disposal, as provided by Article 16 of the Regulations, of the bodies of persons dying from Cholera on board such ships and of persons removed therefrom to the said hospital, and such other incidental expenses as may be incurred by them in carrying out the provisions of this Order (including the remuneration of any person employed by them in respect of services rendered under the provisions of this Order as regards such ships) and shall from time to time render to the said Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority particulars respecting any such costs incurred as aforesaid.

ARTICLE IX .- The Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority shall repay from time to time to the Bristol Port Sanitary Authority the expenses incurred under the provisions of Article VIII hereof, and any such expenses shall be deemed to be a debt due from the Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority to the Bristol Port Sanitary Authority,

and may be recovered accordingly.

ARTICLE X .- The Accounts of the Bristol Port Sanitary Authority relating to such expenditure shall be open at all reasonable times, without payment, to inspection and transcription by any officer of the Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority authorized by them for that purpose.

ARTICLE XI.-If at any time any difference

arises between the Bristol Port Sanitary Authority and the Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority respecting any matter arising out of the provisions of this Order, the same shall be referred to and be settled by Us.

ARTICLE XII.-With regard to ships which may have been moored in or at any of the basins, docks, quays, or wharves within the jurisdiction of the Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority the

following provisions shall have effect:—
(1.) If the Medical Officer of Health of the Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority have reason to believe that any such ship is infected with Cholera, he shall visit and examine such ship for the purpose of ascertaining whether she is so infected; and the Master of such ship shall permit the same to be so visited and examined.

(2.) If on making such examination the Medical Officer of Health of the said Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority shall be of opinion that the ship is infected, he shall forthwith give a Certificate as required by Article 9 of the Regulations, and shall give to the Local Government Board information as to the case; and Articles 11 to 18, both inclusive, of the Regulations as amended by Article I of the said Order dated the sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, shall apply to such ship, and to the Master and the persons on board thereof, and to the said Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority and the Medical Officer of Health of such Authority.

(3.) The said Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority shall provide a proper supply of water for drinking and cooking purposes for persons on board any ship so certified, whereupon the Master of such ship shall cause all casks or tanks on board the ship containing water for the use of such persons to be emptied and

cleansed.

(4.) The Medical Officer of Health of the Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority may, in the case of any sbip certified as aforesaid, which shall not have passed beyond the tidal basin situate at Sharpness, and which shall not have commenced to discharge its cargo, give directions for its removal and towage to and its mooring or anchoring at the Mooring Station of the Bristol Port Sanitary Authority, and after he shall have given such directions, the articles hereof relating to ships not moored in or at any of the basins, docks, quays, or wharves within the jurisdiction of the Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority shall apply to such ship.

ARTICLE XIII.—In this Order the term "Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority" means the Port Sanitary Authority for the Gloucester Division of the Port of Gloucester and all references to the Port of Gloucester shall be deemed to apply only to the Gloucester Division of that Port.
