**C**EREMONIAL observed on the Reception and on the Interment of The Remains of HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE HENRY MAURICE OF BATTENBERG, K.G., Husband of HER ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCESS HENRY OF BATTENBERG, PRINCESS BEATRICE of Great Britain and Ireland, Son-in-Law of HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN, who died on active Service, whilst returning from the Ashanti Expedition, on board Her Majesty's Ship "Blonde," on January 20th, 1896.

The Remains of His Royal Highness having been transferred to Her Majesty's Ship "Blenheim," on the arrival of the "Blonde," at Madeira, the "Blenheim" sailed for England on the 30th January in charge of Colonel Lord William Cecil, Equerry to His Royal Highness, and Mr. H. L. Hertslet, of The Lord Chamberlain's Department, who had been specially sent out there for the purpose.

On the arrival of Her Majesty's Ship "Blenheim" at Portsmouth on Tuesday, the 4th of February, Her Royal Highness The Princess Henry of Battenberg, accompanied by Her Royal Highness The Princess Christian of Schleswig-Holstein, His Royal Highness The Duke of Connaught and Strathearne, K.G., and Their Serene Highnesses The Prince Louis and The Prince Francis Joseph of Battenberg, crossed to Portsmouth in the Royal Yacht "Alberta," and attended a short service on board the "Blenheim."

The Rev. James H. Blunn, Chaplain of the "Blenheim," officiated.

A Guard of Honour of 100 Bluejackets was mounted on the Wharf at Portsmouth.

The Coffin was then carried to the "Alberta" by a party of Seamen from the Royal Yachts.
